




Pit Bull of the Week:

A Message from Your Property Valuation Administrator

To All Jefferson County Property Owners:

As the 2020 Property Reassessment season nears, I feel it is extremely important to provide information and clarification of the property assessment appeals process. The PVA Office is committed to disseminating accurate information about the assessment process and offering best in class customer service.

As your Jefferson County Property Valuation Administrator (PVA), my goal is to provide the most accurate and equitable property assessments possible. Please keep in mind that every Property Valuation Administrator in the State of KY is governed by Kentucky Law and Administrative Regulations which falls under the purview of Kentucky Revenue Cabinet. KY law requires the PVA to assess all property at 100% of its fair market value, unless exempted, as of January 1st of each year.

Over the last few years, the Louisville real state market has become one of the hottest in the nation, often resulting in

increased property values and assessments. While we strive to achieve our goal of accurate and equitable assessments, property owners sometimes feel the PVA's estimate of their property's value is incorrect. In that case, there is an appeal process in place for a property owner to dispute the estimated value determined by the PVA.

ASSESSMENT PROCESS

1. Each year the PVA performs an analysis of the local real estate market. The analysis performed by our staff uses deed transfers.

After the deeds are entered into our computer system, a mass appraisal is generated neighborhood by neighborhood throughout Jefferson County. The PVA uses only valid real estate sales in our market analysis. Sales on distressed properties, foreclosures, short sales or family member transactions are not considered in our analysis.

2. Property Assessment Notices are mailed to owners in April of each year. Only property owners who have a change in their property value will receive an assessment notice. Property assessments reflect current market influences, any improvements and additions or changes to structures on the property, along with any other condition that may be affecting the property value since the last assessment. However, we don't always have complete information on a property.



Boardwalk in Beckley Creek Park Closed
Beginning March 2



Louisville, Ky. (March 2, 2020) —A section of trail known as the Boardwalk in the Humana Grand Allee area of Beckley Creek Park will be closed for a 12 weeks beginning Monday, March 2, 2020. Heavy equipment will be used by workers to replace the pathway over the Allee Wetlands. For their safety and the safety of visitors should respect all posted barricades and signs advising them of the closure of the area.

Cryptocurrency Surprise: Now Second Riskiest Scam, Says BBB Scam Tracker Risk Report

Two years ago, cryptocurrency scams were just emerging as a problem on Scam Tracker, mostly a subset of investment scams. The Better Business Bureau's Scam Tracker report, which ranked cryptocurrency as a scam category in 2019 and it leapt to the second riskiest scam category according to the latest BBB report, *New Risks and Emerging Technologies Scam Tracker Risk Report* (BBB.org/RiskReport).

Although employment scams remained the riskiest for the second year in a row, a surprise in the data was cryptocurrency in the #2 spot, with a median dollar amount of \$10,000. The report is based on data supplied by consumers to BBB Scam Tracker's Scam Tracker (BBB.org/ScamTracker) and uses the BBB Risk Index, a unique algorithm that combines exposure, susceptibility, and monetary loss to offer a more accurate assessment of risk.

"Scammers take advantage of newer technologies and changes in the marketplace," said Melissa Lanning Trumpower, executive director of the BBB Institute for Market Research, which produced the report. "Cryptocurrency scams rose to the number two spot in 2019 as scammers took advantage of consumers looking to capitalize on their investments in digital assets. Unfortunately, hype and heightened emotion can sometimes prevent consumers from doing their due diligence to investigate offers and exchanges before making a purchase."

Cryptocurrency scams occur when the virtual coins are purchased from, transferred, or stored with a person or exchange site that turns out to be fraudulent. Some digital assets are purchased as part of a fraudulent Initial Coin Offering (ICO) and investors are scammed into paying money or trading digital assets for a product that never materializes.

According to the Risk Report, 68.5% of people that reported a cryptocurrency loss lost money, and nearly one-third of these losses (31.0%) involved the cryptocurrency exchange site C2CX. Additionally, 23.4% of individuals said they purchased cryptocurrency as an investment opportunity.

Unlike money stored in a traditional bank account, which is insured against loss, digital assets such as cryptocurrency cannot be retrieved, and transactions cannot be reversed in the case of theft or cyber hacking.

“Scammers are opportunists,” said Trumpower. “Whatever is in the news or trending about on social media, they see as an opening. Scammers will also impersonate recognizable and respected organization or brand.”

The ten riskiest scams of 2019 were: employment, cryptocurrency, online payment, checks/money orders, advance fee loan, romance, home improvement, investment, support, and travel/vacation/timeshare.
