South Louisville Corridor Community Ambassador Program

The South Louisville Corridor Community Ambassador Program has been established in partnership with Louisville Forward, Block by Block, and District 21 Councilwoman Nicole George's Office. This pilot program is a year-long project that began in October 2021, and serves the area between 6th St. to 3rd St. and Woodlawn Ave. to Southland Blvd.

Uniformed Ambassadors facilitate litter removal, hospitality and safety services, outreach and relationship-building, collaborative information sharing with partner agencies, address 'quality of life' scenarios, and complete other special projects. Metrics of all Ambassador services and accomplishments are captured daily.
