

Good Afternoon Jeff-

Please find attached the cost estimate for the planting of Furman Blvd islands. Have you or CM Ackerson spoken to the Highgate Springs NA if they have a design concept for this island. There has been several plantings in the island that the Division has not been contacted about and I'd like to make sure that we are working in cohesion with them on this plan. If you have a contact, I'd love to discuss this with them if council is going to go through with funding the project.

If council appropriates funds, the Division will accept them and schedule the work to be performed by the contractor. The Division is unable to schedule the work prior to receiving funds. Depending on the time funds are received, available nursery stock, and the planting season (normally November to April) the trees may not be planted until Fall of 2019.
