I hope you are doing well. The South Central Neighborhood Place Community Council and PAL Coalition youth are in the final stages of developing a teen drug card made for teens and created by teens. The goal is to give them out to teens so they can give them out to other teens who are struggling with drugs or have loved ones struggling with drugs. We want to roll it out at the Wahlberg Foundation Drug Summit in October and also at Iroquois, with hopes of reaching as many high schools as we can.

We are looking for funding to help with printing and are wondering if you all have any ability to help us or know of others who can. The media contact at Family and Children's Place is working on polishing it up and coming up with another option for design. Then we'll take it to the youth and the Council for final adjustments. We are very excited about the work the teens have put into creating this!
