The following was discussed:

- This legislation will allow the Jefferson County Sheriff to accept a grant to purchase expiring body armor that has reached its five year limit.
- The Jefferson County Sheriff last received a similar grant in 2018.
- There are 28 body armor vests that will be reaching the end of the manufacturer's warranty.
- There were several questions regarding whether body armor that had not been used or received significant impacts would need to be replaced.
- There was a discussion regarding adhering to national safety standards and manufacturer's warranties detailing how frequently body armor should be replaced.
- There was a discussion regarding the fact that even with normal use, body armor will degrade over time.
- There was a discussion regarding insurance and/or warranty complications/challenges that could potentially impact Louisville Metro if an officer is injured wearing expired body armor.

The motion carried by a voice vote and the Resolution was sent to the Consent Calendar.
