GPNA is a neighborhood association that started in 1973, 43 years ago. The map area covered is outlined in this folder. The association focuses on assuring residents and business owners are kept aware of the issues taking place where via the association our voice can be presented and hopefully have input. Over the years there have been numerous times this has taken place and as such our association has garnered a positive reputation. For the past 2 years our neighborhood has been "elected" by a LEO magazine voting process as the 2nd most popular neighborhood in Louisville. We are proud to have a close relationship with the Fire Station at Rubel and Winter Avenues; and with 4th District Police. Beyond promoting safety as prime we work hard to assure our center is open and used by the public for a variety of purposes and at no cost. Our center is located at 1094 E Kentucky Street and opened in 1986. To help off set operational costs we started a weekly bingo the very next year. That bingo has ran consecutively for 30 years now and continues to be a main source of income to keep our building updated and in good condition. I might add with exception to 2 years the city has supported matching the bingo income and has played a most helpful role. The leadership of this has come most recently from Councilman Tandy and before his passing Councilman King. In recent years we have taken on the focus of supporting the urban environment we live in. We have planted over 100 new trees in the neighborhood and 3 years ago worked with MSD and Councilman King to establish a large rain garden at Ellison Avenue at Swan Street. This past year the garden was named in honor of the life of our longtime councilman Jim King. WE also keep up two raised gardens and a small orchard. We welcome all persons to come and take the harvest home when all is ripe and ready. Right now we are involved with other close by neighborhood associations in tracking the new Logan Street MSD basin and the assured upcoming transfer by the city for new development at the old Urban Government complex located at Barret Av right on the northeast border of the GPNA boundaries. We do have social media connections primarily through our Facebook Page titled as GermanParistown Neighborhood Association and via our website that is at gpnalouiville.com. Finally, GPNA is a member of Center For Neighborhoods and we work closely with their staff on our many issues. Their ability to aid in our reaching our mission is very real and appreciated.

Germantown Mission Inc. is making the application. In the early 1990's our attorney advised us that given the ongoing support the city would likely be providing for our center and for certain festivals and activities that it would be appropriate for our setting up a mirrored incorporation that has IRS-501(c)3 status. Thus GMI was formed and remains in good standing with the state and IRS. GMI has been the organization that has made application over many years and the city's records would have on file most of the information being provided within this grant application. In terms of our mission GMI is tied completely to support the GPNA neighborhood association. The next paragraph provides briefly the now 40 year history of Louisville's 3rd neighborhood association ever formed. Again, this is the sole focus of GMI in seeking grants and contributions that meet the mission and focus of GPNA.

We are a neighborhood association within Louisville. The association is 40 years old this year. Our boundaries are included on the inside left page of the folder this application is submitted within. Our singular focus is to work in all ways possible to maintain the heritage of our neighborhood, to assure the properties are clean and updated and that residents are invited to participate in coming together to work to improve the quality of life in the ways neighborhood associations are expected to do this. We hold a close relationship with 4th District Police in supporting block watches and crime prevention techniques. In recent years we have taken advantage of a focus group study that was performed by Center for Neighborhoods and have given specific attention to beautification projects and encouraging environmental living in our urban setting. Our theme of coming together also occurs by meetings we host. Four times a year we host a pot luck dinner at our center and we invite topical speakers to educate those attending. We have a once a year election meeting where we often recognize our Citizen(s) of the Year. This is the one meeting that normally has the largest attendance. We have close to 300 members including 40 or so businesses. Our major fund raising opportunities are the weekly bingo held at the center and the annual music festival called The Shotgun Festival. The festival has become a street festival celebrating our urban nature of living close to one another. The 4th and 10th district council members have been the main funders supporting this happening. Finally we do encourage residents to call or email us. We willingly work issues that anyone chooses to bring to our attention. One example of this last year was the landmarks commission vote on the Cherokee Park Tepee structure. We provided the group our letter of support. We collaborate with many of the non profits of our area and often sponsor their activities that aide residents that are in need. Our website is gpnalouisville.com.




