## SUMMARY OF NEIGHBORHOOD MEETING 2070 SOUTH PRESTON STREET ZONING CHANGE HELD ON MAY 8, 2018

On Tuesday, May 8, 2018, at 6:30 p.m. Wettig Properties, LLC (the "Applicant") hosted a Neighborhood Meeting to explain the proposal for a Zoning Change on the property located at 2070 South Preston Street. The meeting was held at the house located at 2069 South Preston Street.

There were approximately 8 guests in attendance.

Those present on behalf of the applicant included: Glenn Price, Frost Brown Todd LLC Jonas Wilson, Frost Brown Todd LLC Antz & Jon Wettig, Wettig Properties, LLC Chris Brown, BTM Engineering, Inc. Ted Bressoud, Bressoud Architecture, Inc.

Glenn Price introduced the proposal. Mr. Price briefly discussed the zoning process, the location, and the members involved. Chris Brown then gave details about both the development plan and the Conditional Use Permit on the related parking lot. Antz Wettig explained that much of the impetus for the project came from discussions with neighbors wanting a laundromat in the area.

- Q: Are there any similar concepts in town?
- A: No. There is something similar in Brooklyn, but not in this region.
- Q: What hours do you expect to be open?
- A: We are currently considering opening at 8 am and closing around midnight on weekdays and possibly later on weekends.
  - Q: Will there be live music?
  - A: No.
  - Q: Will any part the building be preserved?
  - A: No. There is very little of the building that is salvageable.
  - Q: Will there be any food service?
  - A: No.
  - Q: When do you hope to open?
  - A: Hopefully by the end of the year.

- Q: Is there any proposed landscaping?
- A: Not other than the existing street trees.
- Q: Will this proposal be competitive in pricing with the laundry down the street?
- A: Yes, we expect to have similar pricing structures, but also expect to have a different clientele. The existing laundromat is smaller and has limited hours.
- Q: Do you have enough parking?
- A: Yes, we are meeting the parking requirements. The parking lot, with the street parking, allows the proposal to meet the requirements.
- Q: What is proposed in the second floor?
- A: Arcade machines.
- Q: Is there any residential included in the proposal?
- A: No.

Several members of the audience expressed excitement for the project. Glenn Price thanked everyone for coming.
