BY THE NUMBERS

- Louisville GDP expanded **4.4%** from September 2016 to September 2017, compared to 1.7% U.S.
- Employment grew 1% from March 2017 to March 2018, compared to .4% U.S.
- 3.9% unemployment rate for March 2018, compared to 4.1% U.S.
- Labor force participation = **65.8%**, compared to 62.8% U.S.
- Professional and Business Services grew 8.6% from September 2016-September 2017, compared to 2.7% U.S.

LOUISVILLE AFFORDABLE HOUSING TRUST FUND

- 1,525 total units created or preserved (since April 2014)
- 708 housing units for households making 50% or less of AMI

LOUISVILLE CARES REVOLVING LOAN FUND

13 applications received since May 2016

- Combined total funding requests of \$22.3 million
- 1,445 units targeting a mix of 50%, 60% and 80% AMI residents
- 7 projects funded to completely expend the original \$11M loan pool
- 835 total units to date
- 1 project complete and online



VAP

Maximizing resources through streamlined processes and targeted initiatives

- 117 properties sold by Landbank Authority in FY18 (most ever for one FY)
- 74 properties sold via Last Look and Cut It Keep It programs (new in 2017)
- 136 foreclosure cases initiated
- 113 foreclosure cases closed
- 99 active demolition cases







CLEAN & GREEN BY THE NUMBERS

- 30,000 volunteers participating in neighborhood cleanups
- 300 new canopy trees planted
- More than 100 tree given to residents

HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

- In FY18, OHCD has invested nearly \$3.5 million in CDBG funds affecting more than 400 households
- Investment includes:
 - 37 homes in Russell
 - 33 homes in Shawnee
- 24 home owners helped with Down Payment Assistance, representing \$626,264 investment
