

INTERVIEW WITH REBECCA EAVES

On November 12, 2014, at approximately 1939 hours an interview was conducted with Rebecca Eaves. Mrs. Eaves is more specifically identified as:



This interview was conducted at Heine Brothers Café located at 4901 Brownsboro Road. Also present during this interview was Sergeant Marcus Laytham. Mrs. Eaves is President of the Arrow Fund Foundation. Mrs. Eaves interview was taken in the form of a sworn statement and the following are the key aspects of the interview:

- Mrs. Eaves received a call at home from Heather Adkins requesting medical assistance for Sadie.
- Sadie had self-mutilated and ingested the bandage on her leg.
- Rebecca Eaves contacted Louisville Metro Animals Services employee, Amanda Crook Baldwin
 and requested that she release Sadie in to the care of the Arrow Fund. Mrs. Eaves received verbal
 approval from Amanda Crook Baldwin by phone. Sadie was then taken to Blue Pearl Animal
 Hospital by Heather Adkins for treatment.
- When Mrs. Eaves arrived at Blue Pearl Animal Hospital, she described Sadie's condition as:
 - O Sickening, with the smell of rotting flesh.
 - o Infection to the leg
 - o Labored breathing
 - o Blood and pus was discharging from the affected area.
- Sadie was euthanized at Blue Pearl Hospital due to the seriousness of her condition.
- Mrs. Eaves did not contact anyone at Louisville Metro Animal Services after Sadie was euthanized, to discuss the condition of the animal.
- Rebecca Eaves was not made aware of Sadie's previous medical condition prior to being transferred into the care of the Arrow Fund.
- Metro Council was provided Sadie's medical records from Blue Pearl Hospital by Rebecca Eaves.
- Rebecca Eaves provided medical records from Blue Pearl Animal Hospital to Sergeant Laytham and me during the interview. The medical records have been placed in to the PIU file for further review.

 According to Rebecca Eaves, The Arrow Fund takes in animals that have been tortured, abused or neglected in the Kentuckiana area. They also fight for stronger laws and work directly with Law Enforcement and Animal Control to prosecute those committing these types of offenses.

And uh...basically she proceeded to tell me that she got Sadie...I believe it was in November...and from Metro, and she was fostering, and that at that time Sadie had an injured leg that needed...that it was determined needed to be amputated, and

was assured that it would be amputated, and she took Sadie in to her care, and after repeated pleas uh, to have the dog's leg amputated because it was causing the dog pain, and the dog had been uh, self-mutilating, her request was never fulfilled. And the reason for calling me was because Sadie self-mutilated and ingested the bandage that was on her leg, and that she was in very serious shape and that she had taking (sic) the dog to a vet of her, on her own accord, and that it was, the dog was in very, very serious shape and needed intervention.

phone?

It was the foster.

So I then uh, made sure that I got in to contact with Amanda Crook Baldwin...okay, I don't...okay, and uh, I stated to her that this animal, I'd been informed, is in critical shape, and told her the gist of the conversation with Heather and I said will you sign the dog over to the Arrow Fund, and she said absolutely. It's done.

without that authorization.

Okay. And you say..."before we can treat"... And who's...who's "we" and who's gonna treat

And uh, the, the ... the choice of the emergency hospital was Blue Pearl, and that's where we take our very critical cases that need 24-hour care, which most of them do in the beginning, so that's our main, our main place.

And before I...she was, she was then taken there.

Kessinger

Can you...can you describe to me...just tell me what the Arrow Fund does?

Eaves

The Arrow Fund does uh, we take in the severe torture, abuse and neglect cases in the Kentuckiana area. We strive to fight for stronger laws in the state of Kentucky, and we

uh, work with uh, law enforcement and officials, whether it be animal controls or, or whatever, to uh, prosecute those that are found guilty of these, of these offenses.

Yes. Yeah. Uh, yes. It was morning, I think.

Okay. Uh, well, yeah, we don't know the time...exact timeframe.

Yeah, I can't tell you the exact time because we get so many cases...I definitely remember the call because I remember how very upset this

person was.

Can you ex...can you tell me what your responsibility or your role was when you

She said this...I mean in, in I might...that might not...from now on it might not be her exact words, but she was horrified at the condition, and I immediately was on my way there. And the condition of the dog...when I saw her, was quite, it was sickening. Uh, the ...the stench from rotting infection...the flesh. dog could barely breathe...labored breathing...labored breathing...it was ...it was horrible. Just horrible.

Okay. And you observed that?

Yes, I did.

Okay. And what...what type of treatment was Sadie given?

Eaves

...There was a...well, I'm sure they tried to make her comfortable...okay...I, I...I mean I'm, I'm handing over the medical records...the experts and the specialists administered whatever they could. It was then explained to me that a dog that has uh, mega esophagus...she had pneumonia, aspiration pneumonia...and having trouble breathing...

So she...you can't really...and it is always explained to me...it's not a good surgical candidate...if...you can't put an animal under anesthetic when they can hardly breathe on their own.

had...had the opportunity or given the medical paperwork to go back to review any of it?

Eaves

No, I have never seen it.

Kessinger

So do you know any of the dates and times

Sadie has been seen?

Eaves

That she saw other vets at...no, I do not. I

never, never.

Kessinger

When you were at...

Eaves

...Might I add this...

Kessinger

...Absolutely.

Eaves

I even wanted...even...I was asked that question

before and then I thought, 'cause I provided these documents also to Metro Counsel, the ad Hoc Committee.

Uh, that question was asked to me and I said wait. While we're here, let me make a phone call. I called Blue Pearl. I said, I need you to look in Sadie's case file...

...Um-hmm, um-hmm...

Eaves

...to make sure nothing was left out. 'Cause I have been told that we were provided other documents...medical documents...and confirmed there was nothing in that file. We never got any other...any other files.

Kessinger

...Do you...do you recall who made the allegations that you all...

Eaves

...I don't know, I was just asked that question. I said no, we, no, we do not have them. I

never, I never saw any of them.

Kessinger

So you...you never talked to Heather Adkins

prior to this...

Eaves

...Never...

Kessinger

...incident. Okay. Now do you have a lot of

dealings with Louisville Metro Animal

Services?

Eaves

Yes. Well, I mean uh, we have in the past. I

mean it, it...it comes and goes.

...It was...at, at that point it was, at that point it was on Facebook and a lot of people follow it. I didn't...I didn't...I don't think I followed up. I, at...I don't recall following up...

Uhm...normally, if we take an animal, we're, they know it's pretty much taken care of and we're not really usually contacted. I mean they fol...I mean some people follow us on Facebook. We're very transparent, as far as that goes.

...Um-hmm.

As far as the treatment, what we do, what we don't do...what we...how the animal is...when they're adopted...we're very transparent.

Kessinger

Okay. Sgt. Laytham.

Laytham

Yes. So the first day you were made aware of Sadie...

Eaves

...Correct...

Laytham

...was, was approximately the day that she was ultimately euthanized. Correct?

Eaves

Yes. I would say...and I'm, I'm guessing here...I would say within a 12-hour period.

Okay. And the only person you talked to, that

Yeah. Other than I did talk to Amanda Crook, who did give me uh, permission from Metro Animal Services, to take over the care of that animal.

Okay. Now earlier I believe you said that you believed that the fo...that Sadie was in the care of a foster since approximately November?

Eaves

I thought. Yeah, it was like...it, it...from my...in thinking I was told she had had her approximately six months.

Laytham

Okay... Okay...

Eaves

So...I mean again, this happened when...February...that, yeah.

Laytham

Okay.

Eaves

It was several months.

Laytham

Okay. So you wouldn't debate uh, whether or not uh, Sadie went in to foster care on September 9th, 2013?

Eaves

No. I wouldn't debate that at all.

...Would it surprise you that uh, if we talked to another vet that saw Sadie prior to this, and that would have been in early 2013, and this uh, and it's actually called a uh, Brachial Plexus Avulsion?

Uh, that the dog would suffer no pain on that limb and actually they self-mutilate and, 'cause they cannot feel that limb...

Eaves

Okay.

Laytham

Because it's the nerve damage in there ... so ...

Eaves

Well, what I saw ... when, when I saw it ...

Laytham

...Um-hmm...

Eaves

...it was causing a lot of pain because it was bloody and pussy. So I can't...I wouldn't dispute that. What I saw...

Laytham

...Um-hmm...

Eaves

...was a bloody, pussy uh, infected, horrible leg, swollen, that would have caused pain, and I would have believed that she could have self-mutilated from that. so...

Kessinger

...Um-hmm.

Eaves

...if you are saying otherwise in early February...

Laytham

...Well, I'm not, I'm...I'm sayin'...

So I, I don't dispute...I don't dispute that...I'm just telling you what I saw.

Yeah. Now as far as the, the pneumonia...

..would that be fair to say that the dog contracted pneu...pneumonia while was in the care of the foster? If it was in the care of her for six months?

Well, I don't...i can't answer that. How can I answer that, really? Now mega esophagus, to my knowledge, had never been diagnosed, and mega esophagus is a condition, if they...if, if the food go...you know, and I'm not a vet so...

Laytham

...Um-hmm...

Eaves

...but they can contract aspiration pneumonia...it should have been detected by the time February rolled around.

Several times. Now that...I can't...I, that's why I didn't say anything in our post because I...it's one person's word against the other. All I care about...or we care about, as the Arrow Fund...





The Arrow Fund is a Kentuckiana based 501 (c)(3) nonprofit organization that provides medical treatment to animals who have been victims of extreme torture, abuse, or neglect. After securing care for these animals our focus extends to holding the abuser responsible for his or her actions. We strive to educate the public regarding the ongoing problem of animal cruelty and advocate strengthening our local, state, and national animal welfare laws.

We are an all volunteer organization led by a long-time animal rights volunteer, Rebecca Eaves, and overseen by an active Board of Directors. Neither Rebecca nor members of our Board are paid for their services. (See list of officers and board members below.)

When The Arrow Fund is contacted, and the case fits our criteria, we take legal possession of the animal and transport him or her to an appropriate medical facility to secure treatment. Following medical treatment, the animal recovers with a medical foster, where he or she is also given the chance to acclimate to living indoors, and be assessed/retrained in preparation for a permanent home. It usually takes an extended period of time for the animal to recover physically and emotionally, but we will do what it takes to get him or her there and find the right home. Once the animal is receiving treatment, The Arrow Fund works with the proper authorities to pursue prosecution of the abusers. We also work with the news media and legislators to keep our community informed.


