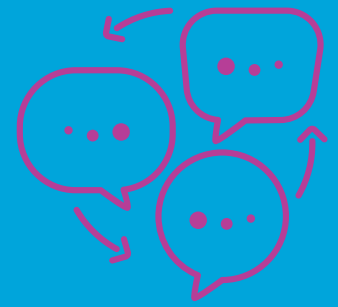

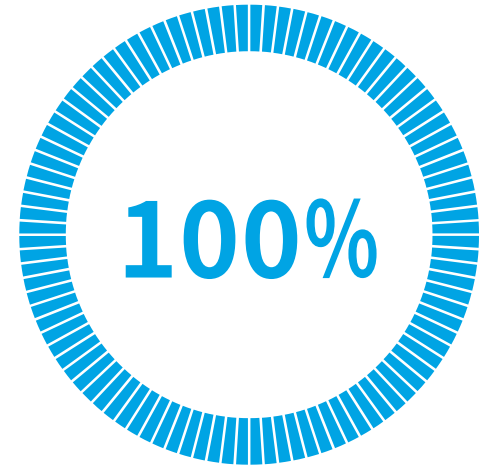

CHARITABLE NONPROFITS' IMPACT ON KENTUCKY'S ECONOMY AND COMMUNITIES

Charitable nonprofits are more than charity — they are employers, service providers, and economic engines for Kentucky communities. As the fourth-largest private-sector employer in the state, charitable nonprofits employ **178,864 Kentuckians**, generate **\$11.9 billion in annual wages**, and contribute **\$32.5 billion in expenditures** benefiting Kentucky's economy. **Nearly one in ten private-sector jobs in Kentucky is at a charitable nonprofit employer.**

Strong charitable nonprofits help Kentucky's workforce, economy, and communities thrive. When charitable nonprofits succeed, Kentucky communities succeed.

Charitable nonprofits provide **critical services in every county across Kentucky and touch the lives of every Kentuckian** — from health care and housing to arts, recreation, and faith-based organizations. Nonprofits help fill gaps that government alone cannot address, ensuring individuals and families across the Commonwealth have access to vital supports.

The majority of charitable nonprofits are small, local organizations, and regardless of their size — organizations across Kentucky are experiencing **increased demand for services** and unprecedented **funding and operational challenges**.

Revenue Sources: How Louisville Nonprofit Coalition members are funded



70% Program Revenue (\$476 million)
(including fee for service income and government grants and contracts)



26% Contributed Revenue (\$173 million)
(private donations from individuals, foundations, corporations, and bequests)



3% Other Revenue (\$21 million)
(investment and interest income, etc.)

*Some coalition member organizations operate in counties outside Louisville, and the data presented reflects their full service area, not solely their activities within Louisville.

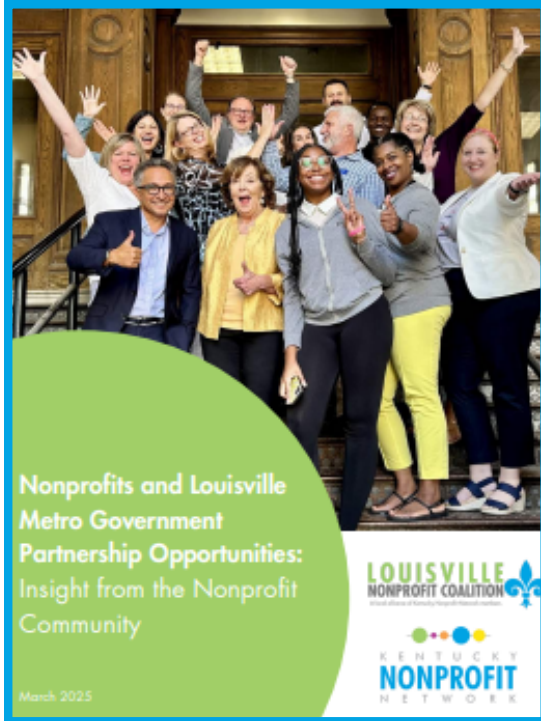
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OMB FEDERAL FUNDING FREEZE IMPACT ON KY STATE & LOCAL GOVERNMENT FUNDING

- For every \$1 Kentuckians pay in federal taxes, the state receives \$3.35 in federal funds.
- Kentucky ranks second overall among states most dependent on federal funds, which account for roughly 46% of the state's revenue.



Status: National Council of Nonprofits + lawsuit is keeping federal funds flowing. Oral arguments were in Feb; awaiting ruling on appeal of preliminary injunction.

Key Takeaways

- OMB's proposed overhaul of federal grant rules would affect nearly every form of federal funding that cities, towns and villages receive, with changes slated to take effect October 1, 2026.
- Several provisions would increase administrative burdens on municipalities, introduce new compliance requirements, and allow grants to be terminated mid-award.
- Other provisions could make it easier for municipalities to apply for grants, including plain language requirements and standardized application processes.
- NLC is urging members to submit comments to OMB before the July 13 deadline and has resources available to help.
