It presents The Classical Hour which started as a series of Sunday afternoon concerts in the lobby of the historic Brown Hotel in Louisville, Kentucky, on December 6, 2009 with pianist Nada. Some performances are broadcast and streamed live by The Classical Hour and Crescent Hill Radio, WCHQ 100.9 FM, which can also be downloaded and heard from anywhere in the world.

In an effort to have classical music available to all, Sundays Love Music continues to look for opportunities to present outreach programs in the community. The performing arts hold a critical place in our community and we want to make live music available to all strata of our society.

Our present goal is to identify more venues west of downtown Louisville such as the Tim Faulkner Gallery and to reach out to schools and community centers in an effort to educate audiences of all ages about the universal power of music. As music is the language of peace and communication, we strive to create a network where more people will be involved in the process of making the arts accessible to all.

Sundays Love Music will present a major concert at the end of this year, our Classical Hour of December 29th at 7:00 pm, with the Classical Hour orchestra: Brahms Piano Concerto No. 2, one of the greatest piano concertos ever written. It requires hiring an orchestra, (the Classical Hour Orchestra), a soloist and a conductor.

The program will take place at the Faulkner Gallery, the city's most interesting and eclectic arts event space in the edgy, historic warehouse district just west of downtown Louisville.

The program will attract audiences from everywhere in the Kentuckiana area. We will have media support from sources such as the Courier-Journal and radio stations such as Crescent Hill Radio, where the Classical Hour is a regular broadcast. It is free and open to all public. We plan to make great music accessible to anyone and let them know that it is also their heritage to be able to come and enjoy it.

We had a major success last year when we presented Brahms's Piano Concerto No. 1 at the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary with the support of several organizations including Community Music Partnership funds from District 8, the Music Trust Fund, Stock Yards Bank, our board of directors and several individuals.

We already have secured support for our 2017 event from the Music Trust Fund; from The Piano Shop, the Steinway dealer in Kentucky; and from our board members. We are again requesting support CMP as well as from other entities. We have requested District 5 to advocate on our behalf and encourage other districts to support our great artistic endeavor of bringing high quality Classical performances to a neglected area of our city.

The program will benefit all individuals exposed to the performance, which is both live and broadcast, by creating the opportunity to experience and participate in arts and culture. It promotes equity, diversity and inclusion and makes the arts and culture accessible to everyone in every neighborhood in Louisville. The outcome is that more art will exist for more people in more places.

Studies have shown that when we expose our children and youth to the arts, academic performance is greatly improved. It has also been proven that exposure to musical artistic expression creates a common foundation for people of various cultures, social-economic backgrounds, and races. It promotes and empowers a just, inclusive, and equitable society where people from everywhere can communicate.

We will track attendance at the performance and interview audience members about their experience. Based on past concerts in venues of this size, we are expecting an audience of 300 or more. While Crescent Hill Radio is unable to track listeners at live concerts, we do have statistics on downloads of the live programs and feedback on regular programs which promote the live concerts.

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF SUNDAYS LOVE MUSIC FOR EVERYONE, INC.

The undersigned person, for the purpose of forming a non-profit corporation without capital stock or stockholders, under the laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky and K.R.S. Chapter 273, does hereby adopt Articles of Incorporation as follows:

ARTICLE I NAME OF CORPORATION

The name of the Corporation is Sundays Love Music for Everyone, Inc.

ARTICLE II PURPOSES AND POWERS

(A) The corporation is organized and operated exclusively for charitable and educational purposes under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code, including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code. In carrying out its corporate purposes, the Corporation shall have all the powers allowed corporations by Chapter 273 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes.

(B) In furtherance of the general purposes in paragraph (A), the particular purposes of the Corporation are to provide concerts to the public with trained musicians performing classical music including education about classical music, which increases public awareness of the importance of classical music.

(C) In furtherance of the general purposes in paragraph (A), and the particular purposes in paragraph (B), the Corporation shall have all the powers and do any and all things consistent with the provisions hereof, which the Corporation's Board of Directors may determine to be necessary or appropriate to effectuate the purposes for which the Corporation is organized as herein set forth, to the extent that the doing of such act or thing is not inconsistent with the provisions of Chapter 273 of Kentucky Revised Statutes, or any other applicable law or statute of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, or section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

(D) Notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles, this Corporation shall not, except to an insubstantial degree, engage in any activities or exercise any powers that are not in furtherance of the purposes of this Corporation.

ARTICLE III DISTRIBUTION OF ASSETS UPON DISSOLUTION

Upon the dissolution of the Corporation, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by a court of competent jurisdiction of the county in which the principal office of the Corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

ARTICLE IV NET EARNINGS AND ACTIVITIES

No part of the net earnings of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, officers, directors, or other private persons, except that the Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article II hereof. No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the Corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the Corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a Corporation exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

ARTICLE V INITIAL BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The business and affairs of the Corporation shall be governed by a Board of Directors. The number of directors, their terms of office, and qualifications shall be fixed by the By-Laws of the Corporation, provided that the number of directors shall not be less than three (3). The members of the initial Board of Directors shall serve until the first annual election of directors and until their successors are elected and qualify.

Each person who is or was a member, director, trustee, or officer of the Corporation, whether elected or appointed, and each person who is or was serving at the request of the Corporation as a member, director, trustee, or officer of another corporation, whether elected or appointed, including the heirs, executors, administrators, or estate of any such person, shall be indemnified by the Corporation to the full amount against any liability, and the reasonable cost or expense (including attorney fees, monetary or other judgments, fines, excise taxes, or penalties and amounts paid or to be paid in settlement) incurred by such person in such person's capacity as a member, director, trustee, officer, or employee or arising out of such person's status as a member, director, trustee, officer, or employee; provided, however, no such person shall be indemnified against any such liability, cost, or expense incurred in connection with any action, suit, or proceeding in which such person shall have been adjudged liable on the basis that personal benefit was improperly received by such

person, or if such indemnification would be prohibited by law. Such right of indemnification shall be a contract right and shall include the right to be paid by the Corporation the reasonable expenses incurred in defending any threatened or pending action, suit, or proceeding in advance of its final disposition; provided, however, that such advance payment of expenses shall be made only after delivery to the Corporation of an undertaking by or on behalf of such person to repay all amounts so advanced if it shall be determined that such person is not entitled to such indemnification.

Any repeal or modification of this Article shall not affect any rights or obligations then existing. If any indemnification payment required by this Article is not paid by the Corporation within 90 days after a written claim has been received by the Corporation, the member, director, trustee, officer, or employee may at any time thereafter bring suit against the Corporation to recover the unpaid amount and, if successful in whole or in part, such person shall be entitled to be paid also the expense of prosecuting such claim. The Corporation may maintain insurance, at its own expense, to protect itself and any such person against any such liability, cost, or expense, whether or not the Corporation would have the power to indemnify such person against such liability, cost, or expense under the Kentucky Nonprofit Corporation Acts or under this Article, but it shall not be obligated to do so. The indemnification provided by this Article shall not be deemed exclusive of any other rights which those seeking indemnification may have or hereafter acquire under any bylaw, agreement, statute, vote of members or board of directors, or otherwise. (C) For any transaction from which the director or executive officer derives an improper personal benefit.

If the Kentucky Revised Statutes are amended or repealed after approval of this Article to authorize corporate action further eliminating or limiting the personal liability of directors or executive officers, then the liability of a director or executive officer of the Corporation shall be deemed to be eliminated or limited by this provision to the fullest extent then permitted by the Kentucky Revised Statutes, as so amended. Any repeal or modification of this Article shall not adversely affect any right or protection of a director or executive officer of the Corporation existing at the time of such repeal or modification.

On behalf on Sundays Love Music for Everyone, Inc., I am applying for funds to support a concert to be held in Portland this winter. Sundays Love Music, 501(c)3 non-profit, believes that all neighborhoods deserve access to a variety of styles, and we can fulfill that need with our classical concert programs.

The Portland and West Louisville areas are seeing new development that is complementing much of the efforts of past years. Examples including Keith Cook's The Blue House (WESTEC), the music program devoted to lifting up the youth of that area; the recent relocation of Interfaith Paths to Peace from downtown to Portland; the opening five years ago of the Tim Faulkner Gallery; the work of entrepreneur Gill Holland; and many other ventures seeking to develop the life of this long-neglected part of Louisville.

The concert, featuring pianist Nada, is to be held at the Tim Faulkner Gallery on Friday, December 29, 2017. An orchestra of approximately 40 professional musicians will be hired to accompany the Brahms Piano Concerto #2. The concert will be free and open to the public, although donations will be accepted to support further activities of our non-profit. Total cost is expected to be in the \$7,000 - \$9,000 range. Since I, Nada, am on the SLM Board, it is acknowledged that I cannot and will not be paid with Metro Council funds for my performance.

The membership of Sunday Loves Music reaches across the city, and publicity and potential audience members are already in place through the Classical Hour radio programming on Crescent Hill Radio. Metro Council will, of course, be included in all announcements as a sponsor in our print, broadcast, and social media postings.

We understand that funds are available through the Community Music Partnership (CMP) as well as through the Neighborhood Development Fund (NDF). CMP provides free music to the community through a partnership with Musicians' Union Local 11-637. I am attaching an application for CMP funding and ask that you submit it to the Metro Council for approval. Please keep in mind that the orchestra itself will cost well over \$7,000 and provide many local musicians with work during their "off-season."

I believe that you are familiar with the CMP program, but if you need further information you can contact the Union at 502-451-7509 or <u>musunion@louisvillemusicians.org</u>.

We tried to view the NDF training presentation online but received a "page not found" message. We notified the Management and Budget Office of this issue and have now received the document by email.

The performing arts hold a critical place in our community, and we hope that you and other Metro Council members will realize the importance of your generous support. Thank you.

Sundays Love Music will present a major concert at the end of this year, our Classical Hour of December 29th at 7:00 pm, with the Classical Hour orchestra: Brahms Piano Concerto No. 2, one of the greatest piano concertos ever written. It requires hiring an orchestra, (the Classical Hour Orchestra), a soloist and a conductor.

The program will take place at the Faulkner Gallery, the city's most interesting and eclectic arts event space in the edgy, historic warehouse district just west of downtown Louisville.

The program will attract audiences from everywhere in the Kentuckiana area. We will have media support from sources such as the Courier-Journal and radio stations such as Crescent Hill Radio, where the Classical Hour is a regular broadcast. It is free and open to all public. We plan to make great music accessible to anyone and let them know that it is also their heritage to be able to come and enjoy it.

We had a major success last year when we presented Brahms's Piano Concerto No. 1 at the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary with the support of several organizations including Community Music Partnership funds from District 8, the Music Trust Fund, Stock Yards Bank, our board of directors and several individuals.

We already have secured support for our 2017 event from the Music Trust Fund; from The Piano Shop, the Steinway dealer in Kentucky; and from our board members. ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF SUNDAYS LOVE MUSIC FOR EVERYONE, INC.

The undersigned person, for the purpose of forming a non-profit corporation without capital stock or stockholders, under the laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky and K.R.S. Chapter 273, does hereby adopt Articles of Incorporation as follows:

ARTICLE I NAME OF CORPORATION

The name of the Corporation is Sundays Love Music for Everyone, Inc.

ARTICLE II PURPOSES AND POWERS

(A) The corporation is organized and operated exclusively for charitable and educational purposes under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code, including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code. In carrying out its corporate purposes, the Corporation shall have all the powers allowed corporations by Chapter 273 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes.

(B) In furtherance of the general purposes in paragraph (A), the particular purposes of the Corporation are to provide concerts to the public with trained musicians performing classical music including education about classical music, which increases public awareness of the importance of classical music.

(C) In furtherance of the general purposes in paragraph (A), and the particular purposes in paragraph (B), the Corporation shall have all the powers and do any and all things consistent with the provisions hereof, which the Corporation's Board of Directors may determine to be necessary or appropriate to effectuate the purposes for which the Corporation is organized as herein set forth, to the extent that the doing of such act or thing is not inconsistent with the provisions of Chapter 273 of Kentucky Revised Statutes, or any other applicable law or statute of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, or section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

(D) Notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles, this Corporation shall not, except to an insubstantial degree, engage in any activities or exercise any powers that are not in furtherance of the purposes of this Corporation.

ARTICLE III DISTRIBUTION OF ASSETS UPON DISSOLUTION

Upon the dissolution of the Corporation, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by a court of competent jurisdiction of the county in which the principal office of the Corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

ARTICLE IV NET EARNINGS AND ACTIVITIES

No part of the net earnings of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, officers, directors, or other private persons, except that the Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article II hereof. No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the Corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the Corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a Corporation exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or (b) by a Corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

ARTICLE V INITIAL BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The business and affairs of the Corporation shall be governed by a Board of Directors. The number of directors, their terms of office, and qualifications shall be fixed by the By-Laws of the Corporation, provided that the number of directors shall not be less than three (3). The members of the initial Board of Directors shall serve until the first annual election of directors and until their successors are elected and qualify.

ARTICLE IX INDEMNIFICATION

Each person who is or was a member, director, trustee, or officer of the Corporation, whether elected or appointed, and each person who is or was serving at the request of the Corporation as a member, director, trustee, or officer of another corporation, whether elected or appointed, including the heirs, executors, administrators, or estate of any such person, shall be indemnified by the Corporation to the full amount against any liability, and the reasonable cost or expense (including attorney fees, monetary or other judgments, fines, excise taxes, or penalties and amounts paid or to be paid in settlement) incurred by such person in such person's capacity as a member, director, trustee, officer, or employee or arising out of such person's status as a member, director, trustee, officer, or employee; provided, however, no such person shall be indemnified against any such liability, cost, or expense incurred in connection with any action, suit, or proceeding in which such person shall have been adjudged liable on the basis that personal benefit was improperly received by such

person, or if such indemnification would be prohibited by law. Such right of indemnification shall be a contract right and shall include the right to be paid by the Corporation the reasonable expenses incurred in defending any threatened or pending action, suit, or proceeding in advance of its final disposition; provided, however, that such advance payment of expenses shall be made only after delivery to the Corporation of an undertaking by or on behalf of such person to repay all amounts so advanced if it shall be determined that such person is not entitled to such indemnification.

Any repeal or modification of this Article shall not affect any rights or obligations then existing. If any indemnification payment required by this Article is not paid by the Corporation within 90 days after a written claim has been received by the Corporation, the member, director, trustee, officer, or employee may at any time thereafter bring suit against the Corporation to recover the unpaid amount and, if successful in whole or in part, such person shall be entitled to be paid also the expense of prosecuting such claim. The Corporation may maintain insurance, at its own expense, to protect itself and any such person against any such liability, cost, or expense, whether or not the Corporation would have the power to indemnify such person against such liability, cost, or expense under the Kentucky Nonprofit Corporation Acts or under this Article, but it shall not be obligated to do so. The indemnification provided by this Article shall not be deemed exclusive of any other rights which those seeking indemnification may have or hereafter acquire under any bylaw, agreement, statute, vote of members or board of directors, or otherwise. If the Kentucky Revised Statutes are amended or repealed after approval of this Article to authorize corporate action further eliminating or limiting the personal liability of directors or executive officers, then the liability of a director or executive officer of the Corporation shall be deemed to be eliminated or limited by this provision to the fullest extent then permitted by the Kentucky Revised Statutes, as so amended. Any repeal or modification of this Article shall not adversely affect any right or protection of a director or executive officer of the Corporation existing at the time of such repeal or modification.

ARTICLE XI LIMITATION OF MEMBER LIABILITY
