	Committee Member Piagentini asked for clarity regarding meetings being held
	in person or virtually once City Hall opens next week.
	Council President James stated that it is unknown as to what guidance the Governor will provide on June 11, 2021 regarding Senate Bill 150, and the Council will need to meet all requirements provided at that time. Therefore, it will be up to the Committees for now since they can socially distance in Chambers, and further decisions will be made after the Council resumes meetings following their summer break.
	Hollie Hopkins, Jefferson County Attorney's Office, asked for clarity and then provided information on steps that would need to be taken before the Council and its committees can return to full in-person meetings starting next week, which included providing advance notice to the Clerk's Office so that proper notice could be provided. She also stated that if Committees meet completely in person, the Kentucky Attorney General finds that the meetings are no longer taking place under Senate Bill 150 so the media and public would be required to be allowed into Chambers, which would require the Council to decide in advance on any capacity restrictions, masking requirements, etc.
	Council President James revised his statement regarding Committees being allowed to meet fully in person due to Hollie Hopkins' comments, and stated that those decisions would be made after the Council's summer break.
	Council Member McCraney asked for clarity because the Committee on Equity and Inclusion was planning to meet in person for their June 17, 2021 meeting, which included a Juneteenth Celebration event and an audience in Chambers. Council President James told her that he would contact her to discuss further.
