
## Case Summary / Background

- Many of the parcels are vacant, ownership is difficult to track and many of the right-ofways are unimproved.
- Habitat for Humanity has obtained a number of parcels and has received approval to replat portions of the area.


## Case Summary / Background


- Habitat for Humanity has been working with MetroSafe and the Worthington Fire Department about renaming some of the streets within the area.
