#### Request(s)

- Change in zoning from R-4 to R-6 on 16.94 acres (C-1 portion of property is not changing)
- Alternate Plan for access from the existing stub streets (Cedar Brook Drive & Red Cedar Way)
- Variance from Chapter 5.4.2.A.4 to permit the multifamily structures to be located closer than 50' to abutting single family residences
- District Development Plan with Binding Elements



#### Case Summary

- 260 multi-family units on 16.94 acre portion of the site (15.58 du/ac)
- 26 total buildings (13 3-story buildings and 13 2story buildings)
- 485 parking spaces
- No distinguishable natural features around the area to be developed
- Existing C-1 to remain (1.15 acre)
- "Park N' Ride" parking lot proposed in existing C-1



#### Neighborhood Plan

- Highview Neighborhood Plan
  - Existing areas with a cluster of commercial uses have been identified as future Neighborhood Nodes as seen in Figure 3.4. These nodes are the preferred location for future medium to high density development.







#### Public Meetings

- Neighborhood Meeting on 8/3/2016 and 11/30/2016
  - Conducted by the applicant, 65 people attended the 8/3 meeting, 48 people attended the 11/30 meeting
- LD&T meetings on 5/31, 6/14, 7/12 and 7/26/2018
- Planning Commission public hearing on 10/9/2018
  - 16 people spoke in opposition.
  - The Commission recommended approval of the change in zoning from R-4 to R-6 with a vote of 5-2 (three members were not present). The Commission also recommended approval of the Alternative Connection Plan with a vote of 6-1 (three members were not present).
