2020 Bond Issuance Update—Daniel Frockt, OMB

Daniel Frockt, Office of management and Budget, gave a presentation on the update of 2020 bond issuance.

Daniel Frockt spoke on the following:

- Sold the bond on October 12, 2020
- Establish a line of credit for Capital needs
- In FY19 and FY20 the Council had a combined \$135 million in capital profits
- Last October \$45 million was issued
- As of this year a total of \$90 million of the \$135 million has been spent
- Reimbursement from the sale of the bond on 10/12/20 will close on Nov 4, 2020 with J.P. Morgan
- Went thru all 3 credit agencies

- Fitch gave the highest credit rating, Moody's AA1 level which is the second highest level, and S&P gave the lowest rating with concern on the pension level Metro has with the economy recovery with a stable outlook

Angela Dunn, Louisville Revenue Commission, spoke on the following:

- Request authority to issue refunds for tax
- Short term rentals and hotels have overpaid the tax
- Some bookings have been refunded to guest because of COVID-19
- Louisville Revenue Commission would act as Administrators
- Tax payers would have to provide documentation to receive refunds
- Would not go back more than two years
- Fixing an unintentional admission that was not contemplated at the time the law was passed
- Taxes should not have been collected once the booking was cancelled
- There is a refund process
