The following was discussed:

- Metro Council made an allocation of \$4.2 million for the two-way street conversion

- Question about whether Public Works would need another \$2.75 million for the intersections at Chestnut Street, Muhammad Ali Blvd and River Park Drive

- Question about whether more public involvement is needed

- Question about whether Shelby Street and Logan Street funds have been made available from the State

- Conversions are being made because so many people drive the wrong way on one-way streets

- Question about whether additional funds will be needed for design concepts

- The ramps that come off the left hand side on the interstates prevent the conversion and they will not be able to be touched
 - Streets that are 24 foot wide will not be able to be converted

On one-way streets where parking is permitted on the left side, the two left wheels are to be within six inches of and parallel with the curb
When there is an on-street bikeway on the pavement adjacent to the left-hand curb of a one-way or two-way street where parking is permitted, no vehicle shall be parked or left standing upon the left-hand side of the one-way or two-way street unless its two left wheels are within six inches of and parallel with the outside line of the buffer area between the bikeway and parking zone
