This is a busy sidewalk and pedestrian traffic causes our dogs to bark bark, bothersome to those pedestrians and our neighbors. Our desire is to minimize dogs' seeing pedestrians and reducing barking. And, yes, to enjoy our back yard without being "on display" to the heavy foot traffic.

Tall privacy fences exist on cornor lots throughout the neighborhood, including the property at 1292 Cherokee Road (across Longest Avenue from our home)

Our intent is to actually reduce the public nuisance of barking dogs, while replacing an old worn out chain link fence. The fence line is not in any line-of-site for auto traffic.

While other tall privacy fences on corner lots may have been grandfathered in, we consider this to be a reasonable request. In addition, there are more than a dozen trees which would need be removed in order to meet the 3' setback requirement, we all know the city needs more trees.

We consider the special circumstances to be the broad visibility of our backyard visible to every person on this heavily-traveled pedestrian feeder to Bardstown Road businesses.
