BE IT ORDAINED BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL OF THE LOUISVILLE/JEFFERSON COUNTY METRO GOVERNMENT ("METRO COUNCIL") AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION I: The following year-end General Fund budget transfers are hereby authorized within the Fiscal Year 2017-2018 Operating Budget:

SECTION II: The sum of \$10,910.24 is hereby transferred from the Special Revenue Fund to the General Fund related to the following amounts:

A. \$10,910.24 to Parks and Recreation

SECTION III: The sum of \$26,880.68 is hereby transferred from the General Fund to the Special Revenue Fund related to the following amounts:

- A. \$1,459.37 to Economic Development
- B. \$18,731.77 to Public Health and Wellness
- C. \$6,689.54 to Resilience and Community Services

SECTION IV: The sum of \$174,486.89 is hereby authorized from the General Fund to the Capital Cumulative Reserve Fund as it relates to interest and surplus property sales in excess of the

appropriated funding level for Fiscal Year 2017-2018:

- A. Actual earned interest of \$322,011.11 in Fiscal Year 2017-2018 relative to the budgeted interest of \$500,000, creating a deficit of \$177,988.89.
- B. Actual surplus property sales of \$3,502 in Fiscal Year 2017-2018 relative to the budgeted sales of \$0, creating a surplus of \$3,502.
- C. The net deficit after this adjustment is \$174,486.89.

Included in Section VI.1.a. above is \$546,791 to the Office of Resilience & Community Services (the "Office") to the used exclusively for services to people experiencing homelessness, including (1)

temporary storage of belongings; (2) temporary shelter for families and individuals, including lowbarrier shelter beds. The Office shall present a plan for the use of these funds to the Metro Council President on or before January 2, 2019, with the goal of implementing the additional services by that date and no later than January 14, 2019. The plan shall name partnering organizations, a description of the services to be rendered by them, and the budget for those services. The services offered shall serve as a bridge to a more permanent plan to address these needs, which shall be proposed no later than April 25, 2019, when the Mayor presents his proposed FY20 Capital and Operating Budgets.

SECTION VII: Part I. F. Chief of Community Building, of Ordinance 108, Series 2018 is hereby amended as follows:
