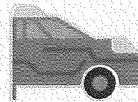

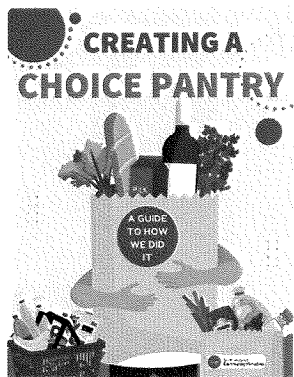

For the past five years, South Louisville Community Ministries has served as the nonprofit implementation partner for federal Emergency Rental Assistance Program (ERAP) funds in collaboration with Louisville Metro Government's Office of Housing and Community Development. Together, this partnership ensured that eviction prevention resources reached households facing the greatest risk of housing loss.

As the program concluded in 2025, SLCM focused on ensuring that every remaining dollar available for eviction prevention was deployed to support neighbors in crisis. Over the life of the program, more than \$125 million in rental assistance was distributed across Louisville.

2025 Impact

- \$585,386 distributed in eviction prevention assistance
- 132 households stabilized as the program concluded

Through this partnership, thousands of households avoided eviction and maintained housing stability during one of the most volatile housing periods in recent history.
