VISION

At Bridge Kids International we begin with culture. We have a deep and abiding belief that for people of African heritage, our culture is our strength. It links us to our past, binds us together in the present and guides us toward our future. Recalling and reactivating our own wisdom, values and ways of being gives us the tools to reclaim our lives, each other and our communities and thrive with our souls intact. At Bridge Kids International we gather Africans and the African Diaspora in support of young people from birth to young adulthood. Rooted in culture and acting collectively, we work to protect and nurture young people, empower young families, and promote self-determination. We facilitate and accelerate the ascendance of children, youth and young adults, helping them develop creative confidence and positive ethnic/racial/cultural/gender identities, giving them opportunities to take responsibility, and supporting them as they put their ideas into action.
