- There was a discussion regarding restitution/reparations to descendants of slaves.
- There was a discussion regarding peer cities that have adopted reparations legislation and/or programs.
- There was a discussion regarding those who oppose reparations and the underlying reasons for opposition.
- There was a discussion regarding the current state of diversity in the United States
- There was a discussion regarding the process and funding source for reparations and those who would receive funds.
- There were several questions regarding how eligibility for reparations is established.
- There were several questions regarding how earlier generations of descendants of slaves would receive reparations.
- There was a discussion regarding the disparities between African Americans and Caucasians in Louisville Metro in regard to crime rates, locales, business, and mortality rates.
- There were several questions regarding whether blended and/or adoptive

families are eligible for reparations.

- There was a discussion regarding the wealth of the South versus financial repair to descendants of slaves.
- There were several questions regarding income mobility versus a caste system.
- There was a discussion regarding the greater concentration of African Americans versus Caucasians in southern states, the family structure, and the wealth gap between races.
- There was a discussion regarding race and lineage, i.e. success of immigrants versus descendants of slaves, as well as, wealth versus income.
