AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 073, SERIES 2020 RELATING TO THE FISCAL YEAR 2020-2021 OPERATING BUDGET FOR THE LOUISVILLE/JEFFERSON COUNTY METRO GOVERNMENT BY APPROPRIATING [\$3,533,700] \$2,183,700 OF GENERAL FUND COMMITTED FUND BALANCE FROM FISCAL YEAR 2019-2020 TO VARIOUS DEPARTMENTS (AS AMENDED).

A motion was made by Committee Member Winkler, seconded by Committee Member Dorsey, that this Ordinance be recommended for approval.

Daniel Frockt, Office of Management and Budget, addressed some questions that were previously asked regarding the funding in this Ordinance that will create \$6M in reoccurring costs for the next Budget. He provided an update on the Budget status for Fiscal Year 2021 and Fiscal Year 2022. For Fiscal Year 2021, he stated that November and December had a positive impact so the forecast had improved. For the Fiscal Year 2022, he stated that they were not expecting to have to reduce the existing compliment of personnel or services to balance the budget, in part due to the amount of drop off in revenue that was budgeted having not materialized.

Daniel Frockt also addressed the CARES Act funding, including the closing out of the original funding account and the second round of CARES Act funding that will be coming pursuant to the new Federal legislation, and what it means for the programs funded by such.

- Committee Member Piagentini asked questions about the impact of the \$6M in reoccurring costs for personnel and contractual obligations, and whether the Administration would be requesting any new funding before the next Fiscal Year Budget gets passed.

- Chair Hollander asked questions about CARES Act funding remaining available after the current account is closed.

- Vice Chair Kramer asked questions about where the \$26M came from, what expenditures are eligible for CARES Act funding, and whether any money was saved due to some programs not occurring in 2020 due to the pandemic, such as some Parks programs.

- Committee Member Reed asked if the funds being expended in the Ordinance could be moved to the Rainy Day fund, and then a few months down the road determine if the projections were accurate before deciding to spend the funds.

- Committee Member Ackerson clarified Committee Member Reed's question regarding waiting before deciding to spend these funds.

- Committee Member Fowler spoke about Ordinance 154, Series 2019, passed in October 2019, regarding Section 42.41(E) of the Louisville Metro Code of Ordinances that states:

"To the extent allowable by law, fees and other revenue generated through Metro-owned Golf Courses shall remain dedicated to addressing costs of the golf courses, to include but not limited to deferred maintenance needs. The approval of Metro Council shall be required before any revenue generated by Metro-owned Golf Courses is expended for any other purpose." Committee Member Fowler also stated that she may request assistance from the Jefferson County Attorney's Office to draft an amendment to be proposed at the next Council meeting. Council Member Fox spoke about using the funds if there is a desperate need, which he had yet to hear, rather than just finding a way to spend them.
Chair Hollander stated that there is an anticipated \$12M increase in pension expenses next year, which have been considered before expending these funds.

- Committee Member Winkler spoke about the desperate needs currently faced by the city that need to be addressed, which included the high rate of homicides and homelessness.

- Committee Member Dorsey spoke about the proposed expenditures corresponding with the critical needs of the city by addressing the causes of the issues.

- Council President James spoke about the city not recovering if the critical needs are not addressed now, such as the extremely high number of shootings and the homeless population.

-Major Kelly Jones, Louisville Metro Police Department, spoke about the Louisville Metro Police Department's involvement with homelessness.

- Council Member Purvis spoke about funds being spent in a constructive manner.
