Speed bumps have got to be an option. Last count, with the new family that just moved in, we have 20 kids younger than 5 on our street now. People do not care and drive through that street because it is a natural cut through. Even in more depressed areas I've been in have speed bumps. We are in the upper highlands area code 40205 and it seems we can't care about these kids. That person will be me, I have, since our last correspondence been looking all around this city at similar, and even quite a bit more scenarios that are even less dangerous, and there are speed bumps in narrow roads - it makes me cringe to see our district not care about a glaring problem.

So, even though I now have a joint DoD/VA research job, my background is in politics, i know what works in the long run and it is a sad option. saying that I know it has to be me bugging the crap out of someone which is a pain and not to my liking. But i have to start an email chain and start showing up to whatever gatherings i can so that I can create a trail of correspondence - and when something happens to one of these kids that are constantly outside playing or naturally walking to lakeside (especially as they get older), and mind you something is going to happen because the environment of the families have changed, but the abuse of the street as a cut through speedway has not - then, and hopefully it's not mine, that family will be afforded this email chain and all the attempts I will make henceforth to use as leverage to get whatever compensation they can.

I'd really not like to be seen as an annoyance, but this street is a danger zone and someone has to care about these kids it is getting out of hand. Now the beer truck that supplies kern's korner is cutting through our street and just flies through it, a Semi-truck... People I meet everywhere refer to it as there "cut through street" - and who wouldn't? you can bypass the light and just race down our street.

I'm not going to give up on this, it's going to suck for me but it's no longer my life, it belongs to my children.

I hope you do not take some of my words as a personal threat, I am merely pushing up against an out dated and unnecessary ordinance, we are all going mad on this street. we all thought we were moving into a respectable nice neighborhood that didn't involve a drag strip. So I say this with all sincerity and truthfulness, not meaning any hostility: get used to me Sir. In all practicality,in this situation for this street, there should most definitely be speed bumps.

I live on lakeside drive, the side with kern's korner bar on it. We have people use our street as a cut through all the time, everyday, and they speed almost all of the time. there is also a bar and a pizza delivery place (domino's) on our street (as well as one right around the corner - Jets) - not to mention the dangerous situations that arise from the amount of traffic on our street due to lakeside. we now have a large amount of young children on this street as it has turned over to younger couples, literally kids everywhere that are outside a large majority of the time. This is a very dangerous situation. We do not have speed bumps due to the length of our street, which really seems like an inconvenient law considering all of the factors on our street. We are all terrified of what will eventually happen. all of us have had more than a few altercations with drivers - it is stressful and aggravating, not to mention a great weight of worry for what might happen in the future. Please help me out with how to address th situation, we need speed bumps, and more visible speed limit signs, not to mention children at play signs. I work for the government and i have a job that affords me to work at home, so i have the ability to keep up with this and really give the time to see it through for our street. It seems a shame to continually put our kids in danger because of a law initiated by a previous councilman due to his love for biking - this does not seem more important than our kid's safety.
