

My Name is Andrew Hennessy, and I would like to encourage you and the Louisville Metro Council to pass our recent ~~new~~ resolution to commit to the process of transferring to 100 percent renewable energy.

The Jane Goodall Institute's Tchimpounga Chimpanzee Rehabilitation Center serves as a refuge in the Congo Basin for chimpanzees orphaned by bushmeat hunters and sold into the cruel exotic pet trade.

Authorities confiscate these young chimpanzees from poachers and people who have purchased them illegally as exotic pets. Many are suffering from serious physical and mental trauma when they arrive at Tchimpounga. Excellent veterinary care, socialization with other chimps, and enrichment activities such as art therapy help these wounded chimpanzees heal.

As the largest chimpanzee sanctuary in Africa, Tchimpounga is home to more than 150 chimpanzees who are free to explore and play in their new home alongside other chimpanzees just like them.
