- 39.58% OF JEFFERSON COUNTY RESIDENTS ARE RENTERS ACCORDING TO THE CENSUS ACS DATA
- HOUSING & SHELTER IS THE #1 TYPE OF ASSISTANCE SOUGHT FROM METRO UW;
- SINCE THE ONSET OF THE PANDEMIC, 69.6% OF THOSE REQUESTS ARE FOR RENT ASSISTANCE
- ▶ 10.8% OF THE REQUEST HAS BEEN FOR LOW-COST HOUSING
- ▶ 7.1% OF THE REQUEST HAS BEEN FOR SHELTERS
- JEFF CO HAS THE HIGHEST RATES OF REQUESTS FOR HOUSING & SHELTER ASSISTANCE IN KENTUCKY.

Applicants not submitting all required documents timely. Landlords not returning the Landlord and Tenant agreement timely

Landlords returning the W-9 timely.
