| WHEREAS, Louisville Metro has seven Preservation Districts which contain many old and   |
| nistoric structures (Cherokee Triangle, Old Louisville, Clifton, Limerick, Butchertown, Parkland, and   |

| excessive vibration;  |
| WHEREAS, construction activity involving certain types of equipment can compromise and  |
| damage vulnerable structures unless measures are taken to limit the amount of vibration.  |

| by excessive vibration from construction and demolition activity and report back to the Public Works  |
| committee within 90 days with their recommendations.  |
