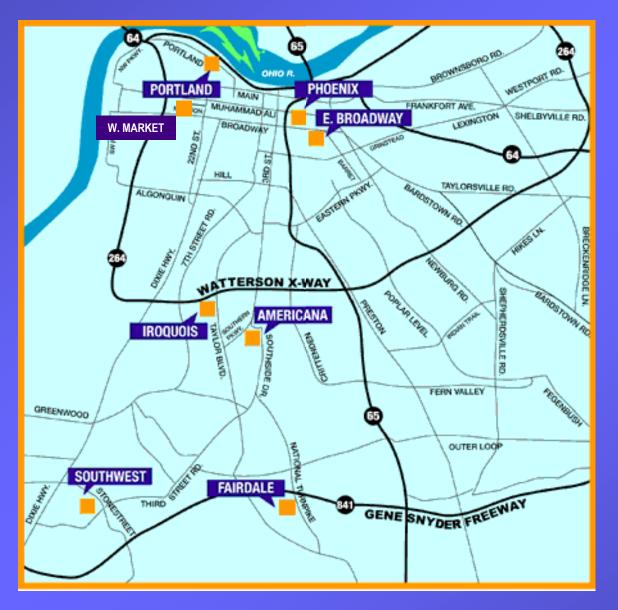


## **FHC** Mission

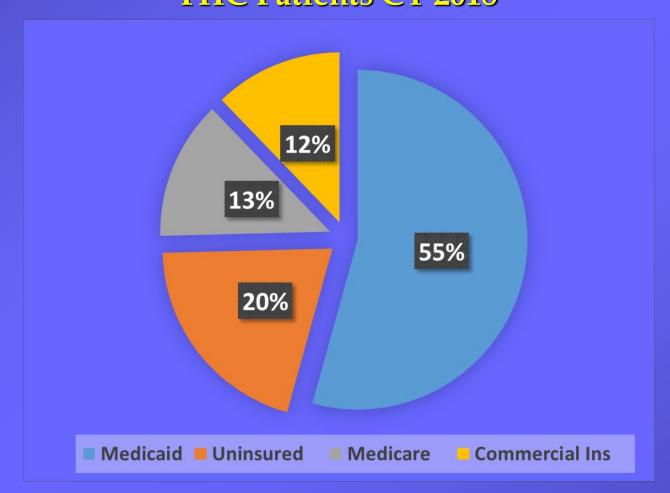

# FY 20 FHC Budget Request

- Public Health and Wellness Budget
  - External Agency Contractual Services
  - Direct Appropriation to FHC, Inc.
- Mayor's Recommended Level
  - \$786,900
  - No change from Authorized FY 19 Level
  - Metro Appropriation equals 2% of FHC revenues

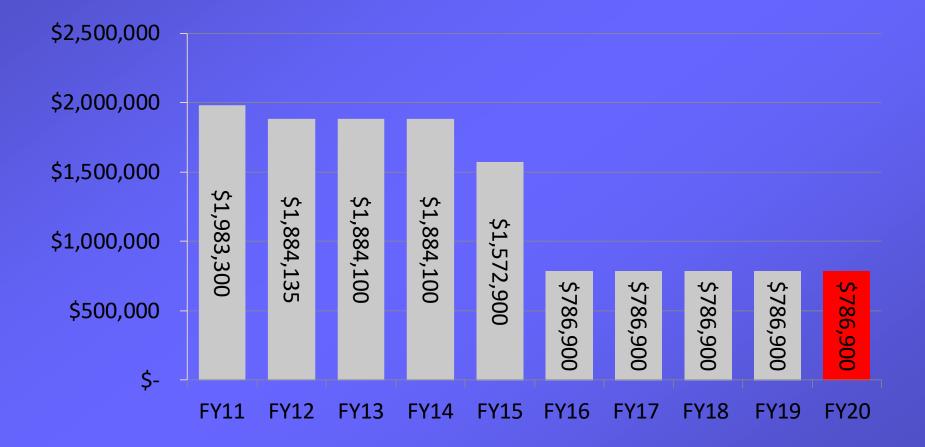
## FY 20 Expense Highlights

- Personnel Costs (70%)
  - 376+ FTE Employees on FHC Payroll
  - Louisville Civil Service/non-union
  - No COLA Proposed for FY 20
  - Fringe Benefits 45%
  - CERS Participating Agency (CERS +12%)
- Capital Improvements \$250,000
  - IS Upgrades and Enhancements

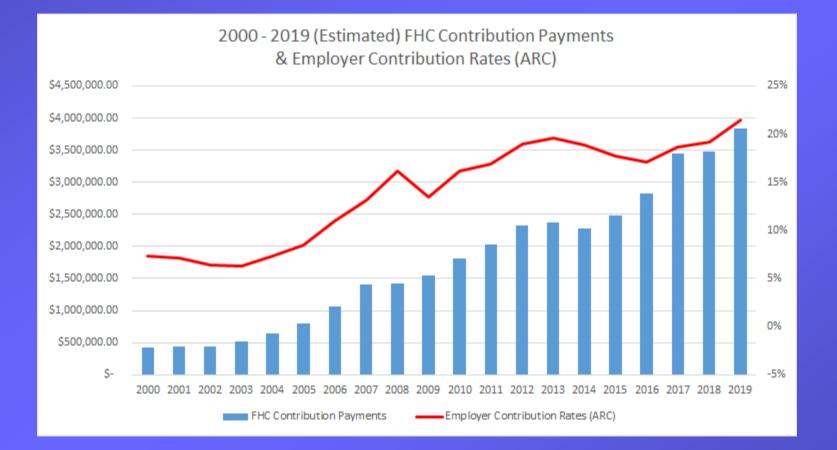

- Uninsured and below 138% Federal Poverty Level (2019)

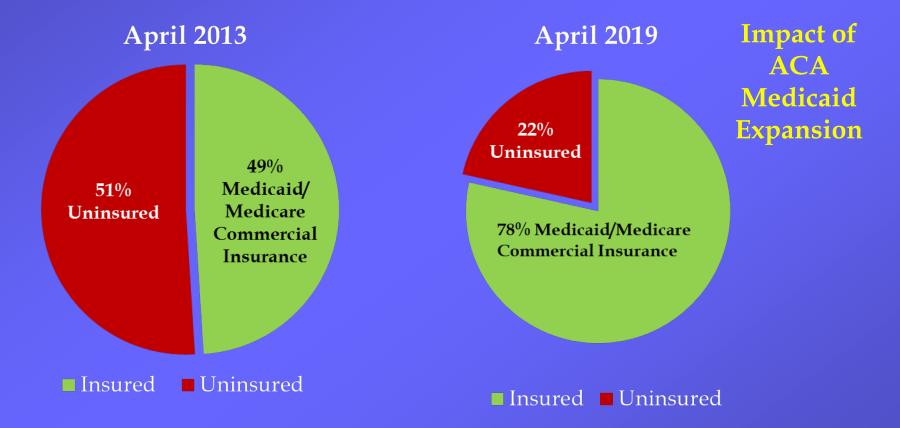

## Increased Medicaid Revenues under ACA

- Reduced Uncompensated Care at FHC
- Eliminated Operating Deficit in FYE 13
- Increase Patients and Visits
- Increase Scope of Services
- Added location West Market
- Expanded Phoenix pharmacy services for health care for the homeless
- Fund COLA and Market Salary Increases for Recruitment and Retention of staff
- Fund Needed Capital Improvements
- Reduced Metro Appropriation \$1.1 million annually

## **Medicaid Changes Ahead**

- Kentucky HEALTH Waiver
- Decline in Medicaid Enrollment
- Passport Health Plan Transition

# Kentucky HEALTH Waiver

- 1115 Waiver Approved by CMS
  - Work/Community Engagement, Premiums, My Rewards Accounts etc.
- Lawsuit in DC District Court
  - Implementation Halted on April 1
- Appeal in DC Circuit Court
  - Oral Arguments in Fall 2019
  - Likely Supreme Court Case
  - Governor Bevin Executive Order
  - Outcome Unknown

Medicaid Enrollment Declines (Jan. 2018 - Apr. 2019)

- Kentucky
  - 60,000 Persons lost Medicaid (-4%)
- Jefferson County
  - 8,670 Persons lost Medicaid (-4%)
- Incomes Higher than Limits
- Failure to Provide Information
- FHC Medicaid Percentage dropped from 55% to 52%

# Passport Health Plan

- Financial Difficulties from DMS rate Reductions
- Bring cost in line with Revenues
  - Provider Re-Contracting
  - Elimination of PMPM Capitation Payment to FHC (\$3 mil annually)
- Expanded Partnership with Evolent
  - Sale of 70% ownership

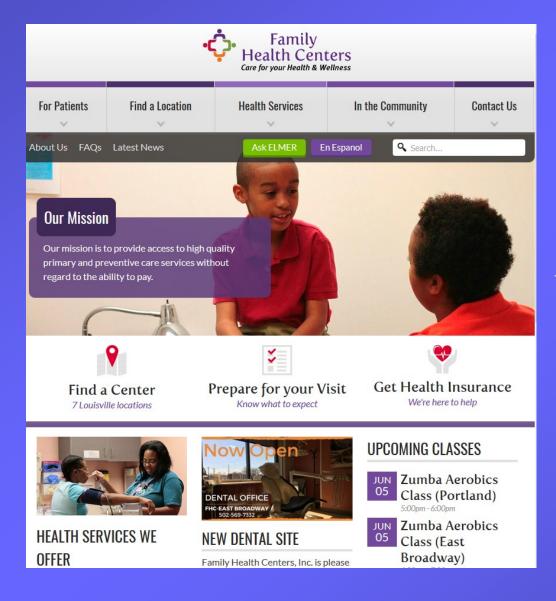

# FHC Budget Balancing Strategies

- Increase Third Party Revenues
  - Renegotiate Contracts
  - Increase billable services
  - Earn Value-Based Contracting Incentives
- Increase Grant Support
- Improve Efficiencies
- Reduce Costs
