1. <u>R-024-18</u>

A RESOLUTION BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL OF THE LOUISVILLE/JEFFERSON COUNTY METRO GOVERNMENT SUPPORTING MEDICAL CANNABIS LEGALIZATION IN KENTUCKY.

> A motion was made by Vice Chair Welch, seconded by Committee Member Lanshima, that this Resolution be recommended for approval.

Chair Person Leet and Council Member Hollander spoke to the item.

A motion was made by Committee Member Lanshima, seconded by Committee Member Flood, that this Resolution be amended by striking the last "Whereas" and replacing with the following "Whereas" statement:

WHEREAS: The Louisville Metro Council recognizes the important scientific and enforcement work of the Federal Drug Administration, the National Institute on Drug Abuse, and the Drug Enforcement Administration; however, cannabis remains illegal at the federal level as a Schedule I drug under the federal Controlled Substances Act.

And inserting the following Sections before Section I and II, making them Sections I, II and III, respectfully:

SECTION I: The Louisville Metro Council requests that the Federal Drug Administration, National Institute on Drug Abuse, and the Drug Enforcement Agency expedite research on the safety and effectiveness of the use of medical cannabis for certain health purposes.

SECTION II: The Metro Council believes that the Controlled Substances Act should be amended to remove cannabis from scheduling.

SECTION III: The Metro Council acknowledges that every state will have differing and sometimes conflicting views of legalized cannabis and how to regulate it, but we would ask the federal government to allow each state the ability to craft its own regulations regarding cannabis.

And changing Sections I and II to Sections IV and V.

And strike the following in SECTION IV: "House Bill 166 or any other" and "and provide for the care, comfort and relief of any Kentuckian who may benefit".

And insert the following after "...passage and approval..." in SECTION V: "and we request the Clerk of the Metro Council forward copies of this Resolution to

the Kentucky Legislature, Governor Matt Bevin, the Federal Drug Administration, the National Institute on Drug Abuse, and the Drug Enforcement Administration".

The motion to amend carried by a voice vote.

The motion to recommend for approval carried by a voice vote and the amended Resolution was sent to Old Business.

Adjournment
