We held our neighborhood meeting on Monday, June 5, 2017 at 7:30pm. A letter giving notice of this meeting was sent two weeks prior. The meeting was held in our house at 1273 Farmdale Ave. James Evans and his wife showed up for the meeting to talk and express a few suggestions / concerns. They were kind and gracious in our suggestions and I had already spoken to them previously, inviting their feedback. They said that had not had a back experience yet and were pleasantly surprised by the type of guests that were rented the housing. Having said that, they listed three suggestions for being a better neighbor:

- 1. Trim the bushes in the back yard that are our backyard to keep them from going into their back yard.
- 2. Change the check in time to not be up to 2am. Their bedroom window is near the driveway and it wakes them up when guests arrive late and converse outside.
- 3. Communicate in a clearer manner that the cement parking pad is not free to park on.

All three concerns have been addressed by the following means:

- 1. The bushes have been trimmed.
- 2. We've changed the check-in time to 10pm.
- 3. We've changed our check-in instructions to include a sentence about not parking on their cement pad.
