
ShelterWorks Program

In March 2017, RCS began its collaborative partnership with KentuckianaWorks, St. John Center for Homeless Men, and Volunteers of America Mid-States to implement a pilot program providing training and employment opportunities in the manufacturing field to individuals residing in shelter.

Services Provided

- Food & transpiration provided
- Up-to 4 M-TECH Certifications
- Immediate Job Placement for some
- Work Attire
- Work with shelters to coordinate beds
- KYWorks is now offering training classes for the food service industry
- Participants are able to obtain housing upon graduation and keeping a job
- Food is now taken to the place of employment until 1st pay check
