Dear Metro Council Members and Future Colleagues:

Please accept this letter and the attached resume as confirmation of my interest in the 21st District Metro Council Seat.

I believe in Louisville, and the immense potential that permeates this county. My life is the embodiment of the American Dream that manifested itself right here in this great city. The true genius and promise of Louisville and America is that anyone regardless of where you are born and what you look like can write the next great chapter in the American story. My story began in a small village in Africa, when a 14-year old teenager refused to accept the peasant farming lifestyle that was practiced by his father and grandfather, as well as other ancestors before them. His insatiable thirst for a better life led him to leave his ancestral home and walk about 200 miles northwards, to a small town that provided better opportunities. This move by my father was the catalyst to my American story.

Like many families in Louisville, I grew up poor, living in Nigeria and did not have many opportunities. By the time I was twelve, any hope that I had to become successful was dashed when a high jump cross bar I was carrying touched an electric power line and I was electrocuted. This accident resulted in the amputation of both of my arms and seemed to cripple any hopes I had of escaping poverty. I knew that I could become successful, but I needed a place and a community that would empower me and support my aspirations. Louisville was that beacon of hope for me. After relying on my family and friends for all my daily needs for 5 years, I decided to empower myself. I spent the following years teaching myself a new way of life. With empowerment came aspiration. I enrolled in 7th grade at the age of eighteen and I worked hard to become a world-class athlete. In 2000, I was recruited by Bellarmine University and became the first international Paralympic athlete recruited by any college in the United States.

Despite the fact that I arrived in Louisville without any money or family connections, I was motivated by a simple, powerful idea -- that in America, and right here in Louisville, if I work hard and remain steadfast, I can be successful and play my part in building a better community. That is what I have committed myself to doing for the last fifteen years. I became involved in my community from my first week in the United States. I was elected to serve as a Student Government Representative for my Freshman Class. I volunteered for almost everything on and off campus while carrying a full load and meeting my obligations as a student-athlete. Bellarmine University recognized my service to the community with the Lenihan Award for Leadership & Community Service for each of the three years I attended the institution, becoming the first student to receive the award for three years in a row. I was also a recipient of the Rotary Club of Louisville International Scholarship, and was part of the prestigious Brown Scholars Program.

When Councilman Jim King had an opening for an intern during my senior year of college, I applied, because I believe in the potential, the work, and responsibility of Metro Council. Even though I was not offered the internship, my resolve in serving this community was strengthened. I decided to invest my time in the youth in our community as a public school teacher, and pubic speaker with the Fellowship of Christian Athletes. I have served many segments of our community. I previously served as the chairperson for Conway Middle School Advisory Council and served on the school's Site-Based Decision Making Council (SBDM). I have served on the Kentucky Education Association (KEA) and Jefferson County Teachers Association (JCTA) Board of Directors. During the 2010 campaign, I co-chaired Mayor Greg Fischer's Disability Policy Committee. I am a Kentucky Colonel and a graduate of Leadership Louisville's Bingham Fellows Program. I am also a member of Young Professionals Association of Louisville. I currently serve as a member of the Metro Democratic Club Board of Directors, The Friends of the Iroquois Library, and on the Kentucky Democratic Party Central Executive Council.

Neighborhoods in District 21 are bursting with untapped potential and are in dire need of revitalization. As your colleague, my top priorities will be to work with every Councilperson to find ways to stimulate economic development in the area and create safe neighborhoods. I hope to see a revitalized Woodlawn Business District and create the 3rd Street Business Corridor that would be posited to become Kentucky's Multicultural Business Hub, highlighting all the multicultural and unique flavors that District 21 and Louisville has to offer. I will support businesses and entrepreneurs in District 21 by partnering with organizations to create and sponsor programs that will provide mentoring and business workshops, and find ways to bridge the digital literacy divide for citizens from low income neighborhoods to stay digitally connected. I will promote research-based public safety initiatives and create a funding stream for Neighborhood and Block watches to bring citizens together with law enforcement to deter crime and make our communities safer.
