Dear Mr. Canuel:

Luckett & Farley is excited to submit a proposal for envisioning and schematic plans for a planned pavilion at Farnsley Park in the Bon Air and Highgate Springs Neighborhood in Louisville, Kentucky.

As you explained Tuesday morning during our on-site meeting, Farnsley Park is a pleasant neighborhood park. It has a full-size soccer field, partially fenced playground, tennis court, spray ground, covered pavilion, and restrooms. It is located in an enjoyable natural setting with a creek, large stands of oak trees, and good open space.

The Louisville Parks and Recreation mission is to connect people to places and opportunities that support and grow a sustainable community. This aligns with our own mission of bringing joy to the people, organizations, and communities we serve. We believe that by working with the neighborhood and applying a thoughtful design, we can improve the community.

Luckett & Farley has a wealth of experience working with Louisville Parks and Recreation on a variety of projects and appreciate the opportunity to work with you on this pavilion. A scope of work and related fees are included below.

#### **SCOPE OF SERVICE**

Our goal for this initial scope of work is to assist Metro Parks in understanding the size, construction type, and budget for this pavilion. We will do this in three parts: Listen, Design, Review.

First, we plan to listen to your team at Metro Parks to understand what the neighborhood is looking for in the pavilion and how they plan to interact with it. Next, we will work with you to show the community what is possible with the pavilion, how big it can be, etc. Finish materials and durability will all be part of what we plan to determine in this initial phase. Next, we'll design. We will use what we hear with regard to the uses and needs of the pavilion and work to create a pavilion design that meets these requirements. We will work to be efficient with materials and align with the design of the buildings on site currently. We will generate an early opinion of cost for the pavilion to accompany this design. Finally, we will review this work with you to make sure you understand how the plan responds to the requirements and what we believe the costs for this work would be.

#### WORK SCOPE NOT INCLUDED IN THIS PROPOSAL:

The following items are excluded from the scope of services, but can be added by client's request for an additional fee:

- Design development, contract documents, bidding and negotiating, construction administrative services, and construction related services
- Submittals to local building authorities and state agencies for their review, permitting, or filing fees

- Environmental studies or traffic impact studies
- Topographic and site surveys or geotechnical investigations

#### **DELIVERABLES**

We expect to have a descriptive plan (site, floor, and roof), a building section, and a 3D view or sketch of the proposed pavilion to describe the planned work. Additionally, we will have a high-level Opinion of Cost for the work to describe likely costs for the pavilion. This information should give Metro Parks and Recreation the information necessary to determine next steps for the project.

All deliverables will be provided as electronic PDFs.

### PROJECT SCHEDULE

Luckett & Farley is staffed to begin work within one week of receipt of a signed proposal. We recommend performing all meetings virtually or with appropriate social distancing measures in place.

#### **COST OF SERVICES**

Luckett & Farley proposes to provide the above outlined services for a fee of \$5,000.00 (five thousand dollars). Additional services outside of the above-outlined scope can be provided on a lump-sum or hourly basis in accordance with the attached 2020 Rate Schedule. If it appears that an increase in the scope of work will be required, we will review this with you before proceeding further. The fee is subject to revision if our agreement is not executed within 60 (sixty) days of issuance.

As you know, Brent is interested in this project somewhere over on the east side of the park and we are committed to spending up to \$50,000.00 on it, knowing that completing it will take non-Metro money.
