Mr. Yeager,

This project has highlighted a definite need for some coordination between KYTC and Metro on sidewalk / resurfacing projects. When this all began, the belief was that Metro might being doing all of the required ramps at the intersection, but when Washburn was completed, only the ramps that touched Washburn were completed.

We are proposing a meeting In Early 2016 with Metro, State and possibly even TARC to coordinate efforts and make the most logical use of funds and manpower.

What we are looking at trying to do is, work something out where whomever is at a location, handles the needs of that location, in exchange for work at another location. I don't see this happening a lot, but even once could solve an issue like Washburn.

An example would be if we know you are doing Washburn, you take care of the ramps at that intersection, however when we do, say like US 60 and Lyndon Lane, we build a ramp there that Metro or TARC wants built as part of a long range plan.

We are doing some sidewalk projects right now that have been coordinated with TARC and they are doing some sidewalks we wanted and we are improving some of their stops when we are paving. An example is US 60 at Dorsey, we were going to build sidewalk along the Southside from Dorsey up to the florist, but TARC had planned to build from Dorsey to strip center entrance. TARC agreed to build the remaining section and we helped them out with some other work, elsewhere in the county.

KYTC does not currently have a "sidewalk program", but instead has an ADA compliance program, which only is funded when the facility needing updating is being affected by a resurfacing project. 146 at Washburn could not be funded, as we are not paving it and if we tried to fund it otherwise, it would come directly out of overhead, which is being spread thin on many other needs.

My hope is with this meeting, which I discussed with Andrew Metcalfe recently, we will be able to better coordinate and will be able to make sure that Metro work on KYTC routes is done per our standards, which is some cases, they are not, requiring us to redo them again when we resurface, wasting much needed \$\$\$.

In short, we cannot award a contract for 1 ramp and we do not have a funding program or sidewalk program which could address the work. The only real option I see at this time is if a Metro crew did the work and payment was funded from some alternate source.

I know that is vague, but I hope it clears up some of the concerns. If you need more input, please let me know.

Erin-

I had Jason Moore from D-5 review and provide an estimate which is roughly \$5,500, see details below. I have heard you have funded work that D5 has performed? If so would this be something you would be willing to try and accomplish with the other two ramps?

"I see someone has worked on the two northern ramps, so if we're just concerned with the southeast corner, this would be a simple type 2, just west of the existing curb box. Assuming a 5' wide landing and a stub back to the push button, I'd approximate 20 SY of 4" concrete sidewalk, 10 SF of detectable warnings 25 LF of Standard Header Curb. Based on unit prices from out sidewalk jobs this year (\$190/SY for sidewalk, \$30/SF for DW and \$55/LF for curb), I'd approximate roughly \$5,500 to perform the ramp on the southeast corner of this intersection. Of course this cost could vary either way based on final design and if it is included in a larger project or is performed singularly. "

Metro has already started work on the other two ramps. I am assuming that Washburn is getting resurfaced or I asked the right person to install ramps. There was an inspector with Metro working with our electrical maintenance staff relocating some in pavement sensors a few weeks ago.

Question/Description:

My family lives in Deepwood in the City of Norwood. The closest park to us is Warwick in the City of St. Matthews. We often take our two boys there and have found it difficult to cross New Lagrange at Washburn due to a lack of sidewalk ramps at the marked crossing. The pedestrian crosswalk

situation at this intersection needs to be improved as the marked walk doesn't flow with available sidewalks. There are only sidewalks on one side of Washburn and New LaGrange. The lack of accessible ramps and placement of walk sign triggers makes this already busy intersection dangerous to navigate. Due to a lack of bike lanes, we usually have use the sidewalk area along New Lagrange while trying to cross with our children. Stroller, wagon, wheelchair, and other assisted use is very challenging at this site due to the ramp/trigger situation. We are excited about improvements in sidewalks and accessibility in the Lyndon area, and would like to know how to extend this effort to include the local parks and our neighborhood.
