The following was discussed:

- COVID 19 has made it a real challenging year with crews down 50%
- 5 cutting crews on daily base
- The 3 inmates crews grounded because of COVID 19
- Down 5 out of 10 mowing crews
- Codes and Regulations also does graffiti repair and boarding houses
- CARES Act funds approved in July to bid crews for replace inmate crews
- Annual vacant property and regular referrals through property maintenance
- Awarded 3 bid packages to 2 different contractors
- Bid in bundles of 75 to 80 lots each
- Awarded a 4th bid to contactor of 82 lots
- Wet conditions and tall grass are reasons for being behind on mowing
- Public Works helping with mowing
- Impacted by COVID 19 with attendance in employees
- Lots on cycles in work order
- Cost per lot for private contractors is \$120 per lot
- MSD mows and maintains flood control areas
- Parks Department mows all public parks
- Road and Operation mows public right-of-way non-interstate portion through contractors
- Metro Council requested a map of lots of where private contractors mow
- Question of what is the time line to complete lots
- Check into contracting the youth to cut the grass next year
- Question why certain areas are ignored and not mowed on a cycle
