- **Goal # 4:** The LFD will utilize the Racial Equity Assessment Tool to determine the impact of any new projects and/or initiatives.



Only **411** Fire Departments in the world are ISO Class 1 and only **114** are both CFAI Accredited and have an ISO Class 1 Rating


