

Dir Burns,

I'm seeking your concurrence on the recommendations below:

Based on measurements taken from the aerial photo, the roadway width is at least 18' so I'd support accepting the road based on its current width. In addition, there are no vacant lots along this road so the area is unlikely to increase in intensity or require additional pavement width.

The existing commercial use has access to both Trent Ave and Dixie Hwy, with Trent providing direct access between the commercial site and a signalized intersection. I'd support accepting Trent Ave into the public road system despite the existing restaurant use because there is alternative access to the site and Trent Ave is a signalized intersection.
