countless academic opportunities to establish themselves in fields outside of their respective schools. This concept stays true to this day, with the Atherton Speech and Debate team's recent trip to China to compete in the Chengdu sister cities international debate tournament. So, like, when opponents are, like, asking each other questions and how well you're able to quickly respond to that. And so getting best speaker was a really big honor. And they also did this really fun thing where when they called out Best Speaker for both the American team and the Chinese teams, they had us do like an impromptu speech. So me and the girl from China both had to come up and give a little impromptu speech about, you know, how grateful we were, like, a little Oscars type deal.\r\n\r\nAnd it was really cool because the girl that won best speaker for China was also a girl that I had become, like, kind of friends with throughout the competition, so it was really great that we got to stand on stage and do that together. But China was really an incredible country. It was so beautiful. It was so green. Everything there was really cheap, and everyone was really, really friendly. So we went to two school visits. We went to a private school and a public school.\r\n\r\nWe went to the giant, giant panda research base, which is really cool. We learned how to make mandu by hand, and they got to eat them. Thanks to this opportunity, Atherton students were able to solidify their spots on the international academic scale. For our kids, I'm Atherton Correspondent Kathryn Armstrong. Correspondent Boston Cissell introduces us to the teaching pathway at Ballard High School. In the educational workforce, it's no secret that there is a shortage of teachers. At Ballard High School.\r\n\r\nThere is a pathway that allows students to prepare to become teachers. All of the upper classmen that are in the program, take frequent visits to Wilder Elementary to teach their kindergarten buddies how to read and write. And it was started to try to expose kids to understand the education career, the field of education, and trying to get kids to enter the teaching field. And so the teaching, learning, and leadership pathway has definitely grown since then. So we try to give our students real hands on experience to be able to make a decision, whether or not teaching is going to complement their own interests and their strengths. So really a lot of it is just exposure and getting students acquainted with what it takes to be effective in education these days. Allison Cissell is the head ap of this pathway.\r\n\r\nAnd she explains how and when the pathway started to blossom into the pathway it is today. One of the things, I think, one of the themes that ties throughout all four years of the pathway is that there is an intense focus on leadership, which translates well beyond careers or internships in education. So they learn a lot about leadership. They learn a lot about organizational skills. They learn a lot about just human relations and how to relate to people, and those translate to lots of internships. We also have the opportunity through jcps, for anyone who completes the pathway, upon graduation, can sign a contract with jcps That guarantees that if they complete a college degree in education, they will be, they are guaranteed a teaching position within jcps upon completion of their college degree. These are those organizations that create that incredible fabric that you feel in Louisville, Kentucky. Hello, I'm COUNCILMAN Jonathan Joseph, chair of Appropriations Committee. This is a regular meeting of the Appropriations Committee on JUNE 17th, 2026. It is currently 3:02 P.M. This meeting is being held pursuant to crs 61.826 and Council Rule 5.8. With me is my Vice Chair, Marilyn Parker. Joining us in chambers are committee members, COUNCILMAN Herndon, COUNCILMAN Leininger, COUNCILMAN Sam, and virtually by COUNCILMAN Winkler and COUNCILWOMAN Shanklin. We do have enough members present, which constitutes a quorum. The first item of business is a cif appropriating \$189,621.21 from district one capital infrastructure funds to Public works to provide additional funding for completion of the Lees Lane Sidewalk project.

This comes from Council Woman Parrish, right. No. Hawkins. Yeah, that didn't sound right. From COUNCILWOMAN Hawkins. Hold on one second. Do we have anyone here for that?

Can we skip that item for a second? Let me find her. Yeah. Yes. If you skip item two. Yeah. Okay.

Please. Thank you. You mean you don't want to be responsible for 189,000? No. Okay. Item number two is a council originated MnrF appropriating \$1,200 from district three neighborhood development funds through the Office of Management and Budget to Shively Area Ministries, Inc. For a silver level sponsorship of their Night Out for Your Neighbors fundraiser to be held OCTOBER 16th, 2026. This item comes to us from COUNCILWOMAN Paris. Right?

Do we have a motion properly moved? This item does not require a speaker. Are there any questions or concerns? Seeing none, this item allows for a voice vote. All in favor, say aye. Aye. All opposed?

Ayes have it. Legislation passes. Thank you. Item number three is an ordinance appropriating \$19,000 from district five neighborhood development funds to metro parks for costs associated with the Dirt Bowl Derby Showcase held APRIL 29th, 2026 and the 2026 tournament to be held JUNE 6th through AUGUST 2nd, 2026. This comes from COUNCILWOMAN Pervis. Do we have a motion in a second? Properly moved? Do we have a speaker?

Yes. Yes we do. Good afternoon, chair jj and Vice Chair Parker. I'm Carmen Weathers Washington, and I am the legislative assistant for COUNCILWOMAN Donna Purvis, district five. This appropriation is to fund the district five parks account for the 57th annual Dirt Ball Tournament held in Shawnee Park, as well as the Dirt Ball Derby Showcase, which was a run up event to generate excitement about the Dirt ball tournament. The Dirt Bowl is underway and will continue each weekend until AUGUST 2nd, except for 4th of JULY weekend. These funds are designated to pay for referees, food, t shirts, dj, dj and live streamers for the eight week event.

Please, please put it on your calendar and plan on attending because

there's probably a team from your district represented at the Dirt Ball. Thank you so much. Thank you. Are there any questions? Seeing none. This item requires a roll call. Vote clerk will you open the rolls, please?\r\n\r\nVoting is open.

COUNCILWOMAN Shanklin. Yes. COUNCILMAN Winkler. Yes. Chair. Joseph.\r\n\r\nYes. Seven. Yes. Votes. Thank you very much. Legislation passes and will be sent to old business. No consent.\r\n\r\nConsent. Yes. Sorry. All right. Thank you. One the record to be shown that we have been joined in chambers by COUNCILWOMAN Hawkins. We'll go back to item number one.\r\n\r\nOkay. Again, this first item of business is a second item of business. Number one on the item list. It's a cif \$189,621.21 from district one capital infrastructure funds to Public works to provide additional funding for completion of the Lees Lane Sidewalk project. This comes from COUNCILWOMAN Hawkins. Do we have a motion? Second properly moved?\r\n\r\nCOUNCILWOMAN, would you like to speak to this? I don't even want to talk about it. I gotta spend all this money. Yes. Have been saving money for the project. Those kids at Farmers League, you know, barely got a sidewalk. And of course, you know, we all know that once the development came with over 900 apartments, that made it even worse.\r\n\r\nSo there's no sidewalks out there. So I'm going to have two phases. And this is the first phase to getting some sidewalks and some infrastructure done out there. So this is something that was asked from, you know, my partially South Enders. So we're going to make it happen. Hopefully I can get everybody's support. Thank you, thank you.\r\n\r\nAre there any questions or concerns? Seeing none. This item allows for a voice vote. All in favor say aye aye aye. All opposed. The eyes have it. Legislation passes.\r\n\r\nThank you. All right. We're going to item number four. And that is an ndf appropriating \$600 from district five neighborhood development funds to metro parks to cover the cost of 40 picnic tables used at Portland Festival held on JUNE 5th and JUNE 6th, 2026. This item also comes from COUNCILWOMAN Purvis. Do we have a motion motion properly moved? This item does not require a speaker. Are there any questions or concerns?\r\n\r\nSeeing none. This item allows for a voice vote. All in favor, say aye. All opposed? The eyes have it. Legislation passes. Item number five is an ordinance appropriating \$175,000 from district seven neighborhood Development funds for the Office of Management and Budget to the City of Saint Matthews for costs associated with installation of a pavilion at Warwick Park and associated improvements.\r\n\r\nThis comes to us from COUNCILWOMAN McCraney. Do we have a motion? In a second. Thank you. Probably. Move. Do we have a speaker?\r\n\r\nGood afternoon. I'm coming today on behalf of COUNCILWOMAN Doctor Paul McCraney, to discuss the highlights of the Warwick Park. My name is Anthony Walker. I'm her legislative assistant for district seven. During the fiscal year, she was notified by the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet that the project for the West Port Road widening would not need to be funded at this time. As a result, the analysis was done and the most pressing public need in district seven was discovered that Warwick Park was in desperate need of renovations for their restrooms, a pavilion and etcetera to redistribute the funding from Westport Road Project. She entered a memorandum of agreement with the City of Saint Matthews for Warwick Park renovation project.\r\n\r\nThe appropriation of \$175,000 is a minimum portion of renovations needed for the park, for the park, in order for them to be able to move forward with the estimated cost of the pavilion being about \$180,000. COUNCILWOMAN McCraney is asking for the committee's full support of this much needed infrastructure park project that will serve the public well for many years to come. And also, just wanted to note that the total cost of the entire project is an estimate of \$5.1 million. Based off of that, any comments, questions, concerns or

criticisms? Yeah. Any comments or questions? Okay. Seeing none.\r\n\r\nThis item requires a roll call vote. COUNCILWOMAN Shanklin yes. COUNCILMAN Winkler. Yes. Chair. Joseph. Seven yes.\r\n\r\nVotes. Legislation passes, and we'll be sent to the consent calendar. Thank you. Item number six is an ordinance appropriating \$3,000 from neighborhood development funds in the following manner \$3,000 from district nine through the Office of Management and Budget to Saint Matthews Fire and Rescue Benevolence Fund Corporation for costs associated with its first annual Freedom Fest to be held on JULY 3rd, 2026. This item comes from COUNCILMAN Owen. COUNCILMAN Owen, do we have a motion? Motion and a second? Second properly moved?\r\n\r\nDo we have a speaker? No, sorry. Thank you. Hi, chair. Thank you. Virginia Guard, the administrative assistant for COUNCILMAN Owen, district nine. The inaugural Saint Matthews Freedom Fest will be held on Friday, JULY 3rd from 4 to 9 P.M. On Westport Road from Chenoweth Lane to Saint Matthews Avenue, with net proceeds benefiting Saint Matthews Fire and Benevolence Fund.\r\n\r\nThis event is 100% free to the public, and family. Focused funding will be spent on event production, insurance permits, generators, lighting, security barricades, golf carts, medical staff, portable toilets, table rental, trash cans, signage, advertising, volunteer t-shirts, public works and event transportation. Are there any questions or concerns? Seeing none. This item requires a roll call vote. COUNCILWOMAN Shanklin yes. COUNCILMAN\r\n\r\nWinkler. Yes. COUNCILMAN Joseph, you have seven years legislation passes and will be sent to all business. Okay. Item seven is an ordinance appropriating \$1,000 from neighborhood development funds in the following manner thousand dollars from district nine. Through the Office of Management and Budget to Saint Joseph Catholic Orphan Society for costs associated with Saint Joseph's 177th Annual Picnic for the kids. This item comes from COUNCILMAN Owen.\r\n\r\nWe have a motion motion in a second. Second. Thank you. Properly moved. Would you like to speak to this? Absolutely. Saint Joseph Children's Home seeks funding for community support and safety for our 177th Annual Picnic fundraising event on Friday and Saturday of AUGUST 7th and eighth, 2026. Activities, security, sanitation, parking, insurance, golf cart rentals, stage production and fencing.\r\n\r\nAnd I have no amendments on this one. So yes. Are there any questions? I do want more money. Well, I do want one more money. If anybody wants to assist with the remaining 7500. Do that Council. Well, is there any questions or concerns or does anybody want to amend to give today?\r\n\r\nWe want to send a business. If we give it all up. Okay, okay. We'll do that then. Okay. Okay. Are there any questions or concerns?\r\n\r\nSeeing none. This item requires a roll call vote. COUNCILMAN. COUNCILWOMAN Shanklin. Yes. COUNCILMAN. Winkler.\r\n\r\nYes. COUNCILMAN Joseph. Yes. Seven. Yes. Votes. Legislation passes will be sent to all business.\r\n\r\nOkay. Item number eight is an ordinance appropriating \$1,000 from neighborhood development funds in the following manner \$1,000 from district nine through the Office of Management and Budget to stage one, the local children's theater for costs associated with its 2026 2027 Play It Forward program. This item comes from COUNCILMAN Owen. A motion, motion and a second. Thank you. Properly moved, please back again. Regina, our administrative assistant.\r\n\r\nDistrict nine COUNCILMAN Andrew Owen, stage one, respectfully requests \$11,500 to provide 500 free tickets to jk title one schools for one of our weekday matinee performances in the 2026 2027 school year. The series includes goosebumps, the musical Phantom of the auditorium, grades three through five, the best Christmas Pageant Ever, All ages. And If You Give a Mouse a Cookie grades kindergarten through second stage one will prioritize schools that have not attended a student matinee in the past five years,

and you probably have received emails already from stage one as well. So are there any questions or concerns, COUNCILMAN? Thank you, MR. Chair. I will be abstaining on this vote of an abundance of caution due to my daughter's very cute amount of money that she has been paid from stage one to be a performer in last year's production of the Best Christmas Pageant ever, and her desire to be cast once again.\r\n\r\nThank you very much, COUNCILMAN Winkler. Yeah, I just want to put on the record that I am an unpaid board member for stage one. Thank you. Anyone else have any questions or concerns? Okay. Seeing none. This item requires a roll call vote.\r\n\r\nCOUNCILMAN Shanklin. Yes. COUNCILMAN. Winkler. Yes. Chair. Joseph, you have six yes votes and one abstention.\r\n\r\nLegislation passes and we'll be sent to old business. Thank you, thank you, thank you. Item number nine is an ending. Appropriating \$3,000 from district ten neighborhood development funds through the Office of Management and Budget to George Rogers Clark Park Neighborhood Association, Inc. For costs associated with their annual events. Mulberry Hill Fall Festival on OCTOBER 11th, 2026. Easter Bunny Bash on MARCH 20th, 2027 and band in the Park on JUNE 11th, 2027. This item comes from COUNCILWOMAN Raymond. Do we have a motion properly moved?\r\n\r\nThis item does not require a speaker. Are there any questions or concerns? Seeing none. This item allows for a voice vote. All in favor, say aye. All opposed? The ayes have it.\r\n\r\nLegislation passes. Item number ten is an ordinance appropriating \$8,000 from neighborhood development funds in the following manner \$4,000 from District No. \$8,000 from Neighborhood Development Fund in the following manner. 4000 from district 25. \$1,500 from district 14 and 12. 50 each from district 12 and 13 through the Office of Management and Budget for the Southwest Community Ministries, Inc. For sponsorship of the Teacher Supply Giveaway to be held JULY 25th, 2026. This item comes from COUNCILWOMAN Bass. Do we have a motion motion properly moved, Brad? Go ahead.\r\n\r\nBradford and Legislative Assistant COUNCILWOMAN Crystal bass, district 14. This funding supports a program we partnered in the past with Southwest Community Ministries. Funds are used to assist teachers with purchasing classroom supplies that they would otherwise have to pay out of pocket. Application process was made available for eligible teachers to either teach in the district or within 12, 13, 14, 25. And basically it ensures that the resources are directed towards directly supporting seeing none. This item requires a roll call vote. COUNCILMAN Shanklin yes. COUNCILMAN Winkler. Go ahead.\r\n\r\nBrad Bearden again, legislative Assistant COUNCILWOMAN Bass. This funding is requested to cover movie licensing fees. Total ten movies will be hosted across districts 12, 14 and 25. First event scheduled is JUNE 26th at Sun Valley Park. Featuring. Not my pick, but The Goonies. Maybe they want to come out. In addition to licensing costs, a portion of the district 14 allocation will be used to cover portable restroom expenses.\r\n\r\nThis includes providing porta potties for each movie night event, as well as four additional units that were required for the Southwest Music series. These these events are free and open to the public, designed to provide a safe, family friendly. What entertainment opportunities and encourage community engagement across multiple districts. Legislation passes item number 14, an ordinance appropriating \$1,000 from neighborhood development funds in the following manner \$1,000 from district 15 through the Office of Management and Budget to Louisville Independent Business Alliance for costs associated with the South.\r\n\r\nPoints by Local Fair to be held JULY 12th, 2026. This comes from COUNCILWOMAN Chappell. Do we have a motion? And second, properly moved, please? Yes. Amy Luckett, Louisville Metro Council District 15 legislative assistant, Louisville Independent Business Alliance will host the South Points by local fair at or near Iroquois Amphitheater. The fair offers shopping with local independent south local businesses, foods, a kids area, silent auction and more. Admission and parking are free.\r\n\r\nWe're still looking for more people to add on for this India, so we would love your support and love your vote to approve. Okay. This comes from COUNCILWOMAN Chappell. Do we have a motion motion properly moved? This item does not require a speaker. Are there any questions or concerns? Seeing none.\r\n\r\nThis item allows for a voice vote. All in favor, say aye. All opposed? The ayes have it. Legislation passes item number 17 as a council originated pnf appropriating \$1,000 from neighborhood Development funds in the following manner \$700. \$750 from district 15 and \$250 from district 24 through the Office of Management and Budget to Gathering Strength, Inc. For a silver level sponsorship at their Adaptive Recreation Showcase to be held on JULY 25th, 2026. This comes from COUNCILMAN Chappell. Do we have a motion?\r\n\r\nSecond, properly moved?
