A motion was made by Committee Member Fox, seconded by Committee Member Triplett, that this Capital Infrastructure Fund be approved.

Denise Bentley, Legislative Assistant for District 5, stated that there was confusion initially when asking for sponsorship. The funding in this request is for the basketball court only and does not include the cost of the mural. The entire concept for this project came from Russ Smith, a University of Louisville basketball player, who is now a professional athlete, and also from Nick Wilson, an attorney in Louisville. The mural will be done by artist Jaylin Stewart with keeping the co-existence expression in mind as the theme. Several businesses have stepped up with sponsorship for a state-of-the-art security system, national sports companies have also donated knowing of the campaign of Russ Smiths' "Picking Up A Ball Instead of Picking Up A Gun". A corporation for the little league teams donated funds for the scoreboard. A major sporting company has donated the backboards and brake away rims. District 5 is currently looking for a major sponsor to fund lighting for the park. This is a great project for the area, in hopes of it becoming known nationally. People driving on Interstate 64 will be able to see the park from a distance. There are several Council Members still seeking sponsorship in their districts.

A motion was made by Committee Member Triplett, seconded by Committee Member Peden, that this Capital Infrastructure Fund be amended to add \$500 from District 15, bringing the total to \$19,250. The motion carried by a voice vote.

Committee Member Kramer is still waiting for sponsorship confirmation. Sonya Harward, Metro Council Clerk asked if they wanted to consider either tabling this item or sending it to Council for consideration on Old Business in case Council Member Kramer decided to be a sponsor.
