

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Bob: The applicant has agreed to the two proposed binding elements from your letter, with some changes to the wording to work with the current proposed binding elements from the case manager. In particular, proposed binding element number 7 already had the restrictions on the use of the rear portion of the property. Therefore, we added the language about placing a permanent deed restriction, conservation easement, etc. to that binding element #7 as shown on the attached revised binding element language for your review.

Also, because the current proposed binding element #7 from the staff report references the remaining R-4 portion of the property, I have pasted below a snapshot of where that line is located on the plan (ie., everything beyond the pinchpoint would be restricted).



Tomorrow's LD&T meeting is to set the public hearing, not to hear the case, so we can continue to work with you for the next couple weeks to the extent there are still questions, etc. about the language. However, it appears we are in agreement on substance of the binding elements. We can also make tweaks as needed before tomorrow.

Hello Nick,

Just following up on this. We had an EVC meeting last night and the residents of Waterstone attended and were asking about the status of the BE's relative to this project. All the residents as well as everyone else in attendance clearly understood that the developer discussed turning the woodlands behind the Mini Storage into a Conservation Easement in perpetuity and that was enough for everyone to not oppose the project.

As of now, we have seen no mention of that for tomorrow's discussion, including the BEs provided by Scott Harrington. The only mention of it was in the EVC document I sent yesterday.

Please update us as soon as possible so the Waterstone HOA, residents and the EVC can prepare accordingly for tomorrow, again knowing this requires a Zone change to C-2, a CUP and variances.

It appears that this could be a mutually agreeable and beneficial project if the latest discussions at the last Neighborhood meeting were in earnest. This could include a transfer of that property to the Future Funds defined and approved prior to Planning Commissions discussion.
