Thanks for committing these dollars for the cameras at these two parks. This will go a long way to not only protecting the restrooms but hopefully making it easier to provide clean facilities for the park users.

Loop in Jason Canuel from LPR going forward on all correspondence regarding funds. Once the funds are in place at LPR, I will initiate the installation process. I will instruct Security Pros to issue separate invoices for each Park covering the costs of the cameras and then separate invoices for each park covering the monitoring costs for one full year.

Hi Layla and Brandon,

I meet with Jordan Cole of Security Pros concerning adding cameras at both Willow Park and Tyler Park restrooms. In the case of Tyler we could also monitor the playground/sprayground. In summary, here is the total capital outlay to get us up and running:

1. Tyler - \$4814.61

This price includes two cameras mounted on the corners of the restroom. One would capture the playground/spraygound area and the other the restroom area. This price also includes the first months monitoring costs (\$252.50) and procare service (\$39.20). Going forward after installation, we would be liable for \$291.70 every month for Tyler. The procare service from Security Pros gives us full service and tech help on all the equipment at no extra charge. We have this on all of our current restroom contracts and it is definitely worth the cost. For example, if we need to have them download footage from a camera and review it they will at no charge.

2. Willow - \$4573.26

This price also includes two cameras which was necessary to get both sides of the building. The two sets of restrooms are on opposite sides of the building. We can also monitor the playground with one of the cameras. As with Tyler, this price includes all equipment costs and the first months monitoring fee (\$252.50) and procare service (\$35.16). Our monthly fees for Willow would be \$287.66.

We definitely need two cameras at Willow because of the restroom layout. We could use just one camera at Tyler to monitor the restroom but that only reduces the cost by \$813. The monthly monitoring fee is the same regardless if we have one or two cameras.

As a reminder, the Virtual monitoring only protects our assets when the parks are supposed to be closed. The only way the system helps during park hours would be capturing any nefarious activity on camera and then it would have to be reviewed after the fact. Prevention is our best solution to vandalism.
