MANY STATISTICS ARE INCLUDED IN THE ORDINANCE WHICH YOU ALL HAVE IN FRONT OF YOU NOW.

THIS IS AN EFFORT TO BRING AWARENESS AND EDUCATION TO

OUR COMMUNITY AS WELL AS BRINGING THE RESTAURANTS ON AS PARTNERS

IN PREVENTING WORSENING NUMBERS OF OBESITY AND DENTAL CARRIES IN

OUR CHILDREN.

WITH AN UPTICK OF DISEASES IN CHILDREN SUCH AS
DIABETES, HEART DISEASE, STROKE, CANCER ARTHRITIS AND OTHERS,
IT'S TIME TO DO SOMETHING TO PROTECT OUR CHILDREN.

AND THE STANDARDS THAT THE MARINES HAVE.

HE SAID IN THE PAST THERE WERE ARGUMENTS AGAINST
LEGISLATION SUCH AS SEAT BELTS AND AIR BAGS AND A LOT OF IT WAS
ABOUT THE COST, BUT AS YOU KNOW, LOOK HOW MANY LIVES THOSE HAVE

THE [INDISCERNIBLE] SAYS -- FROM SELLING OR CUSTOMERS ABILITY TO PURCHASE.

WE WANT TO MAKE IT CLEAR.

ALL OF US GOT THE E-MAIL FROM THE WOMAN WHO SAYS SOMETIMES I WANT TO TAKE MY CHILD TO HAVE A GREASY HAMBURGER AND A COKE.

NOTHING IN THIS ORDINANCE KEEPS THAT FROM HAPPENING.

WHAT IT DOES DO IS PROVIDE OPTIONS FOR THE PARENT WHO SAYS THAT'S GREAT.

AND SOMETIMES I WANT TO TAKE MY CHILD TO A RESTAURANT AND BE ABLE TO HAVE A HEALTHY OPTION.

AND MAYBE IN MY NEIGHBORHOOD THAT'S NOT AN OPTION.

I'VE GOT TO GET ON THE BUS TO GO SOMEWHERE WHERE THEY'RE GOING TO GIVE ME A HEALTHY OPTION.

SO IT'S ABOUT PROVIDING THE CHOICES HERE.

WE ALSO -- I MADE A CHANGE AND THIS IS THE CHANGE THAT COUNCILWOMAN AUBREY WELCH WAS TALKING ABOUT.

WE MADE A CHANGE THAT INADVERTENTLY CAUSED A PROBLEM WITH THE FAST FOOD RESTAURANTS.

ORIGINALLY WE HAD AN OFFER.

WE WERE ASSUMING IN THE FAST FOOD MODEL YOU COME IN

AND YOU'RE TALKING TO SOMEONE RIGHT AWAY WHAT IT IS ON A SPEAKER

ABOUT WHAT YOU'RE GOING TO CHOOSE OFF THE MENU SO THEY CAN SAY,

OUR CHILDREN'S MEALS WE HAVE GRILLED CHICKEN AND WE HAVE THESE HEALTHY DRINK OPTIONS.

SO THEY CAN SAY IT TO YOU.

THAT'S MORE OF A PROBLEM FOR THE SIT-DOWN RESTAURANTS
THAT WOULD REQUIRE TRAINING ISSUE WITH THE WAITERS AND

THE SIT DOWNS PREFER PUTTING IT ON THE MENU.

THE FAST FOODS PREFER THE OFFERING.

SO THE CHANGE THAT YOU HAVE HERE ALLOWS FOR BOTH.

EITHER OR.

THE CHANGE SAYS THAT YOU SHALL OFFER AND OR LIST ON THE MENU SO YOU CAN DO WHICHEVER FITS BEST.

WE DIDN'T PRESCRIBE THAT FOR THE FAST FOOD AND SIT DOWN.

AND YOU CAN DO BOTH.

 $\ \ \,$ WE ALSO HAVE -- I WANT TO POINT OUT IN THE PENALTY SECTION.

THIS IS CONFUSING.

WHEN WE FIRST DID THE SECTION A WHERE THEY TALKED ABOUT CLASS A MISDEMEANOR FOR THE VIOLATION AND THE \$500 FINE.

THAT NEVER APPLIED TO THIS SECTION.

WE HAD A SECTION UNDERNEATH IT THAT FOCUSED ON JUST THIS SECTION.

THAT WAS ALWAYS ABOUT OTHER SECTION OF THE CHAPTER.

BUT IT WAS CONFUSING BECAUSE YOU READ THAT -- \$500 FINE? WE MOVED TO CLARIFY THAT.

IN ADDITION TO CLARIFYING, WE DO AN EXTRA THING HERE.

SO THOSE OF YOU WORRIED ABOUT THE OUTREACH -- TOO MUCH OVERREACH FOR THE GOVERNMENT WE WILL EASE IT.

WE [INDISCERNIBLE] CLASS A MISDEMEANOR WHICH THE [INDISCERNIBLE] FINED UP TO \$500.

THE FIRST QUESTION IS FOR MILK OR A NONDAIRY MILK ALTERNATIVE.

IS THAT INCLUDE CHOCOLATE MILK? SOME OF THE OTHERS TALK ABOUT SWEETENERS.

>> IT DOES INCLUDE CHOCOLATE MILK.

THE ARGUMENT BEING AS LEAST THEY'RE GETTING CALCIUM IN THE BIT OF SUGAR.

IN OTHERS YOU'RE GETTING NOTHING.

ZERO NUTRITIONAL AMOUNT.

WITH CHOCOLATE MILK, USUALLY IT'S LOW FAT CHOCOLATE MILK USUALLY.

>> SO IT CAN BE SWEET MILK.

NUMBER FOUR, I GUESS NUMBER THREE.

FRUIT JUICE COMBINED WITH WATER OR CARBONATED WATER
BECAUSE FRUIT JUICE IS SUGARY AND BAD FOR YOU, AND IF YOU CUT
THAT WITH WATER IT'S LESS BAD FOR YOU?

>> LESS CALORIES.

I'M NOT MAKING A MOTION ALL RIGHT ALTHOUGH I CAN'T SAY

THAT I -- THE GENTLEMAN THAT SPOKE EARLIER SPOKE TO THE STEVIA

DRINKS -- IF IT WERE UP TO ME [INDISCERNIBLE] I CERTAINLY

WOULD BE IN FAVOR OF GETTING RID OF NUMBER FOUR OR -- OR THE

OTHER THING ABOUT THIS IS, ALSO IN THE FOOD SECTION LITTLE WORDS

42,000 LOCATIONS OFFER THIS.

YOU SEE THE SYMBOLS OF THE SMALL APPLE ON THE MENU BOARDS AND MENUS THEMSELVES.

THE RESTAURANTS AND BRANDS HAVE BOUGHT INTO THIS.

WHETHER FAST-SERVED OR FORMAL DINING.

I GOT COMFORTABLE WITH IT.

IT BECAME AN INDUSTRY STANDARD FOR ME THEY FELT COME -- FELT COMFORTABLE WITH MY VOTE.

LASTLY, BEFORE I JOINED YOU HERE, THE LAST MAJOR PROJECT I HAD THE OPPORTUNITY WORK ON IS TAKING PLACE NOW LOUISVILLE, KENTUCKY.

IN ADULT OBESITY.

THE PROBLEM THAT OBVIOUSLY WE'RE TRYING TO SOLVE HERE.

AND I THINK SEVERAL, CLEARLY, I THINK WE ALL AGREE
THAT OBESITY AND DIABETES AND TOOTH DECAY ARE PROBLEMS OF HEALTH
IN OUR COMMUNITY.

THAT ABSOLUTELY NEED TO BE ADDRESSED.

AND WE CAN HAPPEN TO DISAGREE ON HOW WE MIGHT GO ABOUT THAT.

I BELIEVE THAT THIS PARTICULAR TYPE OF LANGUAGE PROVIDES A FALSE SECURITY.

PEOPLE THINK THIS WILL ADDRESS THE PROBLEM BECAUSE WE'RE NOW SETTING RULES AND REGULATIONS.

I BELIEVE IT'S GOVERNMENT OVERREACH AND I DON'T THINK
IT WILL ACTUALLY ADDRESS THE PROBLEM.

I BELIEVE OUR CHILDREN NEED TO LEARN EARLY IN THEIR LIVES THAT THERE ARE CHOICES WE HAVE TO MAKE.

>> JUST TRYING.

THIS WAS IN MY COMMITTEE.

AND IT PASSED OUT OF COMMITTEE WITH I THINK IT WAS

THREE --

>> CONTROL WILL REST WITH AN UNELECTED FRANKFORT

ADMINISTRATOR NOT ACCOUNTABLE TO THE VOTERS IN JEFFERSON COUNTY.

THERE ARE A NUMBER OF FACTORS, AS STATE ADMINISTRATOR COULD TAKE ACTION ON.

AMONG THE CRITICISMS OF JCPS IN THE AUDIT WAS THEY DID NOT APPROVE THE 4% TAX RATE IN THE FIRST YEAR OF THE SUPERINTENDENT.

DID NOT RAISE TAXES ENOUGH.

AND THEN THE AUDIT MENTIONS THE JCPS BOARD HAS NOT ADOPTED AN ADDITIONAL NICKEL TAX TO ADDRESS AGING FACILITIES.

GOES ON TO SAY THAT THE AGENCIES IDENTIFIED A PATTERN

I WOULD LIKE TO BE ADDED AS A SPONSOR, PLEASE.

AND I COULDN'T AGREE MORE WITH COUNCILMAN HOLLANDER AND COUNCILMAN MULVIHILL AND EVEN OUR FORMER COLLEAGUE, JULIE ROCKY ADAMS.

THIS IS DEFINITELY OVERREACH AND IT IS TAXATION
WITHOUT REPRESENTATION WHEN YOU TAKE AWAY THE ABILITY OF THE
JEFFERSON COUNTY SCHOOL BOARD TO DO THEIR JOB.

WHEREAS, THE SUCCESS AND PROGRESS OF THE STUDENTS OF LOUISVILLE METRO SHOULD BE THE FOCUS OF ALL DISCUSSIONS TOWARDS ADDRESSING DECADES-LONG PROBLEMS SUCH AS GROWING ACHIEVEMENT GAPS, THE FAILURE TO MEET BASIC LITERARY SKILLS FOR 32% OFCOMING FOURTH GRADE STUDENTS FOR WHOM ENGLISH IS THE PRIMARY LANGUAGE AND CONTINUED FAILURE TO IMPROVE GRADUATION RATES FOR MINORITY HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS.

WHEREAS UNDER THE AUTHORITY GRANTED UNDER KRS 155.785

KDE CONDUCTED A MANAGEMENT REVIEW OF JCPS IN AUGUST 2016 BECAUSE

THE SUBSEQUENT MANAGEMENT AUDIT IN APRIL 2017.

WHEREAS INITIAL FINDINGS OF THE MANAGEMENT AUDIT WERE RELEASED ON SEPTEMBER 20TH, 2017, AND JCPS SUBMITTED FINAL CORRECTIVE ACTION PLANS ON OCTOBER 31ST WITH THE FINAL FINDINGS ONLY RECENTLY PUBLISHED.

WHEREAS THE FINAL FINDINGS OF THE MANAGEMENT AUDIT IDENTIFIED DEFICIENCIES IN JCPS FACES THE INSTITUTIONAL SHORTCOMINGS THAT MUST BE CORRECTED.

WE TRUST THE CURRENT SUPERINTENDENT TO REVIEW AND CORRECT THE PROBLEMS.

WHEREAS UNDER THE SUPERINTENDENT'S LEADERSHIP THE
DISTRICT HAS HAD STRONG FOCUS ON COMPLIANCE, WORKING INTENSELY
AND COLLABORATE EVALLY WITH KDE TO ADDRESS ISSUES SURROUNDING
THE DISTRICT'S CORRECTIVE ACTION PLAN WITH VERY POSITIVE
RESULTS.

WHEREAS THE PROGRESS THAT HAS BEEN MADE IN ONLY TEN
MONTHS THE SUPERINTENDENT AND THE DEMOCRATICALLY ELECTED

JEFFERSON COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION SHOULD CONTINUE TO FOCUS ON IMPROVING TEACHING AND LEARNING FOR ALL STUDENTS IN THE DISTRICT AND INCLUDE BEING OPEN TO NEW AND CREATIVE IDEAS TO ENSURE THAT ALL OF OUR COMMUNITY'S CHILDREN HAVE AN OPPORTUNITY TO GROW.

NOW WE ARE BACK TO COUNCILMAN COAN.

I DON'T WANT TO BELABOR THE PHILOSOPHICAL DIFFERENCES HERE.

I JUST WANTED TO POINT OUT, AND I WENT TO JEFFERSON COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOLS, I WAS BORN IN 1980, I WENT TO JEFFERSON COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOLS AT THE PEAK OF INDUSTRIALIZATION IN THE COUNTRY WHEN ALL OF THE INEQUITIES AND SORT OF UNFAIRNESS AND TOUGH ECONOMIC TIMES WERE AT THEIR PEAK.

I WAS BUSSED FROM ACROSS TOWN AND THEN I WENT TO CAMMER MIDDLE SCHOOL AND I WENT TO BALLARD HIGH SCHOOL.

AND I SAW SOME OF THE PROBLEMS THAT EXIST IN SCHOOL WHEN I WAS BUSSED DOWNTOWN TO TAYLOR, I WAS SEGREGATED FROM THE MAIN POPULATION INTO A CLASS AND SEGREGATION FROM THE NEIGHBORHOOD STILL WAS IN THE SCHOOL.

SCHOOL BOARD, WE ARE NOT MAKING DECISIONS, TO MAKE SURE THAT IF

WE WANT TO HAVE INTEGRATED EQUALLY RESOURCED SCHOOLS THAT WE CHANGE OUR POLICY SO THAT WE HAVE EQUALLY INTEGRATED

NEIGHBORHOODS AND EQUALLY INTEGRATED CITY WHERE PEOPLE HAVE

HEALTH OUTCOMES AND JOB OPPORTUNITIES THAT EXIST FROM ONE SIDE

TO THE OTHER AND THAT WE DON'T SORT OF JUST THROW IT ALL ONTO

SCHOOLS AND POINT AT THE SCHOOLS LIKE THIS IS THEIR FAULT,

BECAUSE IT IS NOT THEIR FAULT.

I THINK THAT THE SCHOOLS AND OUR TEACHERS AND STAFF WORK REALLY, REALLY HARD.

I SAW THAT MYSELF FROM THE PEOPLE I KNOW.

AND THEY DO THE BEST THEY CAN AND ARE NO FACT MAKING PROGRESS DESPITE SORT OF A CONVOLUTED SYSTEM AND A LOT OF THEIR WAYS THEY TRY TO DEAL WITH SOME OF THOSE INHERENT CHARACTERISTICS OF THE COMMUNITY THAT THEY ARE DEALT WITH, WHETHER IT IS BUSSING, HOW OTHER THINGS WORK OR NOT.

I DON'T THINK TAKING CONTROL FARTHER AWAY FROM WHAT WE HAVE HERE IS THE WAY TO DO THAT.

SO I'M CLEARLY IN FAVOR OF THE ORDINANCE AS IT STANDS.

I DON'T WANT TO BELABOR THE POLITICAL DIFFERENCES.

AND I HOPE THIS EPISODE MAKES US ALL TAKE A REAL HARD LOOK AT ALL THE OTHER THINGS THAT I TALKED ABOUT THAT ARE REALLY NOT THE SCHOOLS' FAULT.

SO THAT IS MY TWO CENTS.

LIKE COUNCIL MEMBER HOLLANDER, I WOULD LIKE TO ASK WHY THE RESOLUTION IS NOT GOOD AS IT IS.

I TALK ABOUT OVERREACH BY THE STATE GOVERNMENT, FEDERAL GOVERNMENT.

HERE IS ANOTHER OVERREACH.

THE BOARD MEMBERS OF JCPS ARE DULY ELECTED BY THE CITIZENS OF JEFFERSON COUNTY.

TO HAVE THE STATE TAKE OVER WHEN THEY CANNOT EVEN RUN
THEIR GENERAL ASSEMBLY, THAT IS WHERE THEY SHOULD PUT THEIR
ENERGY.

I WILL NOT BE SUPPORTING COUNCIL MEMBER REED'S RESOLUTION.

THAT MY SON IS A TEACHER IN JCPS.

I AM PROUD OF THE ROLE THAT HE DOES AND MY ROLE AT MERCY, I GET THE OPPORTUNITY WITH THE LEARNING PROGRAM, ALTHOUGH IT IS COMING QUICKLY TO AN END, I GET TO WORK WITH JEFFERSON

COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOLS A GREAT KEEL DEAL AND WORKING WITH THE TEACHERS AND WHAT I SEE OVER AND OVER AND OVER AGAIN ARE VERY COMMITTED TEACHERS WHO CARE ABOUT THEIR STUDENTS AND WHO ARE JUST WORKING EXTREMELY HARD TO DO A GREAT JOB.

MADONNA BRINGS UP A GOOD POINT AS TO RESOURCES.

I HAVE THE PRIVILEGE TO READ TO TWO CAMP TAYLOR STUDENTS THAT NEED HELP IN READING.

EVERYONE READS PROGRAM, A PROGRAM WITHIN THE SCHOOL THAT IS BEING DONE BY VOLUNTEERS.

I WANTED TO TAKE THE TIME JUST RIGHT NOW TO SAY TO FOLKS WHO MAY BE LISTENING LOOK INTO IT.

YOU CAN MAKE A DIFFERENCE IN A CHILD'S LIFE.

I FIND IT A REWARDING HOUR I SPEND EVERY WEEK LITTLE BY LITTLE TRYING TO MAKE A DIFFERENCE.

SO I WOULD ENCOURAGE ALL OF US AND ANYBODY LISTENING TO LOCK INTO THE PROGRAM AND MAYBE BECOME A VOLUNTEER.

COUNCILMAN KRAMER.

>> THANK YOU, MR. PRESIDENT.

TY THE AGREE WITH SO MUCH OF WHAT HAS BEEN SAID BY MY COLLEAGUES.

ERY WON'T GO BACK AND REITERATE WHAT EVERYONE SAID.

I WILL GO BACK AND ASK EVERYONE WATCHING TO LISTEN TO COUNCIL MEMBER COAN.

IT IS A BIGGER PROBLEM THAN JUST THE SCHOOL SYSTEM.

TO EXPECT THE SCHOOL SYSTEM FIXING IT IS A BIG MISTAKE.

TO THINK THAT THE STATE COMING IN AND FIXING THE SCHOOL SYSTEM IS EVEN LESS OF A REALITY OR POSSIBILITY.

I HATE THAT FOLKS, THOUGH, FEEL LIKE BEING HONEST ABOUT WHERE WE ARE IS SOMEHOW BEING NEGATIVE.

WE HAD A YOUNG LADY WHO INTERVIEWED SEVERAL OF US AND ONE OF HER QUESTIONS WAS TO THIS RESOLUTION.

AND MY RESPONSE TO HER THAT NIGHT, I DIDN'T REALLY WANT TO TAKE A HARD LINE ON THIS.

MY RESPONSE TO HER WAS I DON'T THINK WE CAN DO ANYTHING UNLESS WE FIRST ACKNOWLEDGE THAT WE HAVE A PROBLEM.

I SOUND LIKE A BROKEN RECORD SO I APOLOGIZE, I WANT TO DO THE JOB I WAS ELECTED TO DO.

COUNCILWOMAN FLOOD POINTED OUT THAT WE ARE ELECTED TO DO A JOB AND I WANT TO DO THE JOB I WAS ELECTED TO DO AND THIS ISN'T IT.

WE DON'T HAVE CONTROL OVER WHAT THE STATE DOES ON THIS ISSUE.

WE DON'T GET TO MAKE THAT CHOICE.

WHAT WE CAN DO IS COLLECTIVELY INSTEAD OF ATTACKING,
INSTEAD OF GOING AFTER THOSE WHO ARE IN A POSITION OF POWER WHO
CAN SHOVE THIS DOWN OUR THROATS IF THEY SO CHOOSE, TRY TO FIND
SOME WAY TO ENCOURAGE CONVERSATION, SOMEWAY THAT WE CAN SEARCH
FOR COMMON GROUND.

I LIKE COUNCIL MEMBER REED AM NOT IN FAVOR OF THE STATE COMING IN.

I DON'T THINK THAT IS THE SOLUTION, TO COUNCIL MEMBER FLOOD'S POINT.

LOUISVILLE HAS AN URBAN SYSTEM THAT IS VERY DIFFERENT THAN SO MUCH OF WHAT IS OUT IN THE SYSTEM.

THAT URBAN SYSTEM, THOUGH, HAS CREATED SOME VERY REAL PROBLEMS.

AND AS LONG AS OUR CITY IS AS SEGREGATED AS IT IS, I DON'T KNOW THAT THE STATE CAN FIX THE SCHOOL SYSTEM.

BUT AS I HAVE IN THE PAST AND AS I WILL TONIGHT, I
TYPICALLY VOTE NO AGAINST RESOLUTIONS THAT TELL SOME OTHER BODY
HOW TO DO THEIR JOB OR WHAT THEY SHOULD DO, AND INSTEAD REQUEST
THAT WE ASK THEM TO PLEASE CONSIDER THE IMPACT IT IS GOING TO
HAVE ON US, BECAUSE TELLING THEM WHAT TO DO WHEN THEY HAVE
ALREADY MADE IT CLEAR WHAT THEIR INTENT IS DOESN'T MOVE THE
NEEDLE.

IT SIMPLY MAKES THIS A POLITICAL DEBATE THAT COSTS US POLITICAL CAPITAL AND AT THE END OF THE DAY DOESN'T SOLVE ANYTHING.

IT JUST PITS US AGAINST EACH OTHER AND THEN WE GET ANGRY AT ONE ANOTHER FOR TAKING POSITIONS AND IT DOESN'T MEN.

I HAVE TO SAY.

I'M WITH MOST OF YOU, I'M WITH YOU GUYS.

I HAVE ALREADY SAID IT.

I HAVE NAMED THE ONES I AGREE WITH.

BUT I JUST DON'T SEE THE POINT IN WASTING POLITICAL CAPITAL ON THINGS THAT WE CAN'T CHANGE AND THAT ULTIMATELY AT THE END OF THE DAY ARE MORE HARMFUL TO US AS A COMMUNITY THAN HELPFUL.

SO I GUESS THERE IS THE EXPLANATION THAT YOU ARE LOOKING FOR.

>> THANK YOU, MR. PRESIDENT.

WITH YOUR PERMISSION I WOULD LIKE TO BE ADDED AS A SPONSOR AS WELL.

AND I VERY MUCH AM IN FAVOR OF SUPPORTING DR. MARTI
POLLIO AS OUR SUPERINTENDENT AND I'M MORE IN SUPPORT OF AND AM
MORE INTERESTED IN AND IF FAVOR OF MAKING SURE THAT WE AS A
26-MEMBER LEGISLATIVE BODY THAT WAS DULY CONSTITUTED AND ELECTED
BY OUR DISTRICTS THAT WE SUPPORT OUR SEVEN JEFFERSON COUNTY
PUBLIC SCHOOL MEMBER BOARD MEMBERS WHO WERE ELECTED BY THE SAME
VOTERS THAT ELECTED ALL OF US.

AND I FEEL THAT I JUST WANTED TO SAY THAT ON THE RECORD THAT WE MUST LISTEN TO WHAT THE VOTERS HAVE SAID.

AND ALSO, COLLEAGUES, AS I THINK ABOUT THE JEFFERSON COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOL SYSTEM, YES, WE HAVE MANY CHALLENGES.

AND COUNCIL MEMBER REED, I APPRECIATE YOU COMING FORTH AND TRYING TO PRESENT SOMETHING THIS EVENING.

I KNOW THAT YOUR HEART, MIND, AND SOUL WAS IN THAT.

I CAN TELL BY READING IT WHEN YOU READ IT AND BY LISTENING TO SOME OF YOUR OTHER COLLEAGUES.

SO I APPRECIATE THAT.

YOU ARE ALWAYS TRYING TO REACH ACROSS THE AISLE AND TO FIND SOMETHING WE ALL CAN AGREE WITH.

SOMETHING THAT I BELIEVE WITH EVERY FIBER OF MY BEING IS THAT JCPS EDUCATION IS NOT THE PROBLEM.

IT IS A SYMPTOM, THE LACK OF STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT, THE LACK OF A GRADUATION RATE WE ARE LOOKING FOR, THAT IS A SYMPTOM OF A MUCH GREATER PROBLEM THAT HAS ALREADY BEEN IDENTIFIED ON THE FLOOR TONIGHT AND I WANT TO JOIN THE CHORUS.

THAT SYMPTOM IS POVERTY.

IT IS GRINDING POVERTY AT EVERY LEVEL.

WE ARE NOT JUST A SEGREGATED CITY.

LOUISVILLE, KENTUCKY, UNFORTUNATELY, IS ONE OF THE MOST SEGREGATED CITIES IN THE ENTIRE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA.

I BELIEVE IT IS THE FOURTH MOST SEGREGATED CITY.

AND WE ARE GOING TO SEE ACHIEVEMENT GAPS.

SO I FIGHT EVERY DAY, COLLEAGUES, YOU KNOW I TALK

ABOUT FIGHTING FOR FOOD, CLOTHING, AND SHELTER, AND I'M GOING TO

FIGHT FOR THAT.

WE HAVE FOOD DESERTS IN THE SAME AREA OF JEFFERSON COUNTY.

IT IS NO SECRET THAT IT IS SHOWING THE LOWEST STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT GAPS.

WELL OF COURSE THE CHILDREN CANNOT ACHIEVE IF THEY ARE
COMING TO SCHOOL AND THEY ARE TIRED AND THEY ARE HUNGRY AND THEY
DO NOT HAVE AFFORDABLE, ACCESSIBLE, HEALTHFUL FOOD OPTIONS
EASILY AVAILABLE THAT WE ALL HAVE THE BENEFIT OF ENJOYING.

SO I WOULD LIKE FOR US AS A BODY AS WE MOVE FORWARD IN THE COMING MONTHS AND YEARS, LOCALLY AND STATEWIDE AND FEDERALLY LET'S ALL USE OUR EXPERIENCES AND FIND WAYS TO ONCE AND FOR ALL ADDRESS THE REAL PROBLEM, AND IT IS POVERTY.

AND THAT TAKES US TO THE FACT THAT IF YOU ARE LIVING
IN JEFFERSON COUNTY AND YOU ARE A MOTHER OF A COUPLE OF CHILDREN
AND YOU WANT A TWO-BEDROOM APARTMENT, YOU HAVE TO WORK 84 HOURS
A WEEK IF YOU ARE BEING PAID MINIMUM WAGE.

THAT IS A DATA POINT THAT IS OUT THERE.

WE HAVE BEEN GIVEN THAT RECENTLY AT ANOTHER ONE OF OUR HEARINGS HERE IN THIS CHAMBER.

DO THE RIGHT THING AT THE RIGHT TIME FOR THESE CHILDREN OF JEFFERSON COUNTY.

THANK YOU, SIR.

>> PRESIDENT JAMES: THANK YOU, COUNCILWOMAN.

DR. SHANKLIN.

>> THANK YOU, MR. PRESIDENT.

PIGGYBACKING ON WHAT BARBARA SEXTON SMITH SAID.

IT IS THE OPPORTUNITY FOR EVERY ONE OF US SITTING IN THIS ROOM TO HELP LOW INCOME CHILDREN.

THE PROGRAM THAT I SPOKE ABOUT EARLIER, THEY HAVE CLUSTERS.

THEY HAVE LAW STUDENTS.

WE HAVE LAWYERS HERE THAT WOULD HAVE THE OPPORTUNITY TO GO DOWN AND SPEAK TO THEM ON A SATURDAY.

WE HAVE A NURSE HERE THAT CAN GO TALK TO THE MEDICAL GROUP.

THEY HAVE GOT EDUCATIONAL GROUPS.

IT IS AN OPPORTUNITY TO HEM EDUCATE SOME OF OUR YOUNG PEOPLE.

BUT YET WE SIT HERE AND FIGHT AND FUSS ABOUT THINGS THAT THINGS SHOULD NOT BE MESSING IN.

SO IF YOU HAVE SOMETHING TO SAY, GET UP AND GO DOWN

THERE AND DONATE ONE HOUR OF YOUR TIME ON A SATURDAY MORNING IF

YOU ARE AN ATTORNEY TO WORK IN THE LAW GROUP.

IF YOU ARE A NURSE IN HERE, GO DOWN THERE AND TALK TO THE KIDS IN THE MEDICAL GROUP.

EDUCATION.

THOSE TYPES OF THINGS.

IT IS AN OPPORTUNITY FOR YOU TO DO THAT.

SO I SAY THAT WE NEED TO HELP EDUCATE OUR KIDS AND WE COULD SIT IN THIS CHAMBER EVERY DAY BUT IF WE ARE NOT HELPING THE KIDS OUT THERE, WE ARE NOT DOING ANY GOOD FOR THE CITY.

THANK YOU.

>> PRESIDENT JAMES: THANK YOU, COUNCILWOMAN.

COUNCILWOMAN LEET.

>> MR. PRESIDENT, I WANTED TO ADD, BECAUSE I FEEL LIKE
I HAVE HEARD SO MANY CORRECT STATEMENTS IN THIS WHOLE DISCUSSION
TONIGHT FROM ALL OF MY COLLEAGUES.

AND I THINK WE ALL -- THE COMMON GROUND IS HERE THAT WE WANT WHAT IS BEST FOR OUR CHILDREN.

WE WANT OUR CHILDREN TO HAVE THE OPPORTUNITY TO HAVE EQUAL ACCESS TO EDUCATION.

I ALSO KNOW FROM WORKING WITH ALL OF YOU ALL FOR SO MANY YEARS THAT WE ALL DO, WE COMMIT RESOURCES IN THE WAY OF -- WE HAVE MADE DONATIONS THROUGH OUR NDFS TO THE SCHOOL FOUNDATION TO IMPROVE ASSETS AT OUR SCHOOLS.

- I KNOW PERSONALLY I VOLUNTEERED ON THEM.
- I VISITED EVERY SINGLE SCHOOL IN MY ENTIRE DISTRICT
 AND HAVE WORKED WITH THEM TO RESOLVE ISSUES AROUND TRAFFIC OR

BUSES SPEEDING THROUGH NEIGHBORHOODS OR ADDRESSING CONCERNS GETTING OUT OF THE PARKING LOT TO SCHOOL.

AND I KNOW I HAVE WORKED WITH BARBARA SEXTON SMITH RAISING MILLIONS OF DOLLARS TO DO FIVE-BY-FIVE EDUCATION THROUGH FUND FOR THE ARTS.

SO WE HAVE ALL BEEN COMMITTED TO OUR SCHOOLS.

SO I THINK THAT GOES WITHOUT A QUESTION AMONGST ALL OF US.

WE ALL CARE ABOUT THAT ASPECT.

I ALSO BELIEVE, AND I BELIEVE EVERYTHING THAT

COUNCILMAN KRAMER SAID, AND I BELIEVE IN THE FACT THAT LOCAL

CONTROL IS ABSOLUTELY WHAT WE DO BELIEVE IN.

I BELIEVE THAT COUNCIL MEMBER HOLLANDER SAID THAT.

THESE ARE OUR ELECTED SCHOOL BOARD OFFICIALS.

AND I THINK THERE IS AN OPPORTUNITY.

AND WE HAVE SEEN KDE DO IT IN THE PAST.

WHERE THEY SAID LET'S GET TO THIS POINT.

IF YOU DON'T GET THERE BY A CERTAIN AMOUNT OF TIME THERE IS ANOTHER OPPORTUNITY.

BUT I BELIEVE WHAT MY OTHER COLLEAGUES HAVE SAID,
THERE DESERVES TO BE AN OPPORTUNITY FOR DR. POLLIO AND THE
SCHOOL BOARD TO WORK TOGETHER TO IMPLEMENT THOSE CHANGES.

YOU ARE GOING TO HAVE MY CONTINUED COMMITMENT TO WORK THROUGH THIS.

I THINK THAT ONE OF THE THINGS THAT COUNCIL MEMBER KRAMER SAID WAS WE HAVE TO -- AND COUNCIL MEMBER REED SAID IT.

WE HAVE TO ADDRESS SOME OF THE BAD THAT CAME WITH THIS.

WE DIDN'T GET HERE OVERNIGHT JUST LIKE WE ARE NOT GOING TO SOLVE IT OVERNIGHT.

BUT I THINK WE ALWAYS HAVE TO ACKNOWLEDGE AND REMEMBER SOME OF HOW WE GOT HERE AND WE HAVE TO ADDRESS THE POVERTY, WE HAVE TO ADDRESS I THAT NOT EVERY ASPECT OF IT IS WHAT HAPPENED DURING THE SCHOOL DAY.

MOST OF IT IS WHAT HAPPENS OUTSIDE OF THE SCHOOL DAY.

NOW IN ADDITION TO FOOD LET'S TALK ABOUT THE FACT THAT KIDS ARE SLEEPING UNDER BEDS OR BATHTUBS OUT OF FEAR BY BEING SHOT IN THEIR OWN HOME OR THEY HAVE HAD TO STEP OFF BUSES AND WALK OVER BODIES.

AND THOSE HAVE IMPACTS.

WE HAVE READ ABOUT THE ADVERSE CHILDHOOD EXPERIENCES AND HOW THAT IMPACTS THEIR ABILITY TO LEARN.

AND I THINK WE HAVE TO KEEP ALL THOSE IN MIND AND I
THINK ONE THING THAT I HAVE HEARD FROM EVERY SINGLE ONE OF US IS
WE ARE PASSIONATE ABOUT CHILDREN, PASSIONATE ABOUT AND CARE
ABOUT OUR TEACHERS AND WE KNOW THERE IS NOT A SINGLE PERSON
SITTING IN HERE WHO DOESN'T BELIEVE A TEACHER HASN'T HAD AN
IMPACT ON THEIR LIFE AND WE HAVE A LOCALLY ELECTED SCHOOL BOARD.

AND SOME MAY OR MAY NOT AGREE WITH THIS.

BUT WE BELIEVE THAT THE -- I BELIEVE THAT THE LOCALLY ELECTED SCHOOL BOARD SHOULD BE GIVEN AN OPPORTUNITY TO WORK WITH DR. POLLIO AS THE NEW SUPERINTENDENT FOR A PERIOD OF TIME TO GET TO WHERE WE NEED TO BE.

SO WE COULD PROBABLY TALK ALL NIGHT ABOUT HOW WE WANT TO SAY THAT AND WHAT THE WORDS ARE ON PAPER.

THIS IS NOT A BINDING RESOLUTION.

IT IS A STATEMENT OF I GUESS INTENT.

SO SIMILAR TO WHAT SOME OF MY OTHER COLLEAGUES DID EARLIER ON SOME OTHER ORDINANCES, THEY OUT WHAT THEY THOUGHT THE FLAWS WERE.

AND I THINK MY COLLEAGUES ASKED WHETHER THEY THOUGHT SOME OF THE FLAWS WERE AND I WOULD LIKE TO SEE SOME OF THE REASONS WHY WE GOT HERE.

I'M FINE AND THINK WE SHOULD ACKNOWLEDGE WHAT THINGS HAVE ALREADY BEEN IMPROVED, WHAT THINGS NEED TO CONTINUE TO BE IMPROVED, AND TO ACKNOWLEDGE THAT THE TEACHERS LOVE DR. POLLIO AND THEY ARE STANDING BEHIND HIM.

THANK YOU.

>> PRESIDENT JAMES: THANK YOU, COUNCILWOMAN.

COUNCILMAN BENSON.

- >> THANK YOU, MR. PRESIDENT.
- I WAS CONTEMPLATING NOT SPEAKING TONIGHT.
- I DON'T THINK THERE IS ANYTHING MORE IMPORTANT THAN THE KIDS IN MY HEART.

I REMEMBER THE LAST TWO OR THREE YEARS THAT I WAS
TEACHING SCHOOL I HAD SEVERAL STUDENTS WHO COULDN'T READ AND I
POINTED OUT TO THE PRINCIPAL, WE NEED TO GET SOME HELP FOR THESE
YOUNG MEN.

THEY NEED SOME HELP.

WELL, WE CAN'T DO NOTHING ABOUT THAT.

I THOUGHT WE WERE IN EDUCATION?

THEY ARE IN MY CLASS FOR THREE PERIODS.

CAN I GIVE THEM A PERIOD A DAY SO THEY CAN PRACTICE, SOMEBODY CAN WORK ON PHONICS AND TEACH THEM HOW TO READ?

THESE KIDS ARE SHARP.

HOW THEY HAVE GOT BY, I DON'T KNOW.

THEY NEED SOME HELP.

WELL, LET ME TELL YOU WHAT.

IN OUR SCHOOL SYSTEM, THE FINEST TEACHERS IN THE WORLD, IN MY MIND.

AND EVERY TEACHER, THEY WANT TO TEACH.

AND YOU GET IN A CLASSROOM AND YOU GET TWO OR THREE KIDS THAT WANT TO MAKE YOUR LIFE MISERABLE.

DOESN'T MEAN THAT YOU CAN'T TEACH BUT MAYBE YOU CAN'T HANDLE SOME KIDS WHO MISBEHAVE.

WELL, AT THAT POINT SHOULD THOSE KIDS BE SOMEPLACE

ELSE FOR A MOMENT AND NOT JEOPARDIZE THE OTHER STUDENTS AND DEAL

WITH THOSE GUYS OR THOSE -- MOSTLY GUYS, BUT SOME GIRLS -- SOME

OTHER WAY?

WHEN I WAS IN THE VOCATIONAL SCHOOLS, MOST OF THE KIDS
THAT WENT TO VOCATIONAL SCHOOLS AS THEY LABELED THEM WERE
UNDERACHIEVERS AND MISBEHAVED STUDENTS.

AND IN 28 YEARS I DON'T KNOW IF I HAD A BAD STUDENT.

MOST STUDENTS WHO MISBEHAVE, WHAT THEY ARE TELLING YOU IS I LIKE ATTENTION AND THEY WILL TAKE NEGATIVE BECAUSE THEY DON'T GET ANY ATTENTION.

IF SOMEBODY TAKES THE TIME TO SAY, HEY, LISTEN, I CARE ABOUT YOU, AND IF YOU LET ME, I'LL HELP YOU, AND MOST KIDS WOULD.

LIKE I SAID, I PUT OVER 500 KIDS IN JOBS.

AND SO THE TEACHERS REALLY NEED HELP AND THE PROBLEM IS THE SYSTEM.

THE SYSTEM IS A PROBLEM.

AND TO ME ONE OF THE THINGS, AND Y'ALL MIGHT NOT LIKE
THIS, TWO YEARS BEFORE I RETIRED THE PRINCIPAL COMES BY AND SAYS
I WANT TO EVALUATE YOU.

AND I SAW HIS EVALUATION.

AND I SAID YOU ARE WASTING MY TIME.

I DON'T WANT TO BE EVALUATED.

YOU HAVE TO BE EVALUATED.

I SAID, NOPE.

I DON'T WANT TO BE EVALUATED.

AND YOU CAN FIRE ME AND BY THAT TIME I'LL BE RETIRED.

SO HE SAYS -- HE WENT TO MY PARTNER AND SAID -- HE WANTS ME TO GIVE HIM A BAD EVALUATION.

SO MY PARTNER SAYS, HEY, YOU CAN'T DO THAT, HE WILL MAKE OUR LIFE MISERABLE.

I DO MY JOB EVERY DAY.

AND SO WHAT I DID, I WENT TO HIM AND I SAID, OKAY, YOU WANT TO EVALUATE ME, YOU COME IN ANYTIME YOU WANT TO AND SAY I'M HERE TO EVALUATE YOU.

AND SO ABOUT A WEEK LATER HE COMES IN.

I'M HERE TO EVALUATE YOU.

OKAY.

I HAVE GOT 1,000 LESSON PLANS GOING ON.

SO I PICKED EIGHT OR TEN KIDS UP AND TOOK THEM BACK IN THE GRINDER ROOM AND TAUGHT THEM HOW TO RUN A SURFACE GRINDER.

KIDS WERE GREAT.

I HAD GOOD KIDS.

SO I TURNED TO HIM WHEN IT WAS OVER WITH AND I SAID TELL ME WHAT I DID WRONG.

HE SAYS, WHAT DO YOU MEAN?

THAT WAS GREAT.

I SAID I HAVE BEEN TEACHING FOR A LONG TIME.

AND YOU DEVELOP BAD HABITS.

AND YOUR JOB IS TO HELP ME BECOME BETTER.

AND TO ME IF A TEACHER IS HAVING SOME PROBLEMS, YOU ARE SUPPOSED TO BE A NURTURING AT THAT TEACHER AND HELPING THEM OUT INSTEAD OF BADMOUTHING THE PERSON AND RUNNING HIM OFF.

AND I REALLY HATED IT BECAUSE WE GOT A LOT OF PEOPLE. WE GOT 6100 TEACHERS.

NOW HAVE 9,000.

IF IT WAS UP TO ME, THE MOST IMPORTANT, I TELL YOU,
THE ELEMENTARY TEACHERS MORE THAN EVERYBODY.

THAT FIRST FIVE YEARS IS REALLY CRITICAL.

AND I TOLD SOMEBODY THE OTHER DAY THAT AT WEST POINT THEIR CLASS SIZE IS 12.

A PLATOON IN THE ARMY IS 12.

AND THE GREATEST TEACHER THAT EVER LIVED HAD 12.

NOW ALL LEARNING IS ALWAYS ONE ON ONE.

WHETHER IT IS ONE PERSON TALKING TO 500 OR ONE.

THE QUESTION IS, DID THEY GET IT?

AND SO LEARNING IS COMPOUNDED, AND YOU NEED TO BUILD ON IT, YOU HAVE TO MAKE SURE THAT PERSON GOT IT.

AND IF THEY DON'T GET IT, THEY GET FRUSTRATED.

AND THAT CAUSES PEOPLE TO QUIT.

YOU DON'T WANT THEM TO QUIT.

YOU WANT TO PUT YOUR ARM AROUND THEM AND SAY, LISTEN, LET ME SHOW YOU, YOU CAN GET IT.

AND YOU HELP THEM.

AND THAT IS ALL THE KIDS WANT.

THEY WANT SOMEBODY TO HELP.

AND EVERYBODY SAYS IN MY MIND, THE -- IF A PARENT IS NOT HELPING OUT, OKAY, FORGET THEM?

NO.

YOU TAKE THEM AND YOU SAY, HEY, THIS KID'S GOT SOME PROBLEMS.

LET'S IDENTIFY THAT PROBLEM WITH THAT STUDENT.

IT WOULD BE NICE TO GET THE PARENT INVOLVED B. UH WE DON'T TAKE CASUALTIES.

WE DON'T LET THEM GO.

WE MAKE SURE THEY GET AN EDUCATION.

THE LAST SIX YEARS BEFORE I RETIRED I ASKED THE PRINCIPAL, HOW MANY PEOPLE GO TO COLLEGE?

17%.

AND ALL WE DO IS TALK ABOUT COLLEGE?

18%?

I SAID I THINK YOU WOULD HAVE 18% IF YOU DIDN'T SAY NOTHING.

I SAID SO WHAT ABOUT THE 82%?

DO WE CARE ABOUT 82% THAT MAYBE GETS OUT OF SCHOOL AND CAN'T FIND A I DON'T KNOW?

AND THEY FEEL REJECTED BECAUSE THEY CAN'T GET A JOB?

THAT IS WHY TO ME IN 2000 I RAN FOR STATE

REPRESENTATIVE BECAUSE I WANTED TO GO TO FRANKFORT AND GETTEN EDUCATION AND GET MORE MONEY FOR VOCATIONAL EDUCATION.

I DIDN'T WIN.

YOU ARE GLAD I LOST?

>>

[APPLAUSE]

[LAUGHTER]

>> AND MAYBE YOU ARE RIGHT.

GOD PUTS EVERYBODY IN A CERTAIN PLACE TO DO A CERTAIN THING.

SO TO ME, MARTI POLLIO NEED SOME HELP?

DOES THE BOARD OF EDUCATION NEED HELP?

WE ALL NEED HELP.

WE ALL NEED TO SIT DOWN AND SAY LET'S NOT LET ANY KID OR ANY STUDENT -- I SHOULDN'T SAY KID BECAUSE EVERYBODY TELLS ME I DO THAT WRONG.

BUT THEY NEED HELP.

AND WE CAN'T LET ANY OF THEM GO THROUGH THE CRACKS.

AND I AM REALLY SORRY.

AND I KNOW THAT SOMEBODY SAID YOU KNOW WHAT, YOU ARE PUTTING A COFFIN IN YOUR NAIL.

YOU'LL NEVER WIN AN ELECTION AGAIN.

YOU KNOW WHAT?

TO ME, EVERY DAY I TRY TO DO THE RIGHT THING.

AND IF EVERYBODY AGREES WITH ME, THAT IS OKAY.

TO ME I ONLY ANSWER TO ONE PERSON.

AND I'M JUST TRYING TO MAKE HIM HAPPY.

AND SO MAY NEVER WIN AGAIN.

THAT IS OKAY.

TEACH ME?

I HAVE TO DO THE RIGHT THING.

AND TO HELP OUT KIDS I THINK IS REALLY IMPORTANT.

SO I'M SORRY THAT -- I FOE EVERYBODY HERE CARES ABOUT IT.

I HAVE BEEN IN THERE AND WATCHED AND I HAVE BEEN SO FRUSTRATED AND A NUMBER OF PEOPLE SAY -- I SAID WHY ARE WE DOING THIS?

AND I SAID, WELL, YOU JUST DON'T UNDERSTAND.

WHY DON'T YOU PRETEND LIKE YOU ARE IN EDUCATION AND

BECAUSE MAYBE I COULD BE ON YOUR SIDE IF IT REALLY MADE SOME SENSE.

NO, MY WAY OR THE HIGHWAY.

PRINCIPALS ARE THE SHEPHERDS AND ALL TEACHERS ARE SHEEP.

I TELL YOU WHAT, WE HAVE A LOT OF TEACHERS WHO REALLY HAVE GREAT IDEAS AND IF THEY JUST HAD SOME CHANCE TO BE IN DECISIONS, MAKING IT BETTER, NOT ALL TEACHERS ARE THE SAME.

FOR EXAMPLE, I HAVE A FRIEND NAMED BOB REDMOND.

HE CAN TAKE KIDS THAT ARE REALLY MISFITS AND TURN THEM AROUND AND MAKE SOMETHING REALLY POSITIVE.

AND THERE ARE SOME GUYS I KNOW WHO ARE REALLY GOOD IN PHYSICS AND CHEMISTRY BUT NOT REALLY GREAT ON A KID WHO MIGHT BE MISBEHAVING.

SO THE PRINCIPAL CAN KIND OF ASSIGN TEACHERS TO THE RIGHT KIND OF PEOPLE AND MAKE SURE YOU GET A GOOD OUTCOME.

THAT IS WHAT YOU WANT.

YOU WANT EVERYBODY KID TO HAVE A GOOD OUTCOME.

AND THIS ONE IS THE SECRET OF EDUCATION.

AND ANYWAY, THANKS FOR LISTENING.

>> PRESIDENT JAMES: THANK YOU, COUNCILMAN.

COUNCILMAN ACKERSON.

>> THANK YOU, MR. PRESIDENT.

SO MANY WORDS TONIGHT, GUYS IT IS JUST GETTING CONFUSING AS HECK.

THE REALITY IS THIS IS SO SIMPLE AND IT SEEMS LIKE WE ARE -- I HAVE BEEN LISTENING.

IT SEEMS LIKE WE ARE ALL ON THE SAME PAGE.

THE QUESTION IS REALLY THIS.

DO WE WANT A STATE TAKEOVER OR DO WE WANT TO LET THE SYSTEM STAY AS IS AND LET IT PLAY OUT?

WHEN WE START THROWING IN THE I'M FOR IT FOR THIS
REASON AND I'M ANTIBEVIN OR ANTITYRANNY OR PROWHEELS FOR KIDS OR
PRO THIS, THAT IS WHERE IT IS GETTING COMPLICATED AND LOSING
EACH OTHER.

THIS IS REAL SIMPLE.

WE DON'T HAVE CONTROL.

TO COUNCILMAN KRAMER'S POINT, I HOPE YOU'LL CONSIDER THIS.

MUCH LIKE THE CONSTITUENTS E-MAIL US.

THIS IS AN E-MAIL TO FRANKFORT BASED UPON OUR REPRESENTATION.

IT IS GOING TO GO INTO SECTION FIVE, TO THE GOVERNOR AND EACH MEMBER OF THE KENTUCKY BOARD OF EDUCATION.

THIS IS JUST US EXPRESSING OUR VOICE.

WE DON'T WANT YOU TO DO THIS.

THE REASONS WHY EACH ONE OF US MIGHT DIFFER IS WHAT IS CAUSING THE PROBLEMS HERE TONIGHT.

SOME OF US MIGHT NOT BE HAPPY WITH THE SYSTEM.

MIGHT SAY I'M NOT HAPPY WITH JCPS BUT I'M ANTITAKING AWAY THE VOTE OF CONTROL.

THAT IS ONE REASON.

LET'S NOT GET CONFUSED OVER PERSON A HAS REASON ONE AND PERSON B HAD REASON TWO.

WE ARE ALL ON THE SAME PAGE.

WE DO NOT CONCUR OR GROW WITH A STATE TAKEOVER.

LET'S KEEP IT SIMPLE.

LET'S NOT GET LOST IN THE REASONS WHY OR GET MAD AT EACH OTHER FOR THE REASONS WHY.

LET'S ACCEPT THE FACT THAT WE CAN ALL AGREE UPON THE SAME CONCLUSION NO MATTER HOW WE GET THERE.

I HAVE NOT HEARD ONE PERSON SAY THEY ARE IN FAVOR OF THE STATE TAKEOVER.

WE COULD BE OUT OF HERE IF WE STAY ON THAT PAGE.

AND PLEASE PUT ME DOWN AS A SPONSOR.

>> PRESIDENT JAMES: THANK YOU, COUNCIL MEMBER.

COUNCILMAN BLACKWELL.

>> THANK YOU, MR. PRESIDENT I WAS JUST GOING TO POINT OUT, KEEPING IT SIMPLE, THAT THE BOARD OF EDUCATION HAS NOT MADE THE DECISION YET EITHER.

SO IT IS ENTIRELY APPROPRIATE FOR US TO PASS SOMETHING TODAY TO SAY TO THE BOARD OF EDUCATION WHO ARE CLAIMING PUBLICLY THAT THEY HAVE NOT MADE A DECISION YET, HERE IS OUR INPUT FROM THE PEOPLE IN LOUISVILLE.

HERE SOUR INPUT.

FROM THE PEOPLE THIS IS GOING TO AFFECT THE MOST, HERE IS OUR OUTPUT.

THANK YOU.

>> PRESIDENT JAMES: THANK YOU, COUNCILMAN.

AND COUNCILMAN KRAMER.

>> MINE IS MORE OF AN EXPLANATION ON MY VOTE.

I FIND MYSELF IN THESE DEBATES ALL TOO FREQUENTLY AND THIS IS AT LEAST THE THIRD TIME BY MY ACCOUNT THAT I HAVE FELT STRONGLY TOWARDS WHAT THE REQUESTING WAS EGG FOR, ALTHOUGH I DIDN'T BELIEVE IT WAS THE RIGHT APPROACH FOR US.

I FIND MYSELF VOTING NO FOR THINGS THAT I WISH WE WOULD DO.

SO I DON'T KNOW IF IT MAKES A HUGE DIFFERENCE GOING FORWARD.

IT DOES FOR ME.

AT THIS POINT GOING FORWARD I DON'T WANT TO WANT VOTE

NO AGAINST THINGS THAT I AGREE WITH EVEN IF I DISAGREE WITH THE

E-MAIL THAT WE ARE SENDING.

I DON'T THINK THE LANGUAGE IN THE E-MAIL IS THE PROPER LANGUAGE.

IT SEEMS LIKE IT IS AND I CAN'T GET BEHIND IT.

BUT THE SAME TOKEN, I AGREE THAT A TAKEOVER IS A BAD IDEA.

FROM THIS POINT FORWARD I THINK WHAT YOU WILL HEAR ME
DO IS RAIL AGAINST US TELLING OTHER PEOPLE HOW THEY WILL DO
THEIR I DON'T KNOW AND VOTE PRESENT AND THAT WAY I DON'T HAVE TO
VOTE NO FOR THEY THINK SO THAT I THINK WILL BE ACTUALLY GOOD.

>> PRESIDENT JAMES: THANK YOU, COUNCILMAN.

COUNCIL MEMBER DENTON.

>> I THINK YOU KNOW MY THOUGHTS WITH REGARD TO SENDING A RESOLUTION TO FRANKFORT.

I DON'T THINK IT DOES ANY GOOD.

IT IS A SYMBOLISM OVER SUBSTANCE.

AND I AGREE WITH COUNCIL MEMBER KRAMER.

I DON'T THINK ANYBODY IS SAYING, OH, WE CAN'T WAIT FOR THE STATE TO COME IN AND TAKE US OVER.

IN AN IDEAL SITUATION, NOBODY WANTS THAT.

AT THE SAME TIME WE DON'T KNOW WHAT ALL ARE THE ISSUES ARE.

WE ONLY KNOW SOME OF THE ISSUES.

AND I KNOW I'M NOT AN EXPERT ON THIS.

BUT IT DOESN'T REALLY MATTER AT THE END OF THE DAY WHAT WE DO HERE.

SO THAT IS WHY I AM JUST GOING TO VOTE PRESENT BECAUSE
IT IS GOING TO IMPACT ANYTHING AND WE HAVE SPENT I DON'T KNOW
HOW MUCH TIME SO FAR THIS EVENING TALKING ABOUT IT.

AND THE FOLKS THAT THIS IS GOING TO GO TO ARE GOING TO GO, OH, AND THEN IT WILL GO TO THE CIRCULAR FILE.

I JUST DON'T THINK IT WILL HAVE AN IMPACT.

THIS ISN'T OUR LANE.

>> PRESIDENT JAMES: THANK YOU, COUNCILWOMAN.

COUNCILWOMAN HAMILTON.

>> THANK YOU, MR. PRESIDENT.

IT IS OBVIOUS AFTER THIS SESSION TONIGHT THAT EDUCATION IS AN ISSUE WE ALL FEEL PASSIONATELY ABOUT.

ESPECIALLY PUBLIC EDUCATION, WHICH IS A RIGHT FOR ALL OF OUR CHILDREN AND OUR FAMILIES.

AND I AM SCARED, FRANKLY, IT IS LOSING LOCAL CONTROL.

ESPECIALLY IN THE WAY THE STATE BOARD WAS CHANGED AND APPOINTED.

I DON'T HAVE ANY CONFIDENCE IN THAT, WHAT IS THE ULTERIOR MOTIVE?

WE LOSE OUR LOCAL CONTROL.

THERE IS A GAME PLAN THAT WE DON'T KNOW.

WE HAVE ALREADY GOT THE START OF SCHOOLS WAITING IN THE SHADOW THERE.

SO I THINK WE HAVE TO SUPPORT OUR SUPERINTENDENT,
SCHOOL BOARD, TEACHERS, UNIONS, AND OUR PEOPLE WHO ARE WORKING
EVERY DAY WITH OUR CHILDREN TO GIVE US A BETTER OUTCOME IN THIS
COMMUNITY.

WE HAVE BEEN THROUGH A LOT OF SUPERINTENDENTS OVER THE YEARS.

AND I LOOK AT JCPS AND IT IS A HUGE INSTITUTION.

I MEAN, IN THE STATE.

IT IS LIKE TRYING TO STEER A BIG CRUISE SHIP, SOMETHING BIGGER THAN THAT.

IT IS TAKING A LOT.

BUT I HAVE THE CONFIDENCE IN CHAIR PORTER, DR. POLLIO
AND THE OTHER SIX MEMBERS OF THE BOARD THAT THEY ARE ON THE
RIGHT TRACK AND THEY WOULD DO THE RIGHT THING FOR THIS
COMMUNITY.

ALL WE NEED IS THE STATE ASSISTANCE.

BUT WE DO NOT NEED A TAKEOVER.

AND, MR. CLERK, CAN I ASK HOW MUCH TIME IS LEFT?
25 MINUTES.

- >> PRESIDENT JAMES: THANK YOU.
- >> WE HAVE BEEN AN HOUR.
- >> PRESIDENT JAMES: THANK YOU, COUNCILWOMAN.

COUNCILWOMAN PARKER.

>> THANK YOU.

I REALLY WASN'T GOING TO SAY ANYTHING BECAUSE LIKE SOME OF US HERE WE DON'T REALLY KNOW WHAT THE STATE IS GOING TO DO, WHAT JCPS IS GOING TO DO.

WE JUST REALLY KNOW AND I'M NOT SURE HOW MUCH IS WITHIN OUR REALM.

BUT I WILL SAY THAT IT WAS ABOUT FOUR YEARS AGO WHEN
THE STATE IDENTIFIED A LOT OF PROBLEMS AND THEY CAME BACK TO
LOUISVILLE AND THEY SAID LOUISVILLE IS ONE OF THE FOUR PLACES IN
THE STATE THAT WE ARE GOING TO ALLOW SCHOOLS OF INNOVATION AND I
ACCEPTED THAT CHALLENGE AND I WORKED FOR A SOLID MONTH IN
JANUARY TRYING TO DESIGN A SCHOOL OF INNOVATION.

WHILE WE ARE STILL ON THE SUBJECT I JUST WANTED OH TO ACKNOWLEDGE AND RECOGNIZE SOMEBODY EARLIER.

I WANTED TO RECOGNIZE SUE FOSTER FOR BEING HERE IN THE AUDIENCE AND SAY THANK YOU FOR BEING HERE.

COUNCILWOMAN WOOLRIDGE.

>> THANK YOU, MR. PRESIDENT.

THIS RESOLUTION FOR THE MOST PART AND IT HAS BEEN SAID OVER AND OVER AND OVER, JCPS NEEDS TO KEEP LOCAL CONTROL.

AND I'M GOING TO GO BACK TO THE OTHER EARLIER CONVERSATION ABOUT GOVERNMENT OVERREACH.

NOW YOU COME IN AND YOU TAKE OVER THE SCHOOL SYSTEM, WHAT IS NEXT?

COME IN AND TAKE OVER THE METRO COUNCIL?

COME AND RUN THIS CITY?

THAT IS WHAT WE OUGHT TO BE THINKING ABOUT.

YOU JUST TAKE OVER A LITTLE AT A TIME.

TAKE OVER THE SCHOOL BOARD AND NEXT THING WE KNOW WE WILL TAKE OVER THE CITY.

WE WILL RUNNING METRO GOVERNMENT.

AGAIN, GOVERNMENT OVERREACH.

>> PRESIDENT JAMES: THANK YOU.

COUNCIL MEMBER HOLLANDER.

>> I THINK I'M THE LAST PERSON IN THE QUEUE AND I WILL BE VERY BRIEF.

I HOPE EVERYONE IN THIS COMMUNITY TAKES A POSITION ON THIS.

I THINK IT IS ONE OF THE MOST IMPORTANT ISSUES THAT
THE COMMUNITY HAS FACED IN THE YEARS THAT I HAVE LIVED AND THAT
HAS BEEN OVER 30 YEARS.

AND I HOPE EVERYBODY STEPS UP AND I HOPE PEOPLE GET
OUT OF WHAT THEY THINK THEIR LANE IS AND I'M HAPPY TO SEE

BECAUSE WE GAVE PEOPLE A CHANCE TO STEP UP.

AND IN THAT RESOLUTION IT SAID THE KINDS OF THINGS ABOUT KEEPING LOCAL CONTROL.

THAT RESOLUTION FAILED.

SO AGAIN, I JUST DON'T BELIEVE THAT ATTACKING THE VERY PEOPLE THAT YOU ARE TRYING TO [MOVIE]S THE NEEDLE VERY FAR.

I WOULD LOVE FOR US TO HAVE INCLUDED LANGUAGE THAT

SAID WHILE MANY CHALLENGES REMAIN TO WORK FOR, COLLABORATION

BETWEEN THE CURRENT JCPS LEADERSHIP TEAM AND THE KENTUCKY BOARD

OF EDUCATION, THE ENTIRE JEFFERSON COUNTY DELEGATION, THAT GIVES

VOICE TO THE VERY STATE LEGISLATORS THAT KEEP BEING BROUGHT UP

AGAIN AND AGAIN WHO HAVEN'T HAD ANYONE'S SUPPORT AND SAYING,

HEY, YOU SHOULD BE AT THE TABLE.

SO AGAIN, I HOPE NO ONE INTERPRETS BECAUSE I DON'T
THINK COUNCIL MEMBER HOLLANDER MEANT THEY WOULD, BUT I HOPE THAT
NO ONE INTERPRETS MY PRESENT VOTE AS NOT BEING ABLE TO TAKE A
POSITION.

- I JUST CAN'T GET BEHIND THIS SPECIFIC LANGUAGE.
- I DISAGREE WITH SOME OF IT.
- I THINK IF WE HAD 18-PLUS VOTES ON A RESOLUTION THAT DOES SAY SOMETHING IN FRANKFORT.

IT DOES.

I THINK THAT WHEN WE ARE SPLINTERED IT SAYS SOMETHING IN FRANKFORT TOO.

I DO HOPE THAT IF ANYBODY IN FRANKFORT IS PAYING ATTENTION TO THIS THAT AT LEAST THEY ARE LISTENING TO THE CONVERSATION TOO.

IT IS NOT JUST ABOUT WHAT ENDED UP ON PAPER.

BUT THERE IS A VERY STRONG SENSE IN THIS COMMUNITY
THAT THE PROBLEMS ARE REAL, THE PROBLEMS ARE TEEN, AND THAT
SOMEONE FROM OUTSIDE ISN'T GOING TO SOLVE THE PROBLEM BY

AND COUNCIL MEMBER ACKERSON.

>> THE THREE PRESENT VOTE, I'LL MAKE A PLEA.

COUNCIL MEMBER KRAMER, IF THAT IS THE PARAGRAPH THAT GETS YOU ON BOARD, I WOULD SUPPORT ADDING THAT PARAGRAPH IF YOU MAKE IT A MOTION.

I THINK IT IS IMPORTANT WE SPEAK AS REPUBLICANS AND

DEMOCRATS AS A COMMUNITY, AS A WHOLE IN SAYING, AND EVEN IF YOU

WANTED TO INCLUDE A DIFFERENT PARAGRAPH, SOME OF US MAY NOT

AGREE WITH ALL THE LANGUAGE IN HERE BUT WE AGREE UPON THE

AND TO MY COLLEAGUE COUNCIL MEMBER PARKER, AGAIN, LOOKING FOR REASONS WHY YOU MAY NOT AGREE WIT ALL, YOU DON'T KNOW HOW IT IS GOING TO PLAY OUT.

THIS IS OUR CHANCE TO EXPRESS LET'S LET IT PLAY OUT.

IT CAN ALWAYS CHANGE IN THE FUTURE.

I THINK ALL OF US HERE TODAY, REPUBLICANS, DEMOCRATS
ALIKE, I THINK IT NEEDS TO BE A EWE NIGHTED UNITED VOICE.

WE ALL HAVE DIFFERENT REASONS.

LET'S KEEP IT SIMPLE AND JUST SAY LET IT PLAY OUT AS IS NOW VERSUS LOSING LOCAL CONTROL.

SO I WOULD URGE THE PRESENT VOTES TO PLEASE BEND ON THIS ONE BECAUSE IT IS THAT IMPORTANT.

THANK YOU.

>> -- -- IF YOU ARE GOING TO GET ATTACKED, YOU WILL GET ATTACKED.

AND IF YOU WOKE IT INADVERTENTLY IT IS JUST AS ANGRY.

SO THE LANGUAGE PROPOSED BY COUNCIL MEMBER REED WAS AN ATTEMPT TO TAKE OUT ANYTHING THAT WOULD INSTANTLY PERCEIVED AS A POKE AT THE BEAR.

SO YOU WERE LEFT WITH A RESOLUTION THAT RECOGNIZES

THAT THERE IS A PROBLEM, THAT ASKS VERY SPECIFICALLY FOR A

RESOLUTION TO THE PROBLEM WITHOUT TELLING PEOPLE WHAT IT SHOULD

BE.

WE ARE NOT HAPPY WHERE IT IS GOING, WE WANT YOU TO TALK ABOUT IT, DON'T SHOVE IT DOWN OUR THROATS.

WAS SAYING OFFER THAT AS AN AMENDMENT.

>> MR. PRESIDENT, SEEING NO ONE IN THE QUEUE, YOU WANT TO GO AHEAD AND CALL FOR THE VOTE?

>> PRESIDENT JAMES: I WAS GIVING COUNCILMAN KRAMER AN OPPORTUNITY TO RESPOND TO COUNCILMAN ACKERSON.

BUT I ALSO POINTED OUT THAT -- AND THAT WAS THE REASON FOR MY LONG DIATRIBE.

I JUST DON'T THINK THAT BEING DELIBERATELY PROVOCATIVE MOVES US IN A DIRECTION THAT WE WANT TO GO.

>> PRESIDENT JAMES: WE HAVE NO FURTHER SPEAKERS IN THE QUEUE AND WE HAVE 12 MINUTES LEFT.

I WOULD SUGGEST WE ELIMINATE THE 12 MINUTES BY VOTING.
