- Accepted applicants of \$5,000 or less will receive on check, over \$5,000 the money will be dispersed into 3 payments

- \$50,000 is the limit cap on the grant for businesses to receive
- No waivers to go over \$50,000 cap
- Plan to spend all \$21million dollars
- The Grant has to be spent by December 31, 2020

- Evictions will be sent to a pre-trail court for 7 days
- Landlords will waive all fees and court cost
- Office of Resilience and Community Service has as today assisted 282 households and \$530,000
- Evaluating the uptake of the funds
- Expect to see alot more applications once the eviction court opens
- Meeting weekly to see if money will be left on the table in November and December
- Resilience and Community Service, average allowed coverage is \$2,000 per household is 2 to 3 months rent
- Landlord base program is averaging about \$1,224, per household
- If a landlord has outstanding code violations, the violation must be corrected before payment is issued
- Additional applications have been approved since the July report
- United Auto Workers Labor Commissioner, will be coming back to Louisville to help households
