Economic Development Goals

<u>Create jobs</u>

Double the number of high-wage jobs created by 2024, from the 15,000 predicted growth to 30,000, by focusing on professional, technical, skilled trade and managerial jobs within Louisville's five business clusters to improve Louisville's economic trajectory towards greater opportunity, prosperity and competitiveness for all citizens.

Improve wages

Improve median annual wages, adjusted for cost of living, to the top half (1/2) of peer cities by 2020 and top third (1/3) by 2030.

- 104 active attraction/expansion opportunities
- 9,081 potential jobs
- \$612 million in potential investment







Growth in Louisville Metro

- 40,000 jobs gained since January 2011
 = 11% growth (top 1/3 of our peers)
- 4.5 % unemployment rate for April 2015, compared to 5.1% for the U.S.
 - #1 of peer cities in unemployment decline,
 4th consecutive month leading peer cities

Planning & Design

- Managed 135 public meetings
- 16,673 subscriptions for PDS notices
- All PDS applications available online within 24 hours of submittal

Construction Review

- Cycle time: 12 days for commercial; 4 days for single family (ongoing cross-functional team project)
- Online services nearly 18,000 applications processed







Sustainability Progress

- Brightside Community-Wide Clean Up more than 13,000 volunteers in 2015 Spring clean up (new record).
- Brightside Cleanliness Assessment -Louisville's overall score improved from a 2.07 to a 1.95
- Named 4-STAR Community for sustainability/ livability efforts

VAPSTAT Progress

- 450 properties available currently for sale
- Activity in FY15:

LOUISVILLE CARES CREATING AFFORDABLE RESIDENCES FOR ECONOMIC SUCCESS

- Pilot project to address the need for affordable housing for low-income, working households.
- Over 21,000 subsidized units occupied BUT more than 21,000 families on waiting list for housing assistance.
- \$11 million revolving loan fund to provide gap financing for multi-family rental development.
- \$1 million pilot project to incentivize affordable housing near employment centers.
