- David McAtee shot and killed - Police Department released the video from the restaurant due to the officers not having their cameras on them

- Documents that will not be released (Example - When Officers interview people these interviews would not be open to the public until after the case is closed; Evidence gather in an investigation would not be released until the case is closed)

- Information normally available - 911 Calls, body camera data and Safe Computer Aided Dispatch logs

- When autopsies are available they should be released

- The Police Department should not be able to requested the coroner to keep reports as a secret - The reports should be open to the public

- All items that this Resolution captivate are typical the kinds of items that anybody can log into their computer 48 hours after an incident occurs and requested the report -The way they have been used in the past often involves frustration for families
