In sponsoring events such as the Easter Egg Hunt, Chili Cook-off, Ice Cream Social, Corn Roast, and Christmas party, The Wilder Park Association is demonstrating how proud we are of our community, city, and of the efforts of volunteers, police, and civic leaders. Community involvement and civic responsibility leads to safer, cleaner cleaner living conditions, which benefits the city as a whole. Keeping the Wilder Park Community Center open is vital to supporting the mission and activities of the Wilder Park Association and this grant will help maintain and operate the Center.

Wilder park Assoctution, Inc., Bhail haye and may exezcise all powers given to non-profit corporations under the proviaiona of Chapter 273 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes, subject only to the limitation that notwithstanding any other provision of these Articies of Incorporation, Wilder Park Association, Inc., shall possess and exercise only such powers as may be exercised in furtherance of its tax-exenpt purposes and as may be exercised (a) by organizations for purposes similar to those of Wilder Park Association, Inc., exempt under section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal. Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Revenue Law), or (b) by corporations, contributions to which are deductible under section 170 (c) (2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 for the corremponding provision of any future United States Revenue Law).

## Article VI. Memberghip

Wilder Park Association, Inc., shall have no capital stock, and shall be composed of memhers rather than shareholders.

Nembership ehall consiat of any and all paraons who request Fuch, of the age of eighteen years or older, who regide, work, or have an interest, pecuniary or otherwise, in the axea served by Wilder park Association, Inc.: said area being defined as within the following boundaries within the city of Louisville, County of Jefferson, State of Kentucky, to wit:

The northern boundary being Central Avenue from South Third Street to the Louisville s Nashville Railroad Yard; the eastern boundary being the western boundary of the said railroad yard from central Avenue south to the Henry Watterson Expressway; the southern boundaxy being the aaid expreasway from the said railroad yord west to Southern Parkway; and the weotern boundary being the said parkway from the said expressway noxth to South Third strect, thence, said street north to Central Avenuc; and the area shall also inelude tho perk known as Wayside Park.

Memberahip shall not be denied on the basis of race, rellgion, national origin or sex.

Although membership i.s restricted to those peraons hereinbefore described within certain geographical boundaries, the public as a whole shall benefit from and bo allowed to participate in the programs and projecta $r$. Wilder Park Assochation, Inc. Provided, that the rights and powers of Members and Directors enumerated in thane Articlea ahail be exercisable soled by the Members and Directors to the exclusion of all. other persons, said exclusive rights and powers are more particularly deacribed as those regarding elections and other decialons of Wilder Park Association, Inc., relating to its internal structure and pollcies.

## Article VIT. Election of Directors <br> of

Except for the initial Board of Directors named in Article XI hereof, the Directors shall be elected from the membership by the members at the annual meeting called for auch purpose. Voting shall either be in person or by proxy.
