LFD Overview

- 477 Personnel, (440+) are Emergency Medical Technicians
- Largest Bureau: Fire Suppression/Operations
- 21 Fire Stations
- 27 Fire Companies
- Divided into Four (4) Districts or Battalions
- Suppression Personnel work a 24 Hour shift, followed by 48 hours off

- Emergency Medical (62%) Fire Incidents (38)


Recognized Standards
