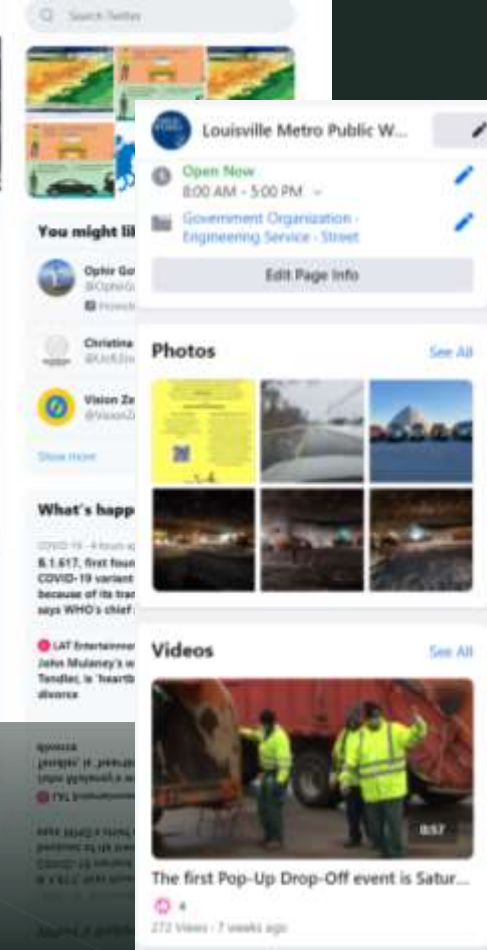
Equipo colaborativo limpio - Informe semanal del 26 de abril al 30 de abril

La tripulación de 13 miembros del personal y su equipo se encuentran bajo nuestro Departamento de Residuos a Cosecho dentro de la División de Servicios de Gestión de Residuos Sólidos. Tienen la tarea principalmente de recolectar basura y escombros a lo largo de las carreteras del Metro.

A continuación se muestra la actualización semanal sobre las acciones de Clean Collaborative Crew: La tripulación limpió aproximadamente 138 millas en la azaca y recogió 292 bolsas, 9 neumáticos y 113 artículos más. Otros artículos incluyen todo, desde restos de vehículos hasta artículos voluminosos arrojados ilegalmente.

Louisville Downtown Partnership también recogió 766 libras de basura y escombros del área del centro.

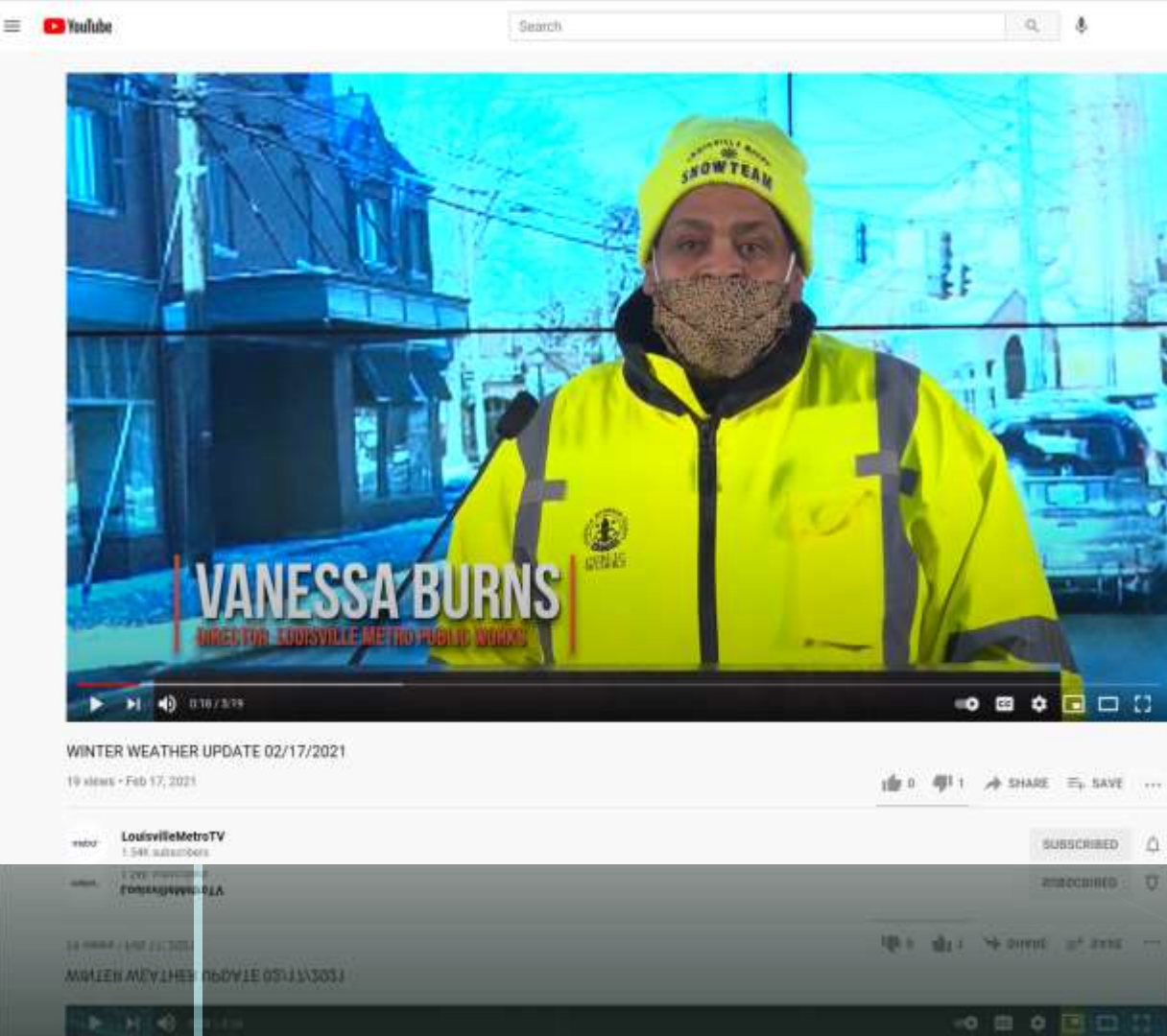

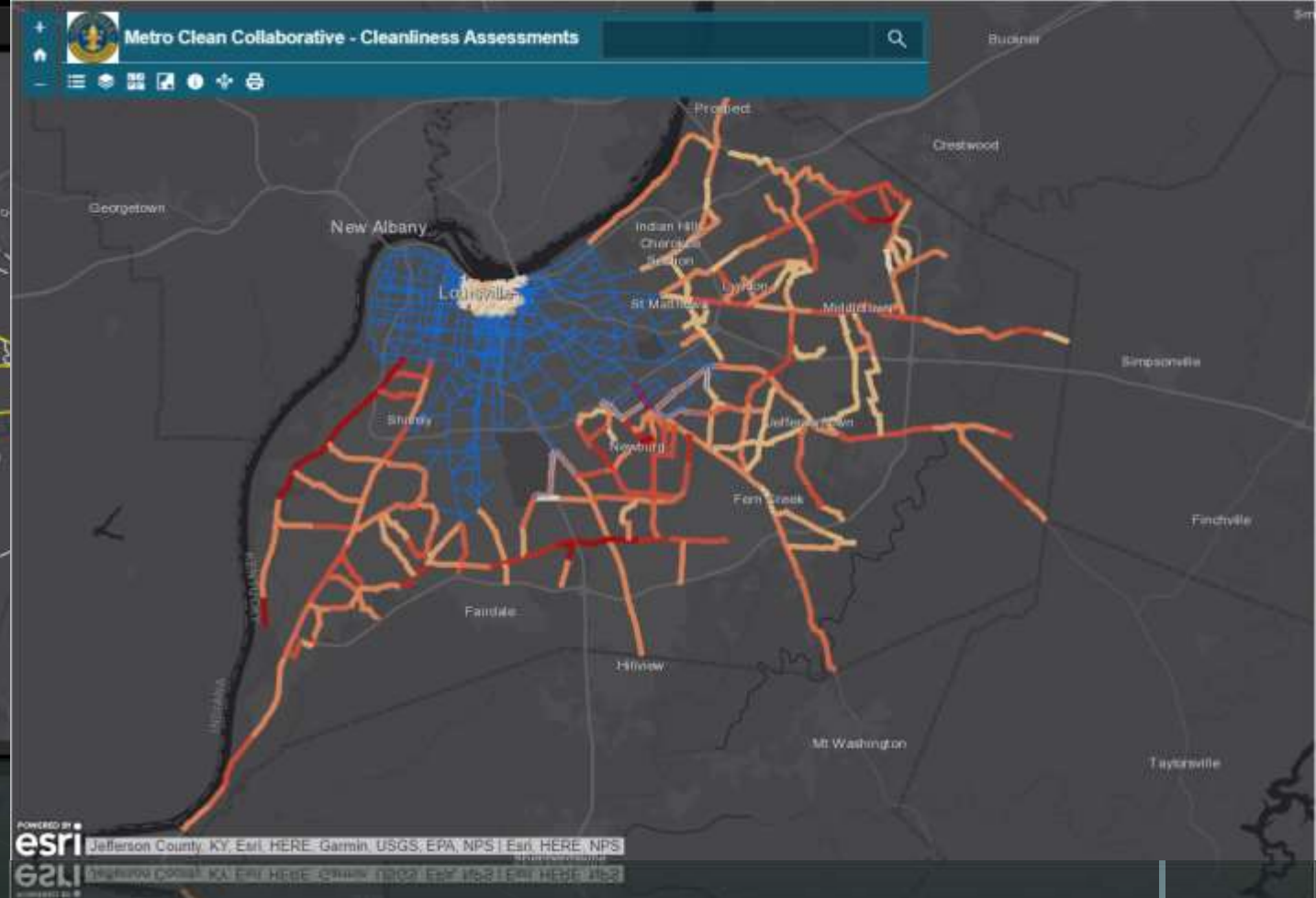
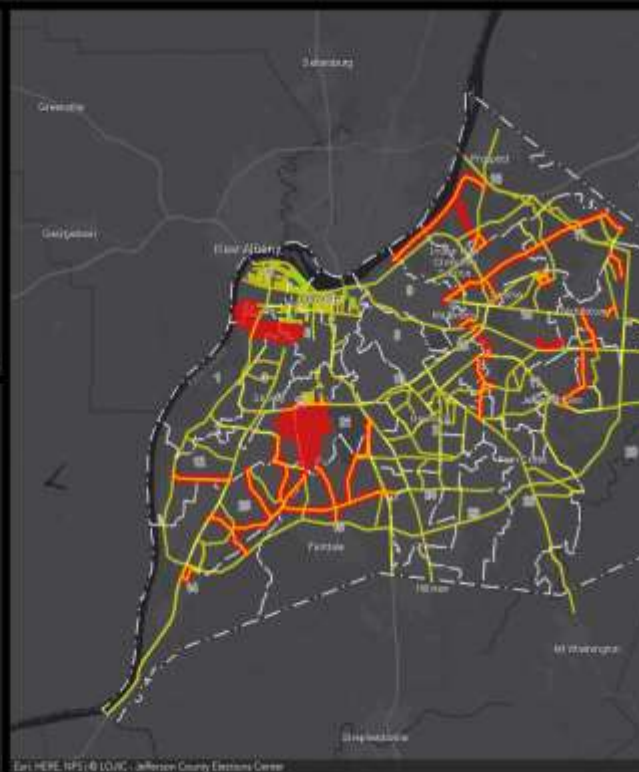
How can I help?

- Choose not to litter. Make a commitment to always dispose of your trash properly and set an example for others.
- Report litter concerns to Metro111. Report online, call 311 or 528-5000, email metro.111@louisville.gov, or tweet @Louisville111.
- Understand litter laws in Louisville Metro. Check the information with others.
- If you see litter, pick it up! People tend to litter more in already littered areas.
- Report a litterer online now.
- Organize a neighborhood cleanup. Brightside offers resources for your group.
- Create your team! A lot of litter ends up on the highway because of waste not properly contained in trucks.
- Remove vehicle debris after an accident. When a wrecked vehicle is removed, the debris must be removed with it.
- Report materials that have been illegally dumped to "junk" set out on the wrong day for Metro111 or call 311 or 528-5000.
- If you WITNESS A PERSON illegally dumping and have information (pictures, license plate #, etc.) report it to our online form.
- If you like someone to dispose waste for you, ask to use their Waste Transfer License and do not pay without a disposal receipt. Properly disposing of thousands of pounds of waste costs at least \$100. If you're charged less than that, be suspicious. Perpetrators will often take your money and illegally dump items to avoid the disposal fee. Drop off up to three household items for free at the Waste Transfer Center. (Disposal fees apply for additional items.)
- Only set out large items during your scheduled set out period. Residents in the Urban Services District can sign up for set out reminders using the Recycle Check app. Residents outside the Urban Services District should call their contracted waste hauler for instructions.
- Dispose of large items like tires and furniture at Pop-Up Drop-Off events. Free recycling and large item disposal events for residents of Jefferson County.

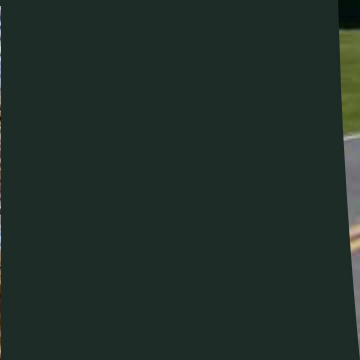

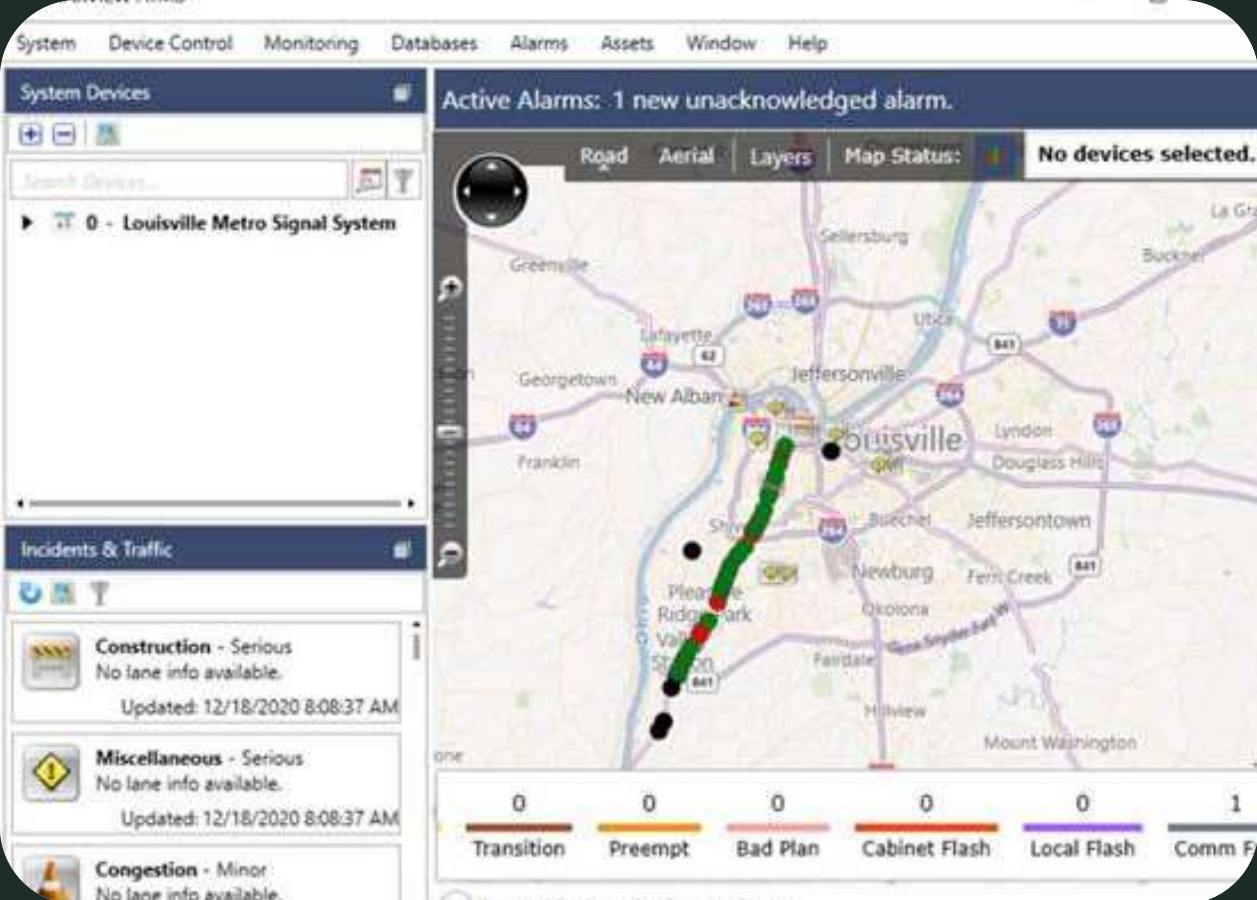
