Services:

Louisville Male High School Band offers many different opportunities to students. They are as follows:

1. Marching Band - This band performs at five contests throughout the year. They start working the last two weeks of July and it runs through the first weekend in November. They perform at four contests within the state of Kentucky and one national contest in Tennessee.
2. Concert Band (typically made up of freshmen and sophomores) - This band performs at concerts about five times throughout the year.
3. Symphonic Band - This is our most experienced band. This band performs as many as 15 each year throughout the state. This year they have been asked to perform at the Kentucky Music Educators Association meeting in February 2015. The Louisville Male High School Symphonic Band has done this more than any other band in the state.
4. Jazz Band - This group is an after school band that meets throughout the year and typically performs during the winter at various events.
5. PEP Band - This band is also a program that practices after school and performs at several varsity basketball games each year.
6. Percussion Ensemble - This is also another group that meets after school and performs at various concerts held at Male each year.

The Band Association really invests in our students. We hire professionals to come in during the school day to work with individual sections of the band. This is done all year long and is funded by the band association. Our students benefit from this extra instructions.

Each May we also have a large number of students who participate in the All-County Marching band. They perform at the Pegasus Parade each year during the Derby Festival.

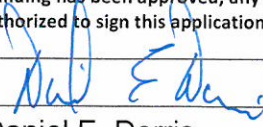

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

**THE LOUISVILLE MALE HIGH SCHOOL
BAND ASSOCIATION, INC.**

The undersigned incorporator of this nonstock, nonprofit corporation acting under Kentucky Revised Statutes Chapter 273, as amended, hereby submits the following Articles of Incorporation for filing:

ARTICLE I

NAME

The name of the nonstock, nonprofit corporation is the LOUISVILLE MALE HIGH SCHOOL BAND ASSOCIATION, INC. (the "Association").

ARTICLE II

PURPOSE

The purpose of the Association shall be to engage in any lawful activity for which a corporation may be organized under the laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky. The Association is organized and shall be operated exclusively for educational and charitable purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), including but not limited to the following:

(1) To prepare students for success and to foster academic achievement; to increase educational opportunities and activities through support of the Louisville Male High School Band program; to provide volunteer assistance and financial support through fundraising activities designed to enhance competition, provide concentrated classroom instruction, and promote an appreciation of music.

(2) To support mentoring, counseling, tutoring and related programs, through the gift of teaching music with knowledge of the material, in a manner that best stimulates academic skills in middle and high school children.

(3) Solely for the above purposes, the Association is empowered to exercise all rights and powers and transact any and all lawful business for which organizations may be incorporated and powers conferred by Chapter 273 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes, known as the Kentucky Nonprofit Corporation Act, so long as they are consistent with the requirements of Section 501(c)(3) of the Code, including, but without limitation thereon, to participate, either directly or through a subordinate organization which is affiliated with the Association, in activities that will permit the Association to

act exclusively in furtherance of its charitable and educational purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Code.

(4) It is intended that this Association shall have the status of a corporation which is exempt from federal income taxation under the Code as any organization described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Code, so that contributions received are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Code, as amended from time to time. These Articles shall be construed accordingly, and all powers and activities of the Association shall be limited accordingly.

ARTICLE III

INITIAL REGISTERED OFFICE AND REGISTERED AGENT/PRINCIPAL OFFICE

The street address of the initial registered office of the Association is 4409 Preston Highway, Louisville, Kentucky 40213, and the name of its initial registered agent at such address is Nanette Moore. The mailing address of the Association's principal office is the same.

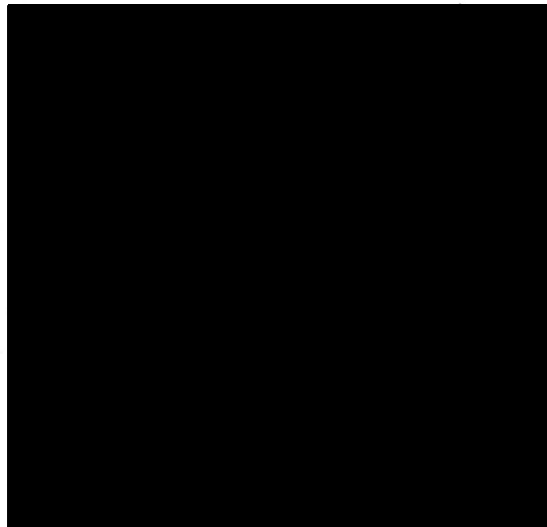

The number of directors constituting the initial Board of Directors of the Association is three (3), and the names and mailing addresses of the persons who are to serve as directors until their successors are selected in accordance with the provisions of the bylaws of the Association are:

ARTICLE V

REGULATION OF AFFAIRS OF THE ENTITY

In carrying out the corporate purpose, no part of the net earnings of the Association shall inure to the benefit of or be distributable to any of its directors, officers or any other private individual, entity or organization except that the Association shall be authorized to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered, to make reimbursement for reasonable and appropriate expenses and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of its purpose as set forth in these Articles of Incorporation. No substantial part of the activities of the Association shall be the carrying on or issuing of propaganda, attempting to influence legislation, (except as permitted by Code section 501(h)) or participating in, or intervening in (including the publishing or distributing of statements) any political campaign on behalf of (or in opposition to) any candidate for public office. The Association shall not engage in any act of self-dealing as defined under Section 4941 and Section 4958 of the Internal Revenue code of 1986, as amended.

ARTICLE VI

MEMBERSHIP

The Association shall have no members, nor shall it have or issue shares of capital stock. The Corporate offices shall be conducted and managed by the duly elected Board of Directors and Officers.

ARTICLE VII

BYLAWS

Bylaws of the Association, as duly adopted or from time to time altered, amended, or repealed by the Board of Directors, shall set forth provisions for the regulation of the internal affairs of the Association, including, but not limited to: (1) the composition of and the manner for election and removal of the members of the Board of Directors; (2) the composition and powers of committees of the Association or its directors; (3) the designations, qualifications and duties of officers of the Association, and the manner of their selection; and (4) such other matters as may be determined by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE VIII

AMENDMENTS

Amendments to the Articles of Incorporation may be made by the Board of Directors upon the majority two-thirds vote of the directors.

ARTICLE IX

DISSOLUTION

The Board of Directors may authorize the dissolution of the Association by a majority vote of the directors. Upon the Association's dissolution, the Board of Directors shall direct the distribution of the Association's assets, after adequate provision for creditors shall have been made, to an organization or organizations, qualifying as charitable organizations pursuant to Code section 501(c) (3) to be used for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of Code Section 501(c) (3) or to the federal, state, and/or local government for a public educational purpose. In selecting such organizations to which to distribute the Association's assets, the Board of Directors shall give first priority to any successor organization of the Association; and second, to any other organizations or governmental entity with the same or substantially similar purpose to the Association. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by a court of competent jurisdiction in the county in which the principal office of the Association is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively under Code section 501(c)(3).

ARTICLE X

DIRECTORS' LIABILITY

No director of the Association shall be personally liable to the Association for monetary damages for any breach of his or her duties as a director, provided that this provision shall not eliminate or limit the liability of a director: (i) for any transaction in which the director's personal financial interest is in conflict with the financial interest of the Association; (ii) for acts or omissions not in good faith or which involve intentional misconduct or are known to the director to be a violation of law; or (iii) for any transaction from which the director derived an improper personal benefit.

If the Kentucky Nonprofit Corporation Act is amended after the date of the filing of these Articles of Incorporation to authorize corporate action further eliminating or limiting the personal liability of directors, then the liability of a director of the Association shall be eliminated or limited to the fullest extent permitted by the Kentucky Nonprofit Corporation Act, as so amended, and without the necessity for further action by the Association in respect thereof.

ARTICLE XI

INDEMNIFICATION

The Association shall provide indemnification for all its directors and officers against expenses actually and reasonably incurred by them in connection with the defense of any action, suit or proceeding, in which they are made a party by reason of having

been directors or officers of the Association, except in relation to matters as to which such director or officer shall be adjudged in such action, suit, or proceeding to be liable for negligence or misconduct in the performance of duty and to such matters as shall be settled by agreement predicated on the existence of such liability for negligence or misconduct.

ARTICLE XII

ACTION OF DIRECTORS WITHOUT A MEETING

Any action (except the election of directors) required or permitted to be taken at any director's meeting may be taken without a meeting by a written unanimous consent, setting forth the action so taken, signed by all the directors entitled to vote on the corporate action.

ARTICLE XIII

DURATION

The duration of this Association shall be perpetual.

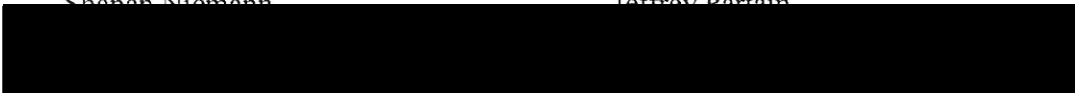
