Greetings Laura Mattingly,

I (William E. Travis) live at 6701 West Orell Rd and have been made aware through various mailings, conversations, and emails of the proposed 160,000 sq. ft. warehouse plus the 7,000 sq.ft. office building. As a resident of this area and as an individual who purchased a home in this area to raise a family I have several concerns (that are also shared amongst the residents of West Orell):

- 1) The main road the warehouse will use to enter the facility will be West Orell. It is difficult enough to pull off Dixie Hwy in a "regular" automobile let alone a semi-truck. How often will traffic be impeded/stopped so that these various trucks may enter the property? How will these trucks be able to pull off Dixie Hwy. without completely blocking off West Orell? Without having to pull all the way into the other lane? Dixie Highway is dangerous enough. Adding the congestion and confusion that will inevitably be caused by the addition of this warehouse will be a hazard. I did not purchase my home to have to constantly deal with this type of situation.
- 2) If and when the warehouse truck drivers realize that using Dixie Hwy. is too cumbersome and as a result begin using Lower River Rd. via Greenbelt to deliver potentially 24 hours a day to this warehouse; to think this would be a benefit or a positive to the resident of West Orell is delusional. To not only deal with trucks constantly up and down our road (where our children play in the yard) but also the sound throughout the night is something that would significantly impact our quality of living on West Orell.

I cannot stress enough how much those of us on West Orell oppose this warehouse development. We did not purchase our homes with this facility at the end of our road. If it was already there when we were looking to buy a home we would not have purchased our house.

We do not want 6605 West Orell rezoned!!!! We do not want our lives changed in order to accommodate a warehouse. We are opposing the rezoning of 6605 W. Orell Rd.

This street is only 2 lanes and it is barely wide enough for regular size vehicles. It would be a disaster waiting to happen to have semi-traffic accessing it on a daily basis.

- 1. I drive a small car and have difficulty turning left on to Dixie every morning. If my vision would be impaired by large semi 's turning in front of me I'm sure I would not be the only one. Dixie highway is already a very busy operated street as it is. There has been numerous accidents there. At one point a talk of a light was discussed, but that never happened.
- 2. That corner road has also been repaired several times where the road has caved in . The weight of the semi-trailers would destroy the road and it would be impossible for them to make that turn. I am writing you both in regards to the proposed project at 6605 W Orell Road. I live at 6703 W Orell Road. I am very concerned about this project and am highly opposed to it. I feel that this area is not going to be equipped properly for all the heavy traffic that this warehouse will cause.

I have 2 young children, if this project goes thru my children will not be able to go out front with us and play safely due to the high volume of traffic that this will cause. Secondly, it is already dangerous for us to turn left onto Dixie Hwy and we constantly worry about being T-boned trying to turn onto Dixie. Adding the extra traffic and semi's will cause additional problems and thus will lead to wrecks potentially deadly wrecks. I am assuming that neither of you have traveled this road much and have tried turning onto Dixie Hwy. My recommendation to you would be to come during rush hour in the AM and PM and try to turn onto Dixie. You will see what I am talking about.
