What the budget cuts would mean for Neighborhood Place

Possible closure of 6 Neighborhood Place sites over
the next 3 years. 2 being closed as soon as July 2019

Elimination of 14 staff position in 2019
with more in the following years

Fractures partnerships with NP partners
such as JCPS, Cabinet for Community
Based Services and Centerstone

Limits access for basic human services
such as food, health, housing assistance,
and child care subsidies.

Weakens our National Model
recognition

Reduces leverage in maximizing
family services

Unequal access across Louisville to
social service programs and resources

Increase demand of service and
added pressure at the sites left open
due to high demand

85 % of clients surveyed indicated that if it weren't for
their Neighborhood Place, they would not know what to
do to receive services.
